The 2019 Central Zone Multicultural Meet was June 8-9th in Edwardsville, IL. The host city and club did an awesome job coordinating and hosting the meet. Bob Rettle (Meet Director) and Brian Perkins (Meet Referee) demonstrated outstanding leadership throughout the process of planning and executing the meet. Thank you Bob and Brian for a great job before, during and after the meet!

We had participation from 10 of the 15 LSC's, with Team Indiana earning the Overall title with an impressive 4,314.5 pts. They also swept the Women and Men's Team titles as well. Team Illinois came in 2nd with 3,477 pts. Team Oklahoma finished 3rd Overall with 2,428.5 pts.

Proposed Changes

- 1. Including Para Time Standards & Division We will also include Para time standards as we've worked very closely with the Disability Committee at the Zone and National levels to ensure it's implemented. Jim Peterfish has been at the forefront of having the required alignment on the standards and including them into the Meet Information details. The Para Division will be scored separately with awards for each event.
- 2. Social Event The 2019 Team implemented a Social Event for Officials and Coaches. We will build this component in the plans for future meets.
- 3. Finalize Keynote Speaker Sooner We experienced a bit of difficulty in aligning the banquet speaker. We will do a better, more efficient job of securing the speaker and approving the speech ahead of the banquet.
- 4. Embracing the Inclusion Theme Ensuring that each participant, parent and guest has a memorable, unforgettable memory of the meet and banquet.
- 5. Engage the CZ D&I Chairs We will be involving the CZ D&I Chairs in the planning activities by forming task





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forces to evaluate/improve the Meet Information Packet, Banquet and Overall Meet Management & Operation.

6. Meet Promotion – We must do a much better job of reaching out to all LSC's, encouraging their participation. We will also encourage the LSC's and clubs to list the meet on their calendar and websites. Promote more proactively via social media – Instagram, Twitter, Facebook et al by creating catchy hashtags to use.

I'm really looking forward to improving the current plans for an even bigger and better 2021 CZ Multicultural Meet.
