Jenny Holtzen followed her older sister, Sarah, into the pool and joined the Razorback Aquatic Club at age 4. She quickly found her love for swimming, with guidance from her coach, Basil Hicks.

Jenny also found success swimming for Basil, breaking several state records, some of which stand today. Jenny transitioned into her high school career with coach Scott Berry, who helped her find her love for hard work as well as success in longer races. Jenny broke more state records as a senior swimmer and found success at the junior national level.

She continued her swimming career to the collegiate level, competing for the University of Wisconsin-Madison. While swimming for the Badgers, Jenny was a named Honorable Mention All-American in the 1650 and remains on the team's Top 10 list in both the 1000 and 1650 freestyle. She also met her future husband, fellow Badger swimmer Tyler Hines. She ended her competitive career at the 2016 Olympic Trials, competing in the 800 free and 200 breast.

At the conclusion of her swimming career, Jenny immediately jumped into coaching. She currently coaches at the age group level for Ozaukee Aquatics and is the head varsity coach for both the girls and boys teams at Whitefish Bay High School outside of Milwaukee, Wisconsin. Jenny continues to compete today and has won several US Masters National titles and holds many Wisconsin Masters State Records. She is grateful to her age group coaches in Arkansas who cultivated a love for the sport that she is able to carry with her today.
