<b>Organization Regulations/Waivers</b>	
<b>USA Swimming Rules</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>At a sanctioned competitive event, all USA Swimming athletes must be under the supervision of a USA Swimming member coach. Arrangements for coach supervision must be made in advance of the meet.</li> <li>Any swimmer entered in the meet <u>must</u> be certified by a USA Swimming member-coach as being proficient in performing a racing start or must start each race from within the water without the use of the backstroke ledge. When unaccompanied by a member-coach, it is the responsibility of the swimmer or the swimmer's legal guardian to ensure compliance with this requirement.</li> <li>The use of audio or visual recording devices, including a cell phone, is not permitted in changing areas, rest rooms or locker rooms.</li> </ul>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Use of cameras, cell phones or any other recording device is not permitted immediately behind the starting blocks at either end of the racing course(s) during race starts, competition and warm-ups. Please refer to the Safe Sport section of the Ohio Swimming, Inc. policies and procedures for further information regarding the use of visual recording devices.</li> <li>• Deck changes are prohibited.</li> <li>• Operation of a drone, or any other flying apparatus, is prohibited over the venue (pools, athlete/coach areas, spectator areas and open ceiling locker rooms) any time athletes, coaches, officials and/or spectators are present.</li> <li>• Flash photography is not permitted at the start of any race.</li> <li>• All applicable adults participating in or associated with this meet acknowledge that they are subject to the provisions of the USA Swimming Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policy (MAAPP) and that they understand that compliance with the MAAPP policy is a condition of participation in the conduct of this competition.</li> </ul>
<b>Safe Sport 360</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The U.S. Center for Safe Sport program is a comprehensive abuse prevention program dedicated to creating a healthy and positive environment free from abuse for all its members. Components of the program include, but are not limited to, providing education and training, enforcing policies (such as the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policy), rules and best practice guidelines, promoting healthy boundaries and mandatory reporting of violations.</li> <li>• The Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policy (MAAPP) prohibits Applicable Adults (as defined) from having one-on-one interactions with minor athletes which are not within an observable and interruptible distance from another adult. <b>Ohio State Laws that are applicable to Ohio Swimming sanctioned events</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Ohio's Return to Play Law (ORC 3313.539 and ORC 3707.511) requires that coaches and referees either (1) complete a free online training once every three (3) years in recognizing the symptoms of concussion or (2) hold a pupil-activity program permit from the Ohio State Board of Education. Free online concussion training is offered through the National Federation of State High School Association and Centers of Disease Control. Training links can be found at <a href="http://www.swimohio.com">www.swimohio.com</a> under Safe Sport&gt;Concussion.</li> <li>• There will be the required number of certified lifeguard(s) on duty at all times at this meet per Ohio Administrative Code 3701-31-04-E-4.</li> </ul>
<b>Waiver/Release</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• By entering this meet, you are granting permission for the names of any or all of your team's swimmers to be published on the internet in the form of Psych Sheets, Meet Results, or any other documents associated with the running of this meet.</li> <li>• All participants agree to be filmed and photographed by the host club approved photographer(s) and videographers and to allow the right to use names and pictures before, during, or after the meet such as in public psych sheets, heat sheets, and results or featured on the host club or OSI website or social media or in public broadcast of the event via television or webcast. Parents and guardians of minor swimmers who do not wish their swimmers to participate in interviews or have individual pictures featured on any media should inform their team's head coach and the Meet Director prior to the meet.</li> </ul>

Organization Regulations/Waivers	
<b>Code of Conduct</b>	<p>Each club is responsible for the conduct of its swimmers and parents. Any person who, in the opinion of the Meet Director, Meet Referee, or Meet Marshal, is harmful to others or to other's property will be required to leave the competition.</p> <p>Any individual who exhibits a behavior of a threatening, abusive, or derogatory manner toward an official or any member of meet operations is subject to immediate removal and further expulsion from the meet. Coaches will be notified of the actions of their respective teams.</p> <p>Good sportsmanship is expected at all times. Bullying or taunting, foul language or derogatory behavior will not be tolerated and will be subject to immediate removal. All volunteers, spectators, coaches, officials and meet staff are expected to be respectful of others.</p> <p>The Ohio Swimming Code of Conduct governs this meet. The purpose of the Zero-Tolerance Code of Conduct Policy is to establish consistent expectations across the LSC in the best interest of our Athletes and Sport. Ohio Swimming is committed to creating a safe and fair environment for all of its athlete members. This policy is to be used as a guide to promote a positive environment and good sportsmanship at meets and events conducted in the geographical boundary of Ohio Swimming. <b>Spectator Information</b>	<p>UASC will communicate to the Team Coaches directly, any updates about spectator attendance. Should conditions warrant that spectators are restricted, UASC kindly asks for understanding in that decision, as it is UASC's goal to allow all athletes to participate in this Event, as competition between athletes is our utmost priority. All teams participating in this event will be expected to provide volunteers for the event. UASC has the right to remove spectators from the facility or disqualify a swimmer from competition if facility protocols are not followed by swimmers and/or their families.</p>
<b>Membership Requirement</b>	<p>All meet directors, coaches and officials serving in an official capacity at a sanctioned event must be current members of USA Swimming and should be prepared to show a current USA Swimming membership card. All persons acting in any coaching capacity in a sanctioned event must be currently certified coach members of USA Swimming.</p>

Entering the Meet	
<b>Eligibility:</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>No swimmer will be permitted to compete unless the <u>swimmer is a member as provided in Article 302. Membership will not be verified at the meet.</u></li> <li>Membership verification deadline is 12:00 pm two (2) business days before the first day of the meet. Unverified swimmers will be scratched from the meet after that deadline. There will be no refunds for unverified swimmers scratched from the meet.</li> <li>All adult athletes must hold current Athlete Protection Training certification.</li> <li>Age on the first day of the meet will determine age for the entire meet.</li> <li>Central Ohio teams who have supported UASC will be given priority to enter this meet. All other teams will be given equal priority in the event that these teams do not enter.</li> <li><b>By entering the meet visiting teams agree to supply timers</b></li> </ul>
<b>Disability Swimmers:</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Ohio Swimming welcomes swimmers with a disability.</li> <li>Entry Procedures: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Enter the USA-S swimmers with a disability electronically or on the paper entry form.</li> <li>Provide the grouping the swimmer is identified under (P1, P2, P3) and any necessary accommodations.</li> <li>List in the email with the electronic entry (or on the paper entry) the swimmer's name, entry times, based on grouping (P1, P2, P3) strokes/distances and days/sessions.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Preferred seeding is in the swimmer's age group entered event at the same distance with their equivalent non-conforming time to ensure seeding in the initial heats.</li> <li>See the Ohio Swimming Policy Book for Grouping descriptions (P1, P2, P3).</li> </ul>
<b>Entry Limits</b> <b>Entry Fees:</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Swimmers may swim a maximum of 3 individual events per day.</li> <li>\$8 per 11-18 year old individual event/ \$7 per 10 &amp; under individual event.</li> <li>\$4 OH LSC surcharge per swimmer.</li> <li>\$12 Facility Fee per swimmer.</li> </ul>

Entering the Meet	
<b>Entry Procedures:</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Entries open on Monday, January 5<sup>th</sup>, at 1pm, please do not send entries before that time. Entries submitted before that time will be placed at the end of the entries. Entries will close on Friday, January 9<sup>th</sup>.</li> <li>• Entries will be accepted in the order they are received</li> <li>• Entries must be submitted in SCY using an electronic meet entry software (Hy-Tek/Team Unify).</li> <li>• Send entries via email to: <a href="mailto:erin.reetz@gmail.com">erin.reetz@gmail.com</a></li> <li>• Please do not enter swimmers that have not achieved the qualifying standards <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ 10 &amp; under swimmers – National B times</li> <li>○ 11-18 swimmers - National BB times</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Please include the names of any Outreach swimmers in the email.</li> <li>• Checks should be made payable to: Upper Arlington Swim Club</li> <li>• The Meet Director reserves the right to limit entries, if necessary, to manage the timeline and number of competitors and spectators at each session.</li> <li>• UASC reserves the right to enter UASC swimmers in the meet that may not meet the qualifying standards.</li> <li>• There will be no registration or deck entries at the meet</li> </ul>
<b>Scratch Procedures</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• A swimmer who officially scratches from an individual event shall not have that event count towards their maximum number of events for the meet or for that day.</li> <li>• The scratch deadline for Preliminary Events and Timed Final Events will be 30 minutes prior to the start of the session where the individual or relay is contesting the event.</li> </ul>
<b>Scratching from Prelims</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Any swimmer not appearing for an individual preliminary event or timed final event, without officially scratching per meet guidelines, shall not be penalized; however, that event will be counted against their 8 event maximum for the meet and their 3 event per day maximum.</li> <li>• Any relay team that fails to appear for a pre-seeded relay event shall not be penalized.</li> </ul>
<b>Scratching from Finals</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Any swimmer listed as an original qualifier, qualifying for a consolation or championship final in an individual event who fails to compete in said final shall be barred from his/her next individual event, except as noted in 'Exception for Failure to Compete' below. A declared false start under 101.1.3F or deliberate delay of meet under 101.1.5 is not permitted and will be regarded as a failure to compete. In order to remain eligible for subsequent sessions, the swimmer must declare their intention to swim with the Administrative Referee prior to the completion of the current session</li> <li>• In the event of withdrawal or barring of a swimmer from competition the Referee shall fill the consolation or championship final, when possible, with the next qualified swimmer(s). First and second alternates shall be announced along with the final qualifiers. The alternates shall not be penalized if unavailable to compete in the finals</li> <li>• Where consolation finals have not been swum and a barring or withdrawal is known to the Referee, the Referee shall reseed the consolation and championship final, if necessary, to insert the alternate(s) in the appropriate lane(s), filling all lanes in the final.</li> <li>• If the consolation final has already been contested, the championship final shall be swum without reseeding for the empty lanes(s)</li> <li>• Failure to scratch consolation or championship finals according to the rules above shall result in a \$50.00 penalty fee per event against the swimmer if the event is his/her last event of the meet. The penalty fee shall be billed to the club and paid to the host of the meet.</li> </ul>
<b>Exception for Failure to Compete:</b>	<p>No penalty shall apply for failure to withdraw or compete in an individual event if:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The Referee is notified in the event of illness or injury and accepts the proof thereof.</li> <li>• A swimmer qualifying for a consolation or championship final race based upon the original results of the preliminaries notifies the Clerk of Course within thirty (30) minutes after the announcement of qualifiers for that race that they may not intend to compete and further declares their final intentions within thirty (30) minutes following their last individual preliminary even</li> <li>• It is determined by the Referee that failure to compete is caused by circumstances beyond the control of the swimmer.</li> </ul>

<b>Entering the Meet</b>	
<b>Warm-up and Safety Guidelines:</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The meet host will provide a complete schedule of warm-up procedures to include lane assignments and times, which must be adhered to by all participants. This information will be distributed in advance of the meet.</li> <li>• Warm-ups will be monitored jointly by the Meet Director and Meet Referee (or their special designees).</li> <li>• Except during supervised racing starts, swimmers must enter the pool feet first in a cautious manner with one hand in contact with the pool deck.</li> <li>• Ohio LSC Swimming Safety Guidelines and Warn-Up Procedures will be in effect for this meet.</li> <li>• No spectators allowed on deck.</li> </ul>
<b>Competition Guidelines:</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• This meet will be a prelim/finals and timed finals meet.</li> <li>• This meet will be contested in SCY</li> <li>• This meet will be pre-seeded. Deck entries will not be accepted at the meet.</li> <li>• We will have a Clerk of Course for 10 &amp; under events, all swimmers are expected to report to the designated location prior to their event.</li> </ul>
<b>Protest Procedure</b>	All protests must be submitted in writing within 30 minutes following the contested race to the Meet Referee or their designee.
<b>Awards:</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Top 10 individual places - medals</li> <li>• 11-20 individual places - ribbons</li> <li>• Results will not be posted during the meet. Unofficial results will be published on Meet Mobile</li> </ul>
<b>General:</b>	<p>All meet information, including notices of program changes, warm-up times and lane assignments, host club contacts, and complete meet results and computer backups will be posted on the UASC website, <a href="http://www.uasc.org">www.uasc.org</a>. Coaches and club entry chairs are responsible for checking the UASC website for changes in meeting format and final warm up times, all of which will be published on the website by 10am on the Wednesday preceding the meet.</p> <p>The Meet Director reserves the right to exclude or otherwise limit entries or alter events as follows to observe Ohio Swimming's four (4) hour session limit: Adjust session start times; Limit relay entries or eliminate relay events; Eliminate no time (NT) entries; Events longer than 200 yards may be limited to the top 30 swimmers positively checked in by the deadline announced on the day of the event Any limits and adjustments will be communicated to entry contacts by the Monday preceding the meet. Refunds will be given to those who did not swim due to entry limits.</p> <p><b>We ask that teams encourage their officials to help officiate the meet.</b></p>
<b>Safe Sport Considerations</b>	<p>Should a parent need to access a child who is on deck, the child will be brought to the parent at the pool door or in case of emergency, the parent may be escorted to the child.</p> <p>All applicable adults participating in or associated with this meet acknowledge that they are subject to the provisions of the USA Swimming Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policy (MAAPP) and that they understand that compliance with the MAAPP policy is a condition of participation in the conduct of this competition.</p>
