

2025 SCS Spring Age Group Champs Meet Recap

SWIMMER HIGHLIGHTS

Beach 1

Kenna Danner ~ Miss Danner was one of four Beach 1 athletes to join forces to represent BCS on the lone relay in the 10&Under age group, the 23rd place 200 Medley Relay. She threw down a fantastic split of 43.5 on the Breaststroke leg, which was more than a second better than her flat start time in the event. It was a great experience for her and the rest of the young athletes and we think we will be seeing more of them in future Championship Meet action. Congratulations, Kenna!

Olivia Ionescu-Macri ~ Our third leg (Butterfly) of the 23rd place 200 Medley Relay belonged to Miss Ionescu-Macri, who blazed to an astonishing split of 36.2, which was more than 2.5 seconds faster than her best flat start time in the 50 Fly. Lena Kwak ~ Miss Kwak raced the anchor leg (Freestyle) of the 23rd place 200 Medley Relay and she did not disappoint, with a HUGE split of 33.1, more than a second faster than her flat start time in the event. Beach 5

Olivia Chi ~ Miss Chi concluded a very busy month of racing, which included stops in Mission Viejo, Pasadena and Oceanside, prior to concluding the SCY season with a solid showing in La Mirada at AG Champs. A disappointing DQ in the 100 Fly did not derail her weekend, as she bagged a personal best in the 200 Fly, cracking the 2:10 barrier for the first time and claiming 9th place in the event. Her best finish of the weekend, however, was her 8th place finish in the 200 Back. She also contributed to two scoring relays, including the victorious 200 Medley and the 16th place 400 Medley. Nina Haubner ~ Miss Haubner was a staple on all four relays in La Mirada, taking full advantage of her two leadoff swims to bag personal bests in both the 50 and 100 Backstroke and dropping a respectable 29.0 split on the 200 Free Relay, which was more than a second faster than her best flat start in the 50 Free. His Fly split of 1:00.2 on the 400 Medley was nearly two seconds faster than his best flat start in the event, but his best split belonged to the 24.5 he posted during the 200 Free Relay, almost two seconds faster than his best 50 time from just a month earlier! He is not afraid to work and we are witnessing the fruits of his labor as it manifests itself in the form of great racing. Well done, Theo!

Hana Imai ~ Although it wasn't the meet she had envisioned, Miss Imai fought hard just to qualify for the meet and fought again, as usual, throughout the weekend. She scored big points for the team as a member of the 16th place 400 Medley Relay and raced on three other relays. She swam three individual events, placing as high as 45th in the 200 Breast. She is only 13, so she will have another Spring AG Champs meet in her future and I know she will knock it out of the park, given the chance. Great effort, Hana!

Colin lonescu-Macri ~ Mr. Ionescu-Macri did not race any individual events, but he made big contributions on the relay front, scoring points on three relays (800 Free, 400 Free, 400 Medley), all of which were top 10 finishes. In individual action, she placed as high as 29th in the 50 Free and probably would have placed higher if it weren't for an unfortunate missed turn.
