



ACCOMMODATION

PRICES FOR ATHLETES AND TEAM OFFICIALS

- A) US \$110.00 per person per person per night for quadruple occupancy, inclusive of 3 meals per day and local transportation from the airport to the hotel and from the hotel to the place of competition of the delegations.
- B) US \$150.00 per person per person per night for triple occupancy, inclusive of 3 meals per day and local transportation from the airport to the hotel and from the hotel to the place of competition of the delegations.
- C) US \$200.00 per person per person per night for double occupancy, inclusive of 3 meals per day and local transportation from the airport to the hotel and from the hotel to the place of competition of the delegations.
- D) US \$250.00 per person per person per night for individual occupancy, inclusive of 3 meals per day and local transportation from the airport to the hotel and from the hotel to the place of competition of the delegations.

PRICES FOR TECHNICAL OFFICIALS

A) US \$110.00 per person per person per night for double occupancy, inclusive of 3 meals per day and local transportation between the competition venue and the athlete's hotel.

The payment must be made by each member of the official delegation to secure reservations of the rooms. On receipt of preliminary entries, the organizing committee will be able to provide all participating countries with more information regarding accommodation.















PARTICIPANTS

All participants in these Championships must:

- 1) Be a citizen of the Country they are seeking to represent World Aquatics rule I.3.1.1
- 2) Be a Member of a Federation duly constituted and affiliated to the (CCCAN) Confederation World Aquatics Rule I.2.1
- 3) The Federation must be up to date in its membership dues.
- 4) Teams participating in these championships must do so in the name of the country which they represent with the understanding that they are members of the Confederation through their respective Federations
- 5) Participants who are not members of a CCCAN National Federation must receive the approval and authorization of both their National Federation and Zone affiliate. Such approval must be signed by either the President or Secretary of the National Federation and Zone President and presented to the Secretary of CCCAN.
- 6) Non-citizens may be entered providing the competitor has been resident in the Country for at least one year prior to the entry deadline and must not have swum for another Country during that period. All Competitors must also be registered with, or a member of, the Swimming Federation of the Country that they represent. Competitors who are non-citizens would be required to present 'proof of residency' documents which could be proof of club membership, proof of attendance at school or any other organization. If a Country enters a competitor that is not a citizen of that country by birth or naturalization, the code for that country shall be changed by adding "AG" as a suffix to the designated three letter World Aquatics Country code and used throughout the competition e.g. ESA shall be changed to ESA-AG.
- 7) Proof of age must be provided by means of an official birth certificate or a passport. Competitors should use the passport of the country they are representing.

(b) Final entries:

ENTRIE RULES

- A. Each country may enter a maximum of four (4) swimmers in preliminary events. The fastest two (2) will move on to the finals. Each country may enter only one team in relays.
- B. There is no limit to the number of events in which an individual competitor may participate.
- C. No alternates or substitutes will be allowed in individual events.
- D. Relay events, each country may enter four (4) competitors, but any member of the country's team, duly entered in the championships, may be a substitute. All relays must be entered















together with the individual entries in the HY-TEK file no later than midnight July 17, 2023.

- E. No competitor may participate out of his/her age group.
- F. The order of the swimmers in the relay events must be turned in to the control table no later than **one (1) hour** prior to the start of the session in which the event is to be held.

RULES

The Championships shall be governed by the rules of World Aquatics in force at the time of the competition.

SWIMSUIT, GOGGLES AND SWIM CAPS

The swimwear, goggles, and swim caps used shall be those approved by World Aquatics and must be on the current "approved" list published by World Aquatics each year. These rules of attire apply both to Preliminary and Final events and must carry the approved World Aquatics mark.

INTERPRETATIONS

The Members of the CCCAN Executive Committee present at the championships shall have complete authority to answer and resolve all interpretation, resolutions or appeals related to these championships.

TECHNICAL OFFICIALS

The President of CCCAN, with the recommendation from the Technical Committee for each discipline, will name the judges and referees for the championships, with the understanding that at least 90% will be provided by the host country. **The CCCAN member and invited national federations can nominate** up to two (2) technical officials. For swimming, **Referees and Starters must be on Fina Officials Lists #21 and #22**. Technical Officials will be roomed in doubles but charged the quadruple rate for local transportation, accommodation and three (3) meals per day.















The entries with the names and background of each Technical Official shall be sent to the President of CCCAN no later than **Jun 25**, **2023**, at the following address:

The President of CCCAN shall notify each Federation and the Organizing Committee of the names of those technical officials selected to work at the championships.

AWARDS

- 1) A Championship trophy shall be awarded to the country with the highest points in each age group (male and female).
- 2) An Overall Championship trophy shall be awarded to the country gaining the highest total points.
- 3) Each award shall have the logo and the initials of the CCCAN and the design shall be approved by CCCAN.
- 4) First to third place shall be awarded medals in each event gold, silver, bronze respectively. Each medal shall have the initials of the CCCAN and the design shall be approved by the CCCAN.
- 5) In relays each of the 4 participants shall receive a medal.

The awards shall be presented on the awards podium as determined by the Organizing Committee in consultation with the President of CCCAN or his nominee. The flags of the first three (3) places shall be raised and the anthem of the winning country shall be played.

PROGRAM

- A) The heats in swimming will be held in the morning and the eight (8) finalists will be selected based on time. The finals will be held in the afternoon.
- B) The 800 & 1500 M Freestyle, the 200 M Butterfly and 200 M Breaststroke in the 11-12 age group, and the 400 M Individual Medley in the 13-14 age group will be swum as "timed finals" and will be seeded in accordance with World Aquatics Rule 3.1.1.6. All entries in in these events must show "proof of time" (name and date of competition in which the time has been achieved) when entered in the HY-TEK file. If the evidence is not submitted, the swimmer will not be entered.
- C) The 800 M & 1500 M Free events will be swum as a 13 and over category but will be awarded separately.

All swimmers in the Timed Final events (200 M Breaststroke & 200 M Butterfly 11-12, 400 M Individual Medley 13-14, and all 800/1500 M Free) must report to the Clerk of Course in the morning to account for any scratches, to ensure that there will be 8 swimmers in the Final heat.

The committee will provide the HYTEK file 1 month prior the entry deadline.

ENTRIE RULES

- A. Each country may enter a maximum of three (3) competitors in each individual event, male and female.
- B. All competitors must be subject to a medical physical examination in the host country prior to their event. Time and place of this examination will be communicated to each delegation at the technical meeting.
- C. Competitors between the ages of 12 and 17 years old shall only participate if they are represented by their parents or by the delegate of their country at the championships. The competitor's representative must sign and include with the entry form a document exonerating CCCAN and the host federation of all responsibilities.
- D. It is obligatory that each swimmer is accompanied by a companion during the competition. An accompanying representative can accompany a maximum of 2 swimmers. If he/she does not have a representative from his/her country to accompany him/her, he/she must make a request for a companion to the Organizing Committee during the technical meeting.













Additional relay rules and procedures:

- Every category will held relay events.
- Relay mixed teams shall be formed by 4 athletes, 2 masculine and 2 feminine.
- Relay mixed teams can be formed of two athletes that are not participating on the open water events and the other two athletes shall be participating in one or all events of 3k (if the category applied), 5k and 10k.
- The distance for athlete changes during the event will be of 20 meters.
- The competitors of the relays of 12-13 years old shall swim 1.250 meters, each one.
- The competitors of the relays in the categories 14-17 and 18 & over, shall swim 1.250 each one.

RULES

The Championships shall be governed by the rules of World Aquatics in force at the time of the competitions.

SWIMWEAR, GOGGLES AND SWIM CAPS

The swimwear, goggles, and swim caps used shall be those approved by World Aquatics and must be on the current "approved" list published by World Aquatics each year. They must be worn in Preliminary and Final events and must carry the approved World Aquatics mark.

Every swim cap must have the three letters of the country code.

INTERPRETATIONS

The Members of the CCCAN Executive Committee present at the championships shall have complete authority to answer and resolve all interpretation, resolutions or appeals related to these championships. Considering the results obtained by the swimmers in the 5K event, the CCCAN Open Water Technical Committee will authorize their participation in the 10K event, even if they have been officially registered by their Federation in the 10K.

All competitors will have the opportunity to train and familiarize themselves with the competition course one (1) day prior to the first event.















Due the number of participants, the technical committee will decide what kind of start will be used.

Other matters of interest regarding the rules will be discussed in the technical meeting, prior to the competition.

TECHNICAL OFFICIALS

The President of CCCAN, with the recommendation from the Technical Committee for each discipline, will name the judges and referees for the championships, with the understanding that at least 90% will be provided by the host country. The CCCAN member and invited national federations can nominate up to two (2) technical officials. For swimming, Referees and Starters must be on World Aquatics Officials Lists #14 and #15. Technical Officials will be roomed in doubles but charged the quadruple rate for local transportation, accommodation and three (3) meals per day.

The entries with the names and background of each Technical Official shall be sent to the President of CCCAN no later than **Jun 25**, **2023**, at the following address:

RULES OF PARTICIPATION

- Each participant in the championship must be a member of a club which must be duly federated or be nationally selected by a Federation.
- All Clubs affiliated to their federations can participate in the invitational event.
- All invited federations although do not belong to the CCCAN area can participate in the invitational.
- Each Federation will send in one entry, which will include all entries for the Country (i.e National Team, clubs, etc).
- Each Country and/or club may enter two (3) solos, two (3) duets, two (3) mixed duets, and one (1) team per age group.
- The teams must each be composed of a minimum of four (4) swimmers and a maximum of eight (8). World Aquatics Rule AS18.1 will apply.
- The combined routine must be composed of four (4) to ten (10) swimmers with a maximum of two male athletes.













- The acrobatic routine just for Juniors can be composed by four (4) to eight (8) swimmers with a maximum of two (2) male athletes.
- No competitor may participate out of his or her age group, even in an older category.
- Athletes with 15 years old can only participate in maximum two categories.

RULES

The Championships will be governed by the World Aquatics rules in force at the time of the competition.

SWIMSUITS

Swimsuits in routines must comply GR 5 y AS 13.9 A 13.12

TECHNICAL OFFICIALS

The President of CCCAN, with the recommendation from the Technical Committee for each discipline, will name the judges and referees for the championships, with the understanding that at least 90% will be provided by the host country. The CCCAN member and invited national federations can nominate up to two (2) technical officials.

It is mandatory for each participating Country to send two (2) judges. At least one (1) judge should be a World Aquatics or a Pan Am Aquatics judge who passed the World Aquatics Judges School (Schools of 2015 – 2023). These judges will have priority on the panels. Federations sending less than 2 Judges will have to pay a surcharge of \$ 500 USD per judge.

We make the call to the federations to promote being controller within their national judging corps.

- Federations that go with a delegation of 3 or less swimmers must bring at least one judge or pay a fine of \$500.00 USD.
- Federations that go with a delegation of 4 or less swimmers must bring at least two judges or pay a fine of \$500.00 USD

Technical Officials will be roomed in doubles but charged the quadruple rate for local transportation, accommodation and three (3) meals per day as indicated in this summons.

AWARDS

- A Championship trophy shall be awarded to the Country with the highest points in each age group (male and female).
- In addition, an Overall Championship trophy shall be awarded to the Country gaining the highest total points.
- Each award shall have the logo and the initials of the C.C.C.A.N., and C.C.C.A.N shall approve the design.
- First to third place shall be awarded medals gold, silver, bronze respectively, for each event in each discipline. Each medal shall have the initials of the C.C.C.A.N., and the design shall be approved by the C.C.C.A.N.
- The awards shall be presented on the awards podium as determined by the Organizing Committee in consultation with the President of C.C.C.A.N. or his nominee.
- Only the first three (3) places will go to the awards podium. The flags of the first three
 (3) places shall be raised and the anthem of the winning Country shall be played.
- For Group 1 and Group 2, the awards will be made in figures as an independent event and then the free routine which will have the result of Figures added. These two events will be awarded up to third place.
- For the figures, the qualification obtained by the athlete, awarded from 1 through 8, (complying with World Aquatics Rule AS 12.) independent of the Country where he/she belongs.
- For the free routine, the qualification obtained in the figures shall be added to the qualifications obtained in the free routine World Aquatics Rules AS12.2, AS12.3, AS13 and AS20.2.2.
- For Group 3 and 4, awards will be given separately for the technical routine as well as the Free routine.
