Excellence in Officiating Award: Official of the Year

The Official of the Year Award recognizes leadership, active participation and contributions to the Ohio LSC, officiating in general at a broad range of meets in multiple Ohio Commissions, professionalism and exemplary rapport with all on meet decks, achievement on National Championship decks, and advancement to N3 and/or recognition as a National Evaluator in the past year.

National Top 10 Rankings

The National Age Group Recognition Program is an awards program for the top level of age group swimmers. All times submitted to USA Swimming from sanctioned, approved or observed competition are eligible for consideration. The swimmer must have been a registered member of USA Swimming at the time of the swim.

Swimmers who are in the Top 10 in an event at the end of the season, will be awarded a certificate from USA Swimming for their accomplishments. Those who earned the top spot in their event will receive a pin from USA Swimming. In addition to individual events, age group swimmers can qualify for the Top 10 list in relays using standard age group definitions.
