All times submitted to USA Swimming from sanctioned, approved or observed competition are eligible for consideration. The swimmer must have been a registered member of USA Swimming at the time of the swim.

Swimmers who are in the Top 10 in an event at the end of the season, will be awarded a certificate from USA Swimming for their accomplishments. Those who earned the top spot in their event will receive a pin from USA Swimming. In addition to individual events, age group swimmers can qualify for the Top 10 list in relays using standard age group definitions.
