# RICHMOND RAPIDS GUIDE TO BECOMING A SWIMMING OFFICIAL



# Why Become a Swimming Official?

- Demonstrates that you value sport, the competitive experience and support your child's and others participation and development in swimming.
- It allows you to meet other people in the community and gain knowledge about the sport.
- Allows the club to host successful competitions and raise funds to cover operating expenses.
- Volunteer officials can earn Rapids Parent Volunteer Points (PPP).

# Steps to Becoming a Swimming Official

- 1. Request a Swimming Canada Registrations and Event Management System (REMS) Account.
  - Click here to fill out the <u>Rapids New Official Request form.</u>
    - The REMS account registration is necessary for contact and demographic information and understanding and agreement of Swimming Canada policies.
    - Information is also by Swimming Canada and Swim BC to access government funding.
    - Your REMS account will help track your officiating progress and provide access to Swimming Canada's Learning Management System (LMS). The LMS is used for access to online E-modules.

### 2. Complete the REMS account registration.

 Once the Rapids Official Director registers you on REMS you will receive and email from <u>noreply+RichmondRapidsSwimClub@sportlomo.com</u> to complete your registration. Follow the steps provided in this email.

## 3. Sign up for a Swimming Canada Officiating Clinic.

- Clinics will be hosted by the Rapids and its volunteers. Sign up is via the Rapids website.
- New Officials must start with the Intro to Swim Officiating Clinic & Safety Marshal.
- Some clinics may be completed online via the Swimming Canada LMS.
  - E-modules are available for Intro to Swim Officiating, Safety Marshal, Chief Timekeeper, Administration Desk and Para Swimming.
  - o Click here for instructions logging into the Learning Management System.
- Volunteers must gain on-deck experience before taking a new clinic.

### 4. Volunteer at a RAPIDS major swim meet.

- Major Rapids swim meets that are Swim BC sanctioned competitions are recognized for "on-deck experience" include time trials, Fast Swim, West Coast Open, LMR Open.
- RSS Mini meets and PASS meets are not sanctioned competitions.
- Volunteer sign up information will be emailed to members in advance of the competition.

- Volunteers do not receive Rapids PPP for repeating clinics.
- Volunteers must sign in and complete volunteer job in order to receive PPP at all Rapids events.
