SWIMMERS OF THE MEET

Marlin A — Allison Visosky

Allison had an incredible meet and just barely missed the 50 Breast Wag cut by .18 seconds. This is a great swim for an athlete who is in a pre-competitive group however is swimming at an Age Group Champs pace.

Beach 1— Rory Arredondo-Ratcliff

Rory has really found his happy place in the pool this season. He is practicing with more joy and approaching the work of improving his strokes and skills with greater effort and attention to detail. All of his hard work is showing up in the way he swims on race day. He had another solid outing at last weekend's Fall Festival, dropping in 2 events (50 Back, 50 Free) and racing 3 SCY events for the first time (100 Breast, 200 Free, 200 IM). In that 200 IM, he placed 4th (his best finish in the meet), posting a National B time in the process. He has also raced his way onto two WAG Champs relays in December. Way to go, Rory!

Beach 2 — Mackenzie McElroy

Mackenzie had a fantastic meet that had her secure her very first Winter Age Group time standards (50 Back & 50 Breast). In addition, she was one of two Beach 2 swimmers to swim in the 500 freestyle for the first time. Lot's to be proud of, Mackenzie, and plenty left to achieve. Keep up the great work!

Beach 3 — Kendall Visistsri

I am so proud of the way Keni stepped up and showed up for both herself and her team this weekend! She had six incredible swims, earning lifetime bests in all six events! In addition, she dropped a whopping 3.98 seconds in the 100 Fly to earn her second WAG cut, placing 4th overall! Keni also had an extremely impressive 200 Freestyle, dropping 7.00 seconds from her time from just over one month ago at the Royal Meet. Keni showed strong improvement across the board this past weekend. Great job Keni! Keep up the amazing work.

Beach 4 — Kenya Tullo

Kenya's 2:32 200 IM, just beating out her twin sister in the race, was one of the best shows of sportsmanship!

Beach 5 — Theo Haubner

Theo has been on a tear since the green flag dropped on the 2024-25 season. He entered the season with 0 WAG Champs cuts and, after last weekend's racing in El Segundo, he now has a full slate (6). This young man works consistently harder than almost any athlete I have ever coached and he is being rewarded for that effort with some outstanding performances this season. He posted 100% best times at the Fall Festival, placing as high as 14th place in the 400 IM (-7.05 seconds) and bagging new WAG cuts in the 1650 Free, as well as the 1000 Free (1650 split). He also posted a lifetime best in the 500 Free with his split in the 1650. Keep up the excellent work, Theo!

Her hard work has really paid off through our fall meets, as she's been rewarded with a slew of lifetime bests, several new Sectional cuts, and a new Futures cut in the 100 Freestyle. At our Fall Festival meet she kept things rolling with another 100% Lifetime Best meet, posting 3-second time drops in the 100 Breaststroke, 100 Backstroke, and 200 IM and posted a blazing fast LTB of 23.41 in the 50 Freestyle to finish as the top girl in the event by nearly a full second.
