POINTE CLAIRE SWIM CLUB HISTORY

1967

- Placed second in the Canadian National Championships
- Tom Arusoo named to the Canadian Pan-American Games Team
- Tom Arusoo placed second in the men's 200M butterfly winning a silver medal for Canada
- Provincial Age Group and Senior Champions

1968

- The men's team won the high point Speedo Trophy at the Canadian National Championships
- Won the B.C. Section Trophy as the over-all Canadian Club Champions...at the Canadian National Championships
- Tom Arusoo selected to go to Mexico on the Canadian Olympic Team, placing 12th in the 200M butterfly event and 7th as part of the 400M medley relay team
- Head Coach George Gate was selected by the Canadian Coaches Association as Head Coach of the 1968 Canadian Olympic Team for Mexico
- Quebec Senior and Age Group Champions

1969

- Canadian National Championships were held in the Pointe Claire pool, home of the Pointe Claire Swim Club
- John Hawes won the National Championship in the 200M backstroke event
- Pointe Claire Swim Club placed second overall at the Canadian National Championships
- Quebec Age Group and Senior Champions

- Three Pointe Claire swimmers were selected to represent Canada on the Commonwealth Games Team: Tom Arusoo, Peter Cross and John Hawes
- Tom Arusoo won a gold medal in the men's 200M butterfly and a silver medal in the men's 100M butterfly event
- Peter Cross won a silver medal in the men's 100M breaststroke and placed fourth in the men's 200M breaststroke
- John Hawes placed ninth in the men's 200M backstroke

- John Hawes, Bob Duncan, and Dave Johnson were selected to represent Canada at the World Student Games held in Torino, Italy
- Dave Johnson placed fifth in the 1500M freestyle event
- Quebec Senior and Age Group Champions

- Four Pointe Claire swimmers: John Hawes, Diane Gate, Dave Johnson and Tom Arusoo were selected as members of the Canadian Team for the Pan-American Games held in Cali, Columbia
- John Hawes won a silver medal in the 400M medley relay and a bronze medal in the 200M backstroke event
- Diane Gate won a silver medal in the women's 400M freestyle relay
- Dave Johnson placed seventh in the 400M freestyle and eighth in the men's 200M freestyle
- Tom Arusoo placed ninth in the men's 100M butterfly
- Quebec Age Group and Senior Champions

1972

- Two Pointe Claire swimmers were selected to represent Canada at the 1972 Munich Olympics: John Hawes and Marian Stuart
- Marian Stuart won the National Championships in the 100M and 200M breastroke events in Canadian record setting times. The 100M time was also a Commonwealth record
- Marian Stewart placed 18th and 19th in the World in the 100M and 200M breaststroke events in Munich
- John Hawes placed 25th in the World in the men's 200M backstroke event

- Marian Stewart and John Hawes were selected to the Canadian Team for the first World Championships in Belgrade, and three other Pointe Claire swimmers were selected to the Canadian team for the World Student Games in Moscow: John Hawes, Jill Quirk and Richard Zajchowski
- Head Coach George Gate was selected by the Canadian Coaches Association as Canadian Coach for the swimmers at the First World Championships
- Marian Stuart placed fifth in the women's 400M medley relay team for Canada

- Marian Stuart won the Brazilian Championships in the 100M and 200M breaststroke events
- Marian Stuart won the Canadian National 100M and 200M breaststroke championships in an exiting race in Quebec City
- John Hawes won a bronze medal in Moscow in the men's 200M backstroke event
- Richard Zajchowski placed ninth in the men's 100M freestyle and was fourth in the Canadian 400M medley relay
- Jill Quirk placed seventh in the 100M freestyle and was seventh in the 100M backstroke
- Pointe Claire Swim Club was the winner of Operation Olympics which is the Canadian Age Group Championships, signifying supremacy in Age Group swimming in Canada
- Pointe Claire won the British Age Group Championships in Coventry, England
- Pointe Claire swimmers won five of the seven gold medals won by Quebec at the Canada Games held in New Westminster, British Columbia
- Quebec Senior and Age Group Champions

- Five swimmers from Pointe Claire were selected to represent Canada on the Commonwealth Games Team for Christchurch, New Zealand: Wendy Quirk, Marian Stuart, Anne Jardin, France Latendresse and Alexis Soroka
- Wendy Quirk set four new Canadian records in the selection trials in Vancouver
- Wendy Quirk set Commonwealth and Canadian records, in heats of the women's 100M butterfly event. Placed fourth in the final, won a silver medal in the 400M freestyle and placed 5th in the 800M freestyle event
- Marian Stuart won a silver medal in the 100M breaststroke and a gold medal in the women's 400M medley relay
- Anne Jardin won a Gold medal as part of the Canadian Team in the women's 400M freestyle relay. She also placed 4th in the 100M freestyle and 7th in the 400M freestyle
- France Latendresse placed 5th in the 200M butterfly
- Alexis Soroka placed 10th in the 100M breaststroke and 12th in the 200M breaststroke

- Eleven Pointe Claire swimmers qualified to attend the U.S. Nationals held in Dallas, Texas: Cathy Rafferty, Jill Taylor, Anne Jardin, France Latendresse, Alexis Soroka, Ginette Ladouceur, Wendy Quirk, Marian Stuart, Jill Quirk, Victor Ivry and Danielle Balla
- Pointe Claire swimmers retained their Quebec Senior and Age Group Championships by large margins over the rest of the Province of Quebec
- Danielle Balla, Anne Jardin, Wendy Quirk, and Jill Quirk teamed together to win the women's 400M freestyle relay in the prestigious Santa Clara International meet and set a Canadian record at the same time
- Similarly, Wendy Quirk, Anne Jardin, Marian Stuart and Ginette Ladouceur teamed together to win the women's 400M medley relay to stun the Americans again
- Marian Stuart placed second in both the 100M and 200M breaststroke
- The Pointe Claire Swim Club's women's team dominated the 1974 Canadian Swimming Championships held at the Nepean Sportsplex in suburban Ottawa. Our girls defeated the second place Canadian Dolphin Swim Club by over 600 points
- Our men did a fantastic job as well and were just edged out of second place by Etobicoke. Over all, the Club placed second behind the Dolphins who show signs of losing their stranglehold over Canadian Swimming
- Individually:

Anne Jardin won the ladies 200M event in Canadian record time

Wendy Quirk won the Canadian Championships in the women's 200M butterfly event while placing third in the 100M butterfly event, third in the women's 400M freestyle and fifth in the 800M freestyle event

Marian Stuart, the previous year's Canadian Breaststroke Champion in the 100M and 200M breaststroke events, again won her specialties

Glenys Reid placed third to win the bronze medal in the 100M breaststroke event

Victor Ivry placed fifth in the men's 100M backstroke and eighth in the 200M event

- Robert Luxenberg placed fifth in the 100M freestyle event
- Paul Midgley and George Carpouzis placed fifth and sixth in the men's 1500M freestyle
- Pointe Claire Women's relay won both the 400M freestyle and medley relays in Canadian record times
- At the U.S. Nationals in Concorde, California, Wendy Quirk established a Canadian record for the women's 1500M freestyle
- The women's 400M medley relay broke their own Canadian record
- Anne Jardin won the consolation final of the women's 100M freestyle event and was the fastest Canadian girl in the meet

- Wendy Quirk and Marian Stuart were selected to the Canadian team for the New Zealand Games in Christchurch, New Zealand. Wendy Quirk won the 100M and 200M butterfly in Canadian and Commonwealth records. She also set a Canadian record in the 200M freestyle. Marian Stuart placed second in the 100M breaststroke
- Quebec Provincial Champions Age Group and Senior
- Six swimmers were selected for the Canadian World Aquatic Games in Cali, Columbia. They were Anne Jardin, Jill Quirk, Wendy Quirk, Marian Stuart, Paul Midgley and Bob Kastings
- Anne Jardin placed seventh in the 100M freestyle and won a bronze in the Canadian 400M free relay
- Jill Quirk won a bronze medal on the Canadian 400M freestyle relay
- Wendy Quirk placed 6th in the 200M butterfly, 9th in the 100M butterfly and 4th on the Canadian medley relay team
- Marian Stuart placed 5th in the 100M breaststroke and 4th on the Canadian medley relay team
- Paul Midgley placed 14th in his first international in the 1500M freestyle
- Bob Kastings placed 8th in the 100M freestyle and 4th on the 400M medley relay team
- Five swimmers were selected to the Canadian Pan-American Games Team which competed at the VII Games in Mexico City, Mexico. They were Wendy Quirk, Jill Quirk, Anne Jardin, Marian Stuart, and Mike Blondal
- Wendy Quirk won one silver medal in the 400M free relay and a bronze in the 100M butterfly
- Jill Quirk won one silver medal in the 400M free relay and a bronze in the 100M freestyle
- Anne Jardin won a bronze in the 200M freestyle and a silver in the 400M medley relay
- Marian Stuart won bronze in the 100M breaststroke and a silver on the 400M medley relay
- Mike Blondal won a silver medal in the 800M free relay
- Pointe Claire coaches Tom and Dave Johnson were assistant coaches on the Canadian Pan-Am Team

- Wendy Quirk placed 5th in the 200M butterfly, 6th in the 100M butterfly and 9th in the 800M freestyle
- Anne Jardin won two bronze medals in the women's 400M medley relay and the women's 400M freestyle relays. She also placed 10th in the 100M freestyle and 14th in the 200M freestyle
- Robin Corsiglia won a bronze medal as part of the women's medley relay team. She also placed 9th in the women's 100M breaststroke event
- Helene Boivin placed 9th in the 100M butterfly event
- Paul Midgley placed 14th in the men's 1500M freestyle
- Pointe Claire coaches Dave Johnson and Don Packer were selected as assistant coaches to the Canadian Olympic Team
- Six Pointe Claire swimmers: Jeff Naylor, Mike Blondal, Jill Quirk, Ginette Ladouceur, Ernie Hayes and Bob Kastings were selected to the Canadian Team to swim in Germany
