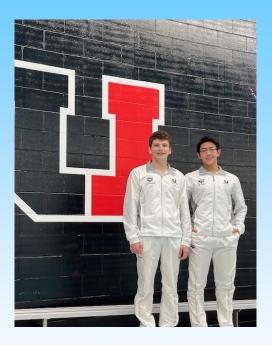
PEAQ Hosts Multiple Meets

PEAQ successfully hosted four meets during the first half of the short course season! Beginning in October, the South Hills PEAQ sites hosted the first annual PEAQ Halloween Invite. The meet was held October 27th through October 29th at Upper Saint Clair High School. The pool was decorated for Halloween, and the swimmers had fun competing for glow in the dark Halloween medals. Later in November, when the Pine Richland meet was cancelled due to facility issues, PEAQ at Pitt used the Canon McMillan pool and organized a one-day meet that included PEAQ and some swimmers from Steel City. This was a great opportunity for kids who didn't attend the Braun meet in Geneva, Ohio to get some racing in. When December rolled around, the South Hills PEAQ sites hosted a two-day intrasquad IMX/R/L meet at Canon McMillan during the weekend of December 9th and 10th where many kids made progress in achieving their goal of getting an IMX or and IMR score. Finally, we closed out the last short course meet of 2023 with PEAQ at Pitt hosting the 61st annual Christmas meet. The competition at this meet was stiff with many out-of-state teams coming in for the event. We are so proud of how our swimmers performed at these PEAQ-hosted meets and at other meets the first half of the season and can't wait to see what championship season has in store for us. PEAQ Swimmers Honored by The National Merit Scholarship Program

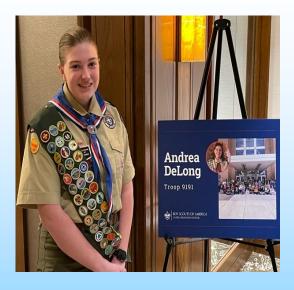

3) Athletes, upon your 18th birthday, you must take the USA Swimming APT (Athlete Protection Training) course and read and acknowledge the USA Swimming MAAP (Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policy).
