COLLEGE RECRUITING TIMES

DIVISION 1 SWIMMING TIMES

•The minimum time standard for most D1 programs is that of <u>Futures Championships</u> cuts.

DIVISION 2 SWIMMING TIMES

•Swimming times usually match up with the <u>Speedo</u> <u>Sectional</u> cuts. The higher end D2 programs stress <u>Futures</u> <u>Championship</u> times.

DIVISION 3 SWIMMING TIMES

•<u>Speedo Sectional</u> cuts are the standard for those wanting to swim D3, but there are also roster spots open for those falling short of the cut.
