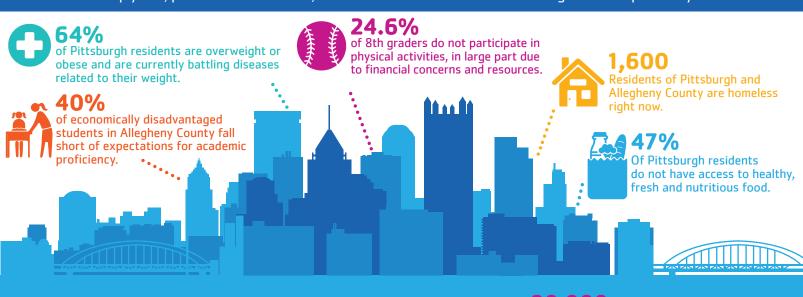

#### **MEMBERSHIP FOR ALL – YMCA FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE**

Everyone is welcome at the Y. We provide membership and program services to everyone desiring to participate regardless of race, religion, gender, marital status, national origin, disability or income. The YMCA of Greater Pittsburgh provides financial assistance for children, teens, adults and families who cannot afford the full cost of a Y membership.

We use a sliding fee scale based on total household income, which requires supporting documentation to. Recipients are expected to be responsible for a percentage of the membership cost. Qualification for YMCA financial assistance for membership is reviewed every year.

If you need financial assistance, please ask for an application and talk with a Member Services representative.

#### **VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES**

The Y has a rich tradition in volunteerism. Volunteers help make us who we are; they are the strength and stability of the YMCA. 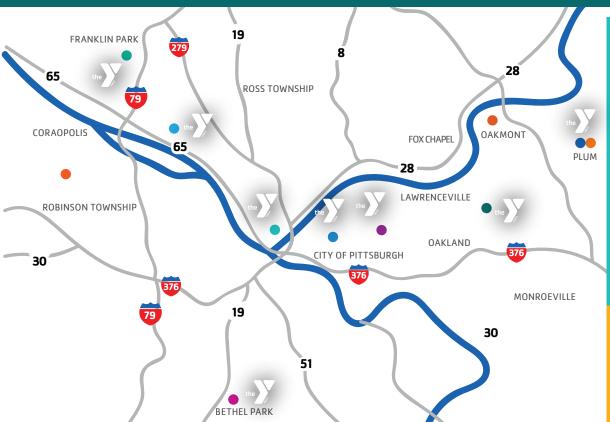

They also teach values and wellness, while reducing stress on busy families.

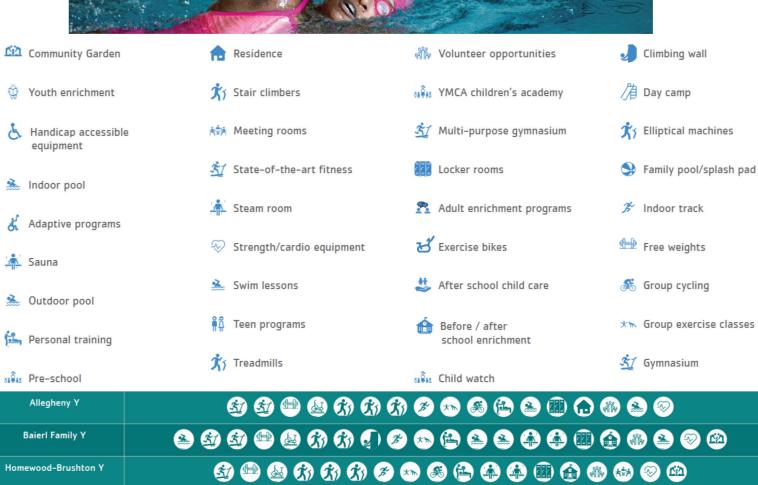
## YOUR ACCESS TO ALL

As a member of the YMCA of Greater Pittsburgh, you now have access to all 13 of our Family Centers in the Greater Pittsburgh area. Along with these facilities, the Y also provides fitness programs for communities not near a YMCA so they can learn healthy living principles in their own community. These events will be updated on our website at ymcapgh.org and are open to all.

Saunas and steam rooms are available at select branches, and are available for use by any YMCA member 18 years or older. Please see health restrictions before entering a sauna or steam room.

If your Y does not have an aquatic center, swimming lessons for children and adults, as well as aquatic exercise programs are available at the locations that do. Please contact your Y's Welcome Center for more details.

Following with our values of caring, honesty, respect and responsibility as a guide, the Y's Code of Conduct ensures that all who enter our facility enjoy a safe, welcoming and comfortable environment. We ask individuals to act in a manner that upholds these values at all times when they are in our facility or participating in Y programs. The safety and protection of Y members and guests is a paramount concern of the YMCA of Greater Pittsburgh; therefore, we reserve the right to deny access or membership to any person registered for sex offenses against children.

#### The Y is a family-oriented organization; please refrain from:

- Using offensive language, wearing revealing clothing and exposing inappropriate tattoos. Please wear your swimsuit only in the pool area and locker rooms. Shoes, shorts or pants and shirts are required in other areas of the facility. "Heelys" or shoes with wheels are not allowed.
- Making physical contact with another person in any angry or threatening way.
- Engaging in sexual activity or inappropriate contact with another person.
- Harassing or intimidating by words, gestures, body language or any other menacing behavior.
- Stealing or other behavior that results in the loss or destruction of property.
- Carrying or concealing any weapon, device or object which may be used as a weapon.
- Abusing or defacing the YMCA building or its equipment.
- Using or possessing illegal drugs or alcohol on YMCA property or in YMCA vehicles.
- Smoking, All YMCA facilities and grounds are smoke-free environments this includes electronic cigarettes.
- Displaying threatening, inappropriate or offensive conduct.
- Posting unapproved materials. Ask the Member Services Director for permission to post flyers in the YMCA facility or on the surrounding property.
- The use of cameras and cell phones is not allowed in the locker room or bathroom areas.
- Conducting or participating in paid personal training or other instructional sessions with an instructor not employed by the Y.

Members and guests are encouraged to be responsible for their personal comfort and safety. If any person exhibits behavior which threatens another person's comfort or safety, the behavior should be reported to staff. Please do not hesitate to notify staff if assistance is needed. In order to be able to carry out these policies, we ask that members and guests identify themselves to staff when asked. The Y investigates all reported incidents. Suspension or termination of YMCA membership privileges may result if a violation of this Code of Conduct has occurred.

#### **MEMBER SCREENING POLICY**

The YMCA conducts regular sex offender screenings on all members, participants, and guests. If a sex offender match occurs, the YMCA reserves the right to cancel membership, end program participation, and remove visitation access.

## **POLICIES FOR YOUR YMCA**

#### MEMBERSHIP DUES AGREEMENT

Members understand that all changes affecting their monthly draft, (i.e. billing information, holds, downgrades, termination) require a 15 day written notice before their next draft date. Any error must be identified no later than 60 days from the posted bank statement date. The YMCA is not responsible for errors occurring later than 90 days from the date of the initial error. The YMCA draft is a continuous membership plan. Memberships will remain in effect until properly terminated with the YMCA. The YMCA may, at their discretion, adjust the monthly membership rate applicable to the category of membership. Members will receive at least a 30 day notice of the change before a debit occurs at the new rate. The primary membership holder is fully responsible for their membership and for all persons associated with their membership including their knowledge of the aforementioned policies and liability waiver. Member is reponsible for providing accurate contact information including updated address, phone number, email address and billing information including expiration date and account information.

#### **CHILD PROTECTION**

YMCA of Greater Pittsburgh reviews members and guests against the National Registry of Sex Offenders. All new members and guests over the age of 18 must present a valid photo ID to use a YMCA of Greater Pittsburgh facility or participate in a program. Failure to present a valid ID upon request may result in denied access until a valid photo ID is produced.

#### MEMBERSHIP CARDS

Upon joining, members are required to have their photo taken for identification purposes and will receive a membership scan card. You must present it each time you enter the building for access to the facility. Lost membership cards should be reported to the Welcome Center. Replacement cost for a lost membership card is \$5. Membership cards are to be used by the assigned member only; your membership privileges are at risk if you allow others to use your card. You may be asked to present photo ID at any time to verify your membership. A photo must be connected to a membership card to be valid.

#### MEMBERSHIP PAYMENT OPTIONS

**BANK DRAFT** – Monthly dues are automatically withdrawn from your checking or savings account each month. Outstanding balances must be reconciled upon rejoining. Fifteen (15) days written notice, prior to your next membership draft, is required for bank draft changes.

**CREDIT CARD DRAFT** - Monthly dues are automatically withdrawn from your credit or debit card each month. Outstanding balances must be reconciled upon rejoining. Fifteen (15) days written notice, prior to your next membership draft, is required for credit card changes.

**SEMIANNUAL & ANNUAL PAYMENTS** – Payments are equal to the total of six or twelve monthly payments. These payments are non-refundable.

#### RETURNED PAYMENTS

A \$35 returned payment fee will be applied for any item returned by a financial institution.

#### REQUEST FOR MEMBERSHIP HOLD

We offer membership holds to our members who, due to medical need, financial reasons or other unforeseen circumstances, are not able to use their membership. Memberships can be placed on temporary hold for up to 3 months in a calendar year. There is a 15-day notice needed to stop the bank draft. Membership will automatically resume after the hold ends. The one-time administrative fee to place your membership on hold is \$10. Members also have the option of designating their membership dues to the YMCA Annual Campaign while on temporary hold. The benefit to the member is a charitable tax deduction and the administrative fee will be waived.

Administrative fees are not charged to members who use this option due to continuation of draft.

#### **CANCELLATION OF MEMBERSHIP**

As a member of the Y, you do not have to sign a membership contract and you may end your membership at any time with 15 days written notice, prior to your next scheduled membership draft. All members wishing to terminate need to do so in person by completing the termination form. Terminations will not be accepted by phone. If you are terminating due to financial reasons, please ask to speak with our Member Services Director about financial assistance through the Membership For All program. Members who are being bank-drafted or credit card-drafted have 90 days past their last anticipated draft day to notify the Y of any discrepancy. The YMCA of Greater Pittsburgh is unable to issue refunds or credits for non-usage of the facility. Memberships are non-transferrable.

#### **GUEST POLICY**

Members are encouraged to bring guests. There is an annual limit of two visits per guest per year. An adult member (age 18 or older) must accompany all guests; photo ID is required, and guests must complete a waiver.

#### **MEMBERSHIP STATUS**

Membership status changes – Changes to your membership, including additions and deletions and change in membership type must be processed at the Welcome Center in writing. Bank draft changes or cancellations must be processed in writing 15 days prior to your draft date.

Family Memberships apply to households with a maximum of two adults residing at the same address and children residing at the same address who are up to the age of 24 if a full time student and up to the age of 18 if not a student. Photo ID may be required.



#### **PAYMENT FOR CLASSES / PROGRAMS**

Most classes offered at the YMCA are included with your membership; however, some classes have additional fees that require payment at the time of registration. Cash, check, money order, Visa, MasterCard, Discover or American Express are accepted at most locations.

#### **REFUND ON FEE-BASED CLASSES**

Class cancellation – If a fee-based program or class is cancelled by the YMCA, or the member cancels one week prior to the start of the program, a full refund or credit (member's choice) will be offered. Credit will be given to participants who cancel their registration prior to the second fee based class or program. No credits can be given after the program begins.

Medical cancellation – If a participant withdraws from a fee-based program due to a medical reason, a refund or credit for the unused portion of the program will be offered.

Bad weather policy – Classes cancelled due to bad weather or unforeseen circumstances will be made up if the schedule allows. These policies exclude Childcare and Day Camp programs.

#### **MY Y IS EVERY Y IN PENNSYLVANIA**

The membership reciprocity program opens doors to all Y's in Pennsylvania with your active YMCA facility membership. The reciprocity program allows you to visit other YMCAs that are most convenient to you and help you to meet your goals. You are able to utilize all areas and programs of the facility that are available to and included in a facility membership. We just require that you utilize your home branch YMCA 50% of the time. We urge you to check the specific Y's policies if you are visiting a Y outside of the YMCA of Greater Pittsburgh locations, as some restrictions do apply. In regards to program pricing if you are a member of a YMCA of Greater Pittsburgh location then facility member rates for programs will apply within all YMCA of Greater Pittsburgh locations. When you visit outside of the YMCA of Greater Pittsburgh or are a guest to us from outside of the Y of Greater Pittsburgh then program pricing and additional fees will be treated as a non-member. **Policies may vary by branch.** 

#### **ACCIDENT, INJURY OR INCIDENT**

We do our best to keep you safe, but if an accident, injury or unusual incident does occur, please report it to the Director or Supervisor on duty or the Member Services staff immediately. The Y recommends all members and participants consult a physician prior to starting an exercise program. The Y assumes no responsibility for injuries incurred while participating in YMCA activities; it is expected that all members who use YMCA facilities carry their own medical insurance.

## **NATIONWIDE MEMBERSHIP**

## **NOW EVERY Y IS YOUR Y**

At the Y, we believe that positive, lasting personal and social change can come about only when we all work together to invest in our kids, our health, and our neighbors. This strengthening of community and the realization of a Y's full potential—has the most impact when all Ys are open to all Y members and provide safe and welcoming environments for everyone.

With Nationwide Membership, members can visit any participating Y in the United States and Puerto Rico through membership at their home Y, at no additional cost. Nationwide Membership is an essential part of our cause to strengthen communities.

It enables members to:

- Reach their health and wellness goals wherever they live, work, or travel.
- Connect with the larger Y community in meaningful ways.

The goal of Nationwide Membership is to ensure that all nationwide members have access to and can use all the areas and programs of any Y they visit.

By participating in the YMCA Nationwide Membership Program, the member agrees to release the National Council of Young Men's Christian Associations of the United States of America, and its independent and autonomous member associations in the United States and Puerto Rico, from claims of negligence for bodily injury or death in connection with the use of YMCA facilities, and from any liability for other claims, including loss of property, to the fullest extent of the law.



#### **WEAPONS POLICY**

At no time will YMCA staff or volunteers take control of or carry a weapon. If a member or guest enters an off-site program area and discloses they have a concealed weapon, they will need to return to their vehicle or residence and secure their weapon. It will not be allowed on site.

- Carrying or concealing any weapon or device/object that can be used as a weapon is strictly prohibited on YMCA properties.
- If a member or guest enters a YMCA off site program, all weapons must be secured in their vehicle.
- Excludes law-enforcement Personnel.

#### **CHILD SAFETY**

Members age 12 and above may be in YMCA facilities without a parent. Please see the Welcome Center for branch-specific rules and regulations for children in your local facility.

#### **CAMERA USE**

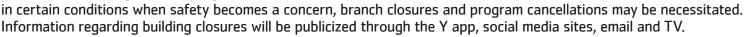
Use of cameras and cell phones is not allowed in the locker room or bathroom areas. Photos and videos must not be taken without permission.

- Be considerate of your neighbor. Please refrain from using profanity, making loud noises, or other inappropriate horseplay.
- · Always use headphones when listening to music.

**Personal Belongings** – Bags, jackets and other items must be kept in a locker or cubby at all times. The Y is not responsible for lost or stolen items. Beverages must be contained in closed, plastic or metal bottles.

#### Please be considerate:

- Shirts, shorts, pants and closed-toe athletic shoes are appropriate attire for activity areas. Midriffs must be covered. No blue jeans allowed on the wellness floor.
- Members ages 12-14 must complete a Wellness Center orientation.
- Members must be 12 years of age or older to be in the wellness area.
- Remember to return plates and dumbbells to their racks after use.
- While using weight equipment, please remember to release the weight gently. It gives you a better workout and avoids damage to the equipment. No banging or dropping weights.
- Be courteous and disinfect equipment after use. Do not spray disinfectant directly onto the cardiovascular equipment or electronic devices.
- Respect others by limiting your use of cell phones in the Wellness Center. If you must take or make a call, please monitor your voice. Photos should never be taken of anyone without their expressed permission.
- For all YMCA members, the values of caring, honesty, respect and responsibility are to be modeled at all times.

#### SAUNA and STEAM ROOM

Saunas and steam rooms are available at select branches, and are available for use by any YMCA member age 18 or older. Bathing suits or shorts are required to be worn in these areas. Sauna suits or rubber suits are not allowed. Please see the posted regulations for the use of these at each location. No shaving in steam room or sauna.

#### **MULTIPURPOSE GYMNASIUM**

A variety of activities are held in gymnasiums at select branches; see the Welcome Center or ymcapgh.org for a schedule of activities. Shoes must be worn at all times.

- Inappropriate use of equipment (basketballs, nets, soccer balls, etc) is prohibited.
- No food or non-water drinks are allowed in the gymnasium.
- Dunking or hanging from rims and nets is not allowed.

- Participants must wear appropriate non-marking shoes. No black-soled or hard-soled shoes or flip flops may be worn on gym floors. No food or drink other than water allowed.
- Players will act in an appropriate manner; profanity, spitting, unsportsmanlike conduct, provocative language and/or actions are prohibited.
- The Y is not responsible for lost or stolen articles.

#### **LOCKER ROOMS**

Lockers are available for daily use during your visit to the Y. Members are asked to leave their valuables at home. If you bring valuables, please secure your belongings in a locker in the appropriate locker room. Locks are strongly advised but are not provided by the Y.

- Adult locker rooms are for use by women and men age 18 and over. Please note that children and infants are not to use the adult locker rooms.
- Boys' and girls' locker rooms where available are reserved for use by minors age 6–17 and accompanying parent/guardian.
- Parents or guardians with children under the age of six or accompanied by an opposite-sex child 6 years of age or younger must use the family locker room (where available).
- Adults must use the Women's or Men's locker room if their child is over the age of 6 years. Men are not
  permitted in the boys' locker room or family locker room unaccompanied by their child. Women are not
  permitted in the girls' locker room or family locker room unaccompanied by their child.
- The family locker room is reserved for parents with children who require assistance to change, and for adults who require the assistance of another adult to change. Adults without children or those not assisting another adult in changing are encouraged to use the adult locker rooms.

#### **GROUP EXERCISE CLASSES**

A wide variety of group exercise classes are included at no additional charge as part of your YMCA membership. Individuals ages 12 and older at all fitness levels are welcome to participate. Registration is not necessary, and classes may be attended on a drop-in basis, except for specialty classes. Complete class schedule listings are available at the Welcome Center, online at ymcapgh.org or via the YMCA of Greater Pittsburgh app. Class sizes may be limited and are first-come, first-served. Registration is required for fee based classes. YMCA instructors may recommend the removal of a member for safety issues or disruptive behavior.



#### **CLASS RULES AND REGULATIONS**

- Class sizes may be limited and are first-come, first-served.
- Do not enter classroom before designated class start time.
- Do not enter a class late after the class has been in session for more than 15 minutes.
- Do not enter a class for equipment while a class is running and in session.
- Wear appropriate attire.
- Athletic shoes must be worn at all times unless directed by instructor.
- Do not wear earphones while class is in session.
- All conversation should be kept to a minimum or nonexistent while the instructor is leading a class.
- If you must leave early, please stay to the back of the classroom.
- You must be at least 12 years old to be in any classroom during class times. Exceptions include designated family and/or child classes.
- After class is completed, all weights/equipment should be put away in a neat and orderly fashion.
- Respect everyone's personal space. Be encouraging and positive to others in the room.
- Be respectful of the class being held; follow the instructor to the best of your ability.
- Let the instructor know in advance of any injuries or special considerations.
- Leave personal objects and bags in a locker. The Y is not responsible for your personal belongings.
- Y instructors may recommend the removal of a member for safety issues or disruptive behavior.





- To ensure the safety of all members, YMCA lifeguards and YMCA directors reserves the right to remove patrons from the
  pool area if they are behaving in an unsafe or inappropriate manner. YMCA lifeguards and YMCA directors also reserve
  the right to prohibit behavior deemed unsafe or inappropriate.
- Obey the lifeguards' authority at all times. No swimming unless a lifeguard is present.
- Parents/Guardians are responsible for any minor's safety.
- Discontinue workout and notify staff if you or others notice pain, dizziness, shortness of breath or feel faint.
- Lifeguard chairs are off limits to all members and guests.
   Please refrain from unnecessary conversations with the lifeguards on duty.
- Do not enter the pool if you suspect you have or recently had a communicable disease, rashes, infections or an open cut or blister. Remove all band-aids before entering the pool.
- Wear family appropriate and clean swim attire only; lined swim trunks for men, swimsuits for women.
- Members are required to shower before entering the pool.
- Children not yet toilet trained need to wear a swim diaper and/ or reusable plastic pants with snug elastic legs and waistband under the child's swim wear. Disposable diapers disintegrate in the water and make the child uncomfortable. Diaper changing in the pool area is prohibited, use locker rooms.
- Diving blocks are for instructional and swim team use only.
   These can only be used when an instructor or coach is present.
- Spitting, spouting water from mouth or blowing the nose in the pool is prohibited.
- Underwater lap swimming and breath-holding drills such as extended breath-holding or hyperventilation are not permitted.
- Be respectful of all YMCA property including lane ropes, deep water ropes and other pool equipment. Members are not allowed to hold onto lane lines.

- All non-swimmers must stay in the shallow end of the pool and/or wear a floatation device. Only U.S. Coast Guard approved lifejackets and wearable foam flotation devices are allowed. Users must remain within arm's reach of an adult.
   Floatation devices are not allowed in a deep end of the pool.
- Refrain from any horseplay including running, pushing, dunking or other unruly behavior in the pool areas and locker rooms.
   Refrain from using foul language.
- Do not bring pets, food, drink, chewing gum, alcohol or tobacco into the inside pool area. Only food and non-alcohol drinks are permitted in the outdoor pool; glass and shatter-able items are prohibited in the outside pool area.
- Pool toys must be approved by the aquatic staff prior to use in the indoor and outdoor pool. No face masks, snorkels or fins in the recreational swim areas. Equipment such as kickboards, fins, pull buoys and aqua exercise equipment are to be used for lap swimming, swim lessons and aqua exercise only.
- No goggles are permitted while using the pool slide. Only those children that pass the deep water test can use the pool slide. Children must go down the slide on their back, feet first.
- Lap lanes are for lap swimming only. If there are 2 swimmers, the lane can be split into halves with each swimmer in 1/2 of the lane. If there are 3 or more swimmers in the lane, use the circle method by swimming counter-clockwise using the center line as the divide.
- Swimmers may be asked to exit the facility during storms, fecal contamination, vomit; or inappropriate chemical levels. Patrons must be sent to the lobby area through the locker room doors. Before re-opening the pools, 30 minutes must be allowed from the last sight of lightning or sound of thunder.



### **Deep Water Testing**

Completion of a brief swim test is required for all children age 12 and under who will not be staying within an arms-reach of an adult. (The swim test consists of swimming freestyle one full length of the pool, tread water for one minute and jump into water over their head and resurface.) You will receive a GREEN necklace if the test is completed, a YELLOW necklace if you only complete a portion of the test or a RED necklace for all non-swimmers. If a necklace is lost or forgotten, you can buy a replacement for \$2 at the Welcome Center.

#### **GREEN**

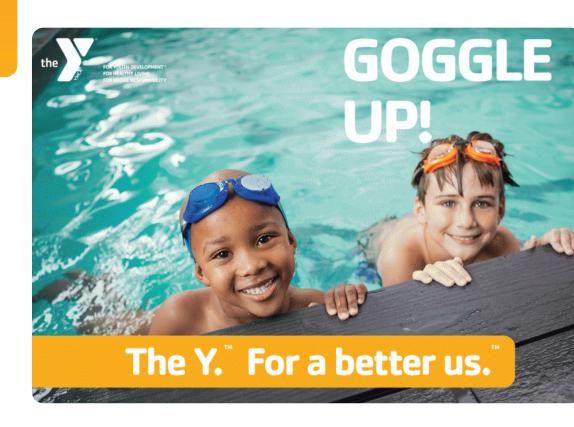
The green necklace indicates an advanced swimmer who is permitted to swim alone in all areas of the pool and go down the water slide.

#### **YELLOW**

The yellow necklace indicates an intermediate swimmer and a parent/guardian needs to either be on the edge of the pool deck or in the water proactively supervising their child.

#### **RED**

The red necklace indicates a non-swimmer and a parent/guardian must be in arms-reach of the child. A parent/guardian must stay in the pool area during the time the child is swimming until the age of 12 years.



#### RELEASE AND WAIVER OF LIABILITY AND INDEMNITY AGREEMENT

In consideration for being permitted to utilize the facilities, services, and programs of the YMCA for any purpose, including but not limited to observation or use of facilities or equipment, or participation in any program affiliated with the YMCA, without respect to location, the undersigned, for himself or herself and any personal representatives, heirs, and next of kin, hereby acknowledges, agrees and represents that he or she has, or immediately upon entering or participating will inspect and carefully consider such premises and facilities or the affiliated program. It is further warranted that such entry into the YMCA for observation or use of any facilities or equipment or participation in such affiliated program constitutes an acknowledgement that such premises and all facilities and equipment thereon and such affiliated programs have been inspected and carefully considered and that the undersigned finds and accepts same as being safe and reasonably suited for the purpose of such observation, use, or participation.

IN FURTHER CONSIDERATION OF BEING PERMITTED TO ENTER THE YMCA FOR ANY PURPOSE, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO OBSERVATION OR USE OF FACILITIES OR EQUIPMENT, OR PARTICIPATION IN ANY PROGRAM AFFILIATED WITH THE YMCA, WITHOUT RESPECT TO LOCATION, THE UNDERSIGNED HEREBY AGREES TO THE FOLLOWING:

- 1. THE UNDERSIGNED HEREBY RELEASES, WAIVES, DISCHARGES AND COVENANTS NOT TO SUE the YMCA, its directors, officers, employees, and agents (hereinafter referred to as "releasees") from all liability to the undersigned, his personal representatives, assigns, heirs, and next of kin for any loss or damage, and any claim or demands therefor on account of injury to the person or property or resulting in death of the undersigned, whether caused by the negligence of the releasees or otherwise while the undersigned is in, upon, or about the premises or any facilities or equipment therein, or participating in any program affiliated with the YMCA, without respect to location.
- 2. THE UNDERSIGNED HEREBY AGREES TO INDEMNIFY AND SAVE AND HOLD HARMLESS the releasees and each of them from any loss, liability, damage, or cost they may incur due to the presence of the undersigned in, upon, or about the YMCA premises or in any way observing or using any facilities or equipment of the YMCA or participating in any program affiliated with the YMCA whether caused by the negligence of the releasees or otherwise.
- 3. THE UNDERSIGNED HEREBY ASSUMES FULL RESPONSIBILITY FOR AND RISK OF BODILY INJURY, DEATH, OR PROPERTY DAMAGE due to negligence of releasees or otherwise while in, about, or upon the premises of the YMCA and/or while using the premises or any facilities or equipment thereon or participating in any program affiliated with the YMCA.
- 4. THE UNDERSIGNED HEREBY AGREES TO SUPERVISE AND BE RESPONSIBLE FOR MY MINOR GUESTS. THE UNDERSIGNED further expressly agrees that the forgoing RELEASE, WAIVER AND INDEMNITY AGREEMENT is intended to be as broad and inclusive as is permitted by the law of the State of Pennsylvania and that if any portion thereof is held invalid, it is agreed that the balance shall, notwithstanding, continue in full legal force and effect.

THE UNDERSIGNED HAS READ AND VOLUNTARILY SIGNS THE RELEASE AND WAIVER OF LIABILITY AND INDEMNITY AGREEMENT, and further agrees that no oral representations, statements, or inducement apart from the foregoing written agreement have been made.

#### COMMUNITY AND FACILITY AGREEMENT

In consideration of gaining membership or being allowed to participate in the activities and programs of the YMCA and to use its facilities, equipment, and machinery in addition to the payment of any fee or charge, I do hereby waive, release, and forever discharge the YMCA and its officers, agents, employees, representatives, executors, and all others from any and all responsibilities or liability for injuries or damages resulting from my participation in any activities or my use of equipment or machinery in the above mentioned facilities or arising out of my participation in any activities at said facility. I do also hereby release all of those mentioned and any others acting upon their behalf from any responsibility or liability for any injury or damage to myself, including those caused by the negligent act or omission of any those mentioned or others, acting on their behalf or in any way arising out of or connected with my participation in any activities of the YMCA or the use of any equipment at the YMCA. I agree to adhere to all policies set by the YMCA as written in the YMCA Membership Handbook.
