WAC Coach Code of Conduct

The goals of the Windsor Aquatic Club are to develop a strong team and community spirit founded upon teamwork and good sportsmanship. Our Club must strive to project an image that will make all of its members proud of the team and of the sport of swimming, and to represent our community responsibly when at home or traveling.

- 1. WAC Coaches are expected to adhere to the Swim Ontario Comprehensive Code of Conduct and Ethics. Swim Ontario Code of Conduct and Professional Ethics
- 2. WAC Coaches are expected to be fully registered with their governing body and maintain their credentials as required out by Swim Canada and Swim Ontario.
- 3. WAC Coaches must consistently display high standards of behavior and experience and be a role model for their swimmers.
- WAC Coaches are expected to conduct themselves in a manner that shows respect for fellow coaches, swimmers, WAC families, lifeguards, all officials and facilities, at all times.
- 5. WAC Coaches are expected to represent the Windsor Aquatic Club in a positive manner at all times. This applies to practice, during swim meets, team travel events and when interacting with swimmers, other coaches, parents, officials and facility staff.
- 6. WAC Coaches are expected to refrain from promoting or allowing swimmers to act in a way that could result in injuries to themselves or others during dryland, in the pool, during practices or at swim meets.
- 7. Coaches must ensure at the activities they direct or advocate is appropriate for the age, maturity, experience and ability of the swimmers.
- 8. WAC Coaches are expected to refrain from using profane, disrespectful or threatening language towards swimmers, families, other coaches and officials. This includes interaction on social media platforms.
- 9. Coaches must encourage and guide swimmers to accept responsibility for their own behavior and performance.
- 10. Coaches should, at the beginning of each season, outline with all swimmers (and, where appropriate, their parents) exactly what is expected of them and also what they are entitled to expect from their coach.
- 11. WAC Coaches are expected to help create and promote a supportive atmosphere in both training and competitive settings. They are expected to support all athletes within the Club by respecting the rights, dignity and worth of each swimmer and treat them equally within the context of the sport.
