# PEAQ Wraps Up a Successful Short Course Season

Even though long course season is now upon us, we want to take a minute to recognize the success PEAQ had this short course championship season. PEAQ closed out its short course season with a meet for everyone. The club kicked off championship season the weekend of February 21st-23rd when we sent a group of athletes to Silver Champs, which was hosted this year by The Monroeville Marlins. Then, on March 2<sup>nd</sup>, PEAQ competed at the Copper Cup in Mount Lebanon and had a successful showing. The following weekend in March PEAQ sent a team of swimmers to Pitt to compete in the AMS Age Group Champs. Catherine Miller was the 14- year-old high point winner, and Maiia Zaikina (12 years old) and JJ Stitt (9 years old) were the high point runner-up winners for their age groups at Age Group Champs.

Several weeks later (3/25-3/29) PEAQ sent a group of senior-level swimmers to the ISCA Senior Cup in Saint Petersburg, Florida. Highlights from that meet included Olivia George and Mac Clark breaking the meet records in the 1000 yard free. Additionally, the 400-freestyle relay team consisting of Nazar Zoukovski, Ben Whiteford, Jackson Edwards, and Mac Clark also broke the meet record. However, one of the most exciting highlights of the week was when PEAQ won the entire meet after the final day of the competition! The following week (4/2-4/5) PEAQ sent a group of age group swimmers to Saint Petersburg to compete in the ISCA Elite Showcase, and PEAQ sent swimmers to compete in the Eastern Age Group Zones in Webster, New York. The age group swimmers swam well and had fun with their teammates at these highlevel travel meets. We are very proud of all of our swimmers who represented PEAQ at so many different meets!







# Swimmers Represent their High Schools at the WPIAL and PIAA Championship Meets



These WPIAL Champions and many more of our PEAQ swimmers qualified at WPIALs to represent their high schools at the state level PIAA meet at Bucknell University, March 12<sup>th</sup>-15th. Our swimmers made their high schools proud with many podium finishes and incredible swims at States. One of the many exciting races of the meet was when **Mac Clark** of Pittsburgh Central Catholic was crowned state champion in the 500 free. We are so proud of our state champion, Mac, and all our swimmers who represented their high schools at WPIALS and States!
