Meet Type:	Timed Finals – Pentathlon. Swimmers must have a legal time in all 5 events in order to compete in this meet. If your swimmer is not legal in any single stroke please do not enter them in this meet. Every swimmer will be entered in all five (5) events for their age group that day.
# of Sessions:	2 Session 1 – 10/26/2024 – Timed Finals Saturday morning warm-up is as follows: 10 & Under warm-up will be from 7:30 AM to 8:00 AM, 13-14 warm-up will be from 8:00 AM to 8:30 AM with competition starting at 8:35 a.m.
	Session 2 – 10/26/2024 – Timed Finals Afternoon warm-up will begin 15 minutes after the conclusion of the morning session. 11-12 will warm-up for the first half hour, Open will warm-up for forty minutes immediately following. If the average number of swimmers exceeds 15 per lane, warm-ups maybe adjusted. Continuous warm-up will be available in the diving well after completion of warm-up period. Afternoon start times and the final warm-up plan will be posted by October 8, 2025.
Medical Supervision available to athletes	A Meet Safety Director and lifeguards will be present to respond to an emergency or provide first aid in the event that is needed.

Organization Regul	ations/Waivers
USA Swimming Rules	At a sanctioned competitive event, all USA Swimming athletes must be under the supervision of a USA Swimming member coach. Arrangements for coach supervision must be made in advance of the meet.
	 Any swimmer entered in the meet <u>must</u> be certified by a USA Swimming member-coach as being proficient in performing a racing start or must start each race from within the water without the use of the backstroke ledge. When unaccompanied by a member-coach, it is the responsibility of the swimmer or the swimmer's legal guardian to ensure compliance with this requirement.
	The use of audio or visual recording devices, including a cell phone, is not permitted in changing areas, rest rooms or locker rooms.
	 Use of cameras, cell phones or any other recording device is not permitted immediately behind the starting blocks at either end of the racing course(s) during race starts, competition and warm-ups. Please refer to the Safe Sport section of the Ohio Swimming, Inc. policies and procedures for further information regarding the use of visual recording devices.
	Deck changes are prohibited.
	 Operation of a drone, or any other flying apparatus, is prohibited over the venue (pools, athlete/coach areas, spectato areas and open ceiling locker rooms) any time athletes, coaches, officials and/or spectators are present.
	Flash photography is not permitted at the start of any race.

Free online concussion training is offered through the National Federation of State High School Association and Centers of Disease Control. Safe Sport 360	The U.S. Center for Safe Sport program is a comprehensive abuse prevention program dedicated to creating a healthy and positive environment free from abuse for all its members. Awards:	Ribbons will be given for places 1 through 8 in the 10 & U, and 11-12 tracks. No ribbons will be awarded for the 13-14 or Open tracks. Plaques will be awarded to the top three swimmers (boys and girls) in each age group for each pentathlon track. Team Awards will be given for teams finishing 1st, 2nd and 3rd overall. All awards must be picked up at the meet. Awards will not be mailed unless specifically announced by the meet host.					
General:	Admission Cost \$5.00 per person.					
Code of Conduct:	Any individual who exhibits a behavior of a threatening, abusive, or derogatory manner toward an official or member of the meet staff is subject to immediate removal and further expulsion from the meet. Coaches will be notified of the actions of their respective teams.
