#### General Chair - Brian Toay

- 1. USA SWIMMING UPDATES
  - a. I attended the annual business meeting for USA Swimming and the Central Zone. Here are the updates from that meeting:
    - i. Club fees will increase from \$70/year to \$225/year beginning in 2025. These fees have not been increased in over 20 years.
    - ii. New Club fees will increase from \$70 to \$750 beginning in 2025.
    - iii. Recognized events for 13-14 athletes will now include the 50 breast/fly/back and motivational times will be created for those events.
    - iv. For 2025 Zones, Team ND has been assigned to the site in Rochester, MN.
    - v. Zones in 2026 will be in Minneapolis, MN and Evansville, IN.
    - vi. USA Swimming is focusing heavily on recruitment and retention of athletes as swimming competes with other youth sports.
      - 1. ND LSC should create a plan to increase awareness of the sport and focus on retention of younger athletes new to this sport.

#### Technical Chair - Jill Schlenker

- 1. As of October 13th (based on a report ran 9/16/24) we will have 14 Non-Athlete memberships that are delinquent for a various amount of reason.
- 2. As of 9/16/24 we currently have 51 Non-Athlete registrations for the 2024 2025 season. Last years end total for registration was 341.
- 3. As of 9/16/24 of our 14 clubs, 3 clubs are not in good standing as either their head coach does not have all their certifications up to date or they do not have a head coach listed. (I can make this report available to others if requested.)
- 4. As of 9/16/2024, 3 of our 14 clubs have registered for the 2024 2025 season. (AQST, BWST, MMSC.)
- 5. Clubs were informed in August that we are currently not following a state law and one of our policies about the concussion training. Therefore, I (the technical chair) will be going into the system with each persons Non-Athlete membership and keeping their date of issue however, setting all to expire 9/1/26. However, if they completed their concussion training after 9/1/24 I will be using the completion date plus two years for their expiration date.
- 6. Teams will be (or have been depending on when this is read) sent reminders to register for the season as well as making sure to get their delinquencies taken care of as soon as possible the first week of October.
- 7. Awards will need to be ordered for this year but the order will not be too big as we have used less than estimated in the last two state meets. Orders will be put in for awards in late December or Early January as we will be set for the 10 & under meet and will not need anything other than the plaques and high point awards for that meet.

#### 2. Officials Counts:

- a. Able to now view who is certified for each position, current as of 12 Oct 2024:
  - i. Referee: 26 (1 apprentice)
  - ii. Starter: 38 (4 apprentices)
  - iii. Admin Official: 29 (1 apprentice)
  - iv. Stroke and Turn: 94 (7 apprentices)
- b. Requesting that each club's officials chair email me when they have a new apprentice's starting and then also when they become approved by the applicable Meet Referee. This allows me to update OTS in a timely manner!

#### 3. ND LSC Officials Polo Shirt Inventory:

- a. Women's: 18 (various sizes)
- b. Men's: 16 (various sizes)
- c. Each newly certified official will be issued 2 shirts and then 1 after 3 years.



#### 4. **USA Swimming OTS Updates:**

a. USA Swimming has made many updates since changing the way officials are certified/re-certified following the R9 implementation on 1 February 2024. I have updated the ND LSC website (Officials Tab) with step-by-step procedures. Additionally, USA Swimming has now removed the Stroke & Turn, Admin Official, and Starter tests, due to the implementation and roll-out of the new Stroke & Turn, Admin Official, and Starter Certification Courses found on the USA Swimming Website, under the Education Tab. To access and receive credit, you will have to be registered with USA Swimming and have a log-in. These new courses take approximately one hour to complete and will be required for re-certification (every 3 years). What I can do now is LSC Bulk Recertification, which I will do for ALL Officials in December prior to their expiration.

#### 5. OQM /State Meets:

- a. Submitted the Gator IMX Challenge & Fall Meet, held November 22-24, 2024 at the Hulbert in West Fargo as an OQM to allow for up to N3 evaluations for those officials attending. Please email the Meet Referee, Paul Sjurseth (psjurseth@msn.com), if you are interested in an evaluation. Per our Policies and Procedures 7.4, the LSC will provide \$1500 each year for reimbursement of expenses related to travel, lodging, and food for the OQM evaluator. The Gators will send all receipts to the ND LSC Treasurer for reimbursement on the reimbursement form, following the meet.
- b. Sent an email to ND LSC Referees for their interest in being the Meet Referee for the 2025 Short Course State Meets and the 2025 Long Course State Meet. Thank you to those Referees who volunteered to be considered!
  - i. The following were selected as the 2025 Short Course State Meet Referees:
    - 1. 10 & Under: Jill Schlenker
    - 2. <u>11 & Over:</u> Paul Sjurseth
  - ii. Sign-up will be live to those who are interested in officiating at the State Meet on 1 November

#### 6. USA Swimming Official's Track Workshop (28 & 29 September 2024):

a. Overall great workshop, as I was able to network with the other LSC Official's Chairs and members of the National Officials Committee (NOC), plus ask some specific questions. The NOC was very excited that ND will be running a Prelim/Final Championship Meet for our 2025 Short Course State Meet. Biggest takeaway is that there are more changes coming to OTS; however, hopefully making it easier for officials.
