What is a Meet Marshal?

A Meet Marshal is a meet official whose responsibility is to *maintain safety and order* in the swimming venue and *enforce warm-up procedures*. At Hillenbrand, this includes enforcing our *closed deck policy*. We cannot run a meet without a sufficient pool of male and female Meet Marshalls. Meet Marshals get front row seats to the action on deck!

- If a person is *acting unsafely*, *using profane or abusive language*, or *disrupting the meet*, Marshals can, with the approval of the Meet Referee, remove that person from the venue.
- Meet Marshals are required to wear identifying attire (fluorescent vest and volunteer lanyard)
- Meet Marshals should be friendly and have a smile on their face as they walk throughout the pool venue
- Meet Marshals are representatives of the club and also the sport of swimming
- The Meet Marshal role is defined in section 102.19 of the USA Swimming Rules and Regulations

How do I become a Meet Marshal?

Step 1: Complete the Meet Marshal training module on USA Swimming Website

Login to your personal account at member.usaswimming.org and navigate to the
 EDUCATION > Course Catalog > Parent/Volunteer > Meet Marshal tabs to locate the
 online Meet Marshal Test Module. Select View Info Button. Select Go To Course. Select Launch
 Course. Look for link near the bottom that reads Meet Marshall Training Guide. Once you have
 learned the material, navigate back and click the Let's Get Started button to take the exam. You
 must be logged in to see the course and take the exam.

Step 2: Submit your Certificate of Completion

- When you have completed the Training Guide, you will take the Meet Marshal test.
 Download your certificate of completion, and email to the Meet Director at Meets@fordaquatics.org
- Save a copy showing you have successfully passed and share with the AZ Swimming office at registration@azswimming.org
- Meet marshal certifications no longer expire one and done!

Step 3: Show up to your shift at the Meet \bigcirc

What about other Meet Official roles?

Arizona Swimming is in desperate need of new Meet Officials. If you volunteer as a Meet Official you are excused from other FORD volunteer requirements. Officials must work a minimum of four AZ meets per swim year, including all Ford-hosted meets. Ford reimburses officials' annual registration fee and various additional costs.
