Please note: It is <u>strongly recommended</u> that Referees continue to develop their skills as a Deck Referee at a variety of meets (including LSC championship meets and prelim/final meets) and facilities <u>prior to volunteering as a Meet Referee</u> for a meet other than an intrasquad, dual, or development (see rule 205.11) meet.
