SWIM A THON

Swim Neptune Swim-a-Thon - November 22-23

Get ready for Swim Neptune's biggest fundraiser of the year: the Swim-a-Thon, taking place the weekend of November 22-23 at your swimmer's practice site (exact date/time will be emailed by your coach). This fun and rewarding event is a great way for all competitive swimmers to raise funds by swimming up to 200 lengths during a regular practice session, with donations collected as flat amounts or per length swum. Once your fundraising requirement is met, 75% of additional funds raised will be credited to your account—and Trident swimmers who choose to participate will receive 75% of all funds raised as a credit. COMPETITIVE TEAM REQUIREMENTS The first half [8/1-1/31] of any unworked Volunteer hours and/or Fundraising not completed will be billed at the

end of January to be paid on February 1st. If you have questions or requests, please contact helenz@swimneptune. com. The swim season runs from August - July. The Fundraising commitment is \$180 per family and the Volunteer hour commitment is 24 per family (White group families have 16 hours). It is the responsibility of all USA registered families to keep track of hours earned and posted to your account online. To view hours click "My Account", "Account Info", "Service Hour" tab. Trident families that are NOT USA Swimming members do not have these requirements. Dive Neptune members do not have these requirements.
