The Process:

Soph into Junior Year

- Attend a college information session at your HS, club etc.
- Set up a Premium Swimcloud account.
- Register for the NCAA Eligibility Center (D1,D2,D3)
- Reach out to your Head Coach or primary Coach.

CAST A REALISTIC NET

D1-D2-D3

- -See where you can fit in time wise.
- -Fill out an online questionnaire
- -Follow up with an email.
- -Visit Schools

Division 1:

Schools Cannot Respond Back until June 15th going into your Jr Year.

Schools Cannot have Face to Face Contact (meets/ campus) until Aug 1.

Division 2:

Schools Can Respond Back until June 1 going into your Jr Year. Schools Cannot have Face to Face Contact (meets/ campus) until Aug 1.

Division 3:

Can be in contact verbal and face to face no dates of restrictions.

Roster Limits: Division 1. (Still waiting on NCAA vs House finalizes olympic sports)

(Only if Schools are Opting into the Revenue Sharing)

Division 2 & 3 Roster Limits based on team and institution setting: a question you should ask.

Junior Year- Athletics

CAST YOUR REALISTIC NET

Price of Schools D1, D2, D3?

- Does the School offer Merit/ Academic Scholarship? (Preliminary Read)

Location of the Institution?

Fill Out questionnaire then follow up with Email with Head Coach, Assistant Coach.

Does Your Times In Season and in the postseason fit with the school?

Does Your Times Score in the conference your school competes in?

Junior Year Academics

Meet With Your HS Guidance Counselor.

Talk To Them That You Want to Swim In College

- They will make sure your Credit Courses are set up.
- Potential IB, AP classes are set up for Junior Year and Senior Year.
- Prepare to take ACT/ SAT Some schools are test optional
- Have all your HS Transcripts ready for Pre Reads
- Letters of Recommendations for Common App in Aug going into SR yr

Junior Year / Senior Year (Sep-Early Decision Process)

Attend an Official Visit- Paid trip/ Costs Paid

Attend Unofficial Visit- Tour, Junior Days, Costs Not Paid.

Questions to ask a Coach

- What is your Timeline?
- Would I score on the team?
- What are my next steps?

Procedures to be prepared for

- Show Interest.
- Aug leading into Senior you have tours and visited and communicated with your schools.
- Fill our Common APP, FASA. all forms you need to apply to college.
- Continue showing interest.

SENIOR YEAR

COMMITMENT(Final Process after Early Commitment):

2nd Wednesday in November: National Signing Day (former NLI) D1,D2. In December D3 will do letters of commitment in conjunction with school signing days as Early Decision Processes may come out by then.

Financial signing is binding. Athletic Scholarships are now 4 year Scholarships so they are guaranteed.

STILL UNDECIDED AS A SENIOR: OPTIONS ARE LIMITTETING BUT DONT PANIC

Be consistent, reach out to coaches. Especially boys.
