Sandy Drake became an official for USA Swimming in 1993 while living in Iowa. Besides Iowa, she has been an official in Florida, Illinois, and currently Hawaiian Swimming LSCs.

Sandy was chair of Open Water Swimming on the National Officials Committee for 8 years, member of USA Swimming Rules & Regulations committee - 4 years, Officials Chair for Hawaiian Swimming - 10 years, currently Secretary for Hawaiian Swimming, Officials Co-Chair - Illinois Swimming 2 years, and FINA Technical Open Water official – 8 years.

Selected as an International Technical OW official for 2019 World Championships – Yesou, South Korea, Head Referee 2019 Junior Pan Am Championships – Pleasant Prairie Wisconsin, and 2017 World Championships - Budapest, Hungary. Sandy has been the Meet Referee for several USA Swimming National Championships including TYR Pro Series, Junior Nationals, and Open Water Nationals. Selected to officiate 2012-deck official, 2016-chief judge, and 2021 Olympic Trials-deck referee. She has worked numerous National Championship meets beginning in 1999.

Outside of officiating, Sandy has been a coach for the Maui Dolphins Swim Club for 13 years. Owned a tutoring company for 10 years servicing all ages from 4 years old to an 84-year-old wanting to improve her English. While living on the mainland, she was a Special Education teacher working with behavior disorders.

Married for 42 years to National Team member, Kevin Drake. Raised 4 sons whom all swam and played water polo. Sandy and Kevin have been residing on Maui for 16 years.

Course Offering Descriptions

The Officials Briefing (Required)

Swimming into 2023- will be required for everyone to attend. This course will focus on LSC updates, Rule Changes, N2/N3 opportunities, and OTS updates.

The Clip Board Events

Pick at least one to attend Course Time 60-75 Minutes (Distance: 200 Yards)

AO Topic- Adventures in Meet Manager

In this session, we will look at different situations in meet manager. Including items in a Prelim / Finals Meet.

Stroke and Turn Topic-DQ Detective

We will review different stroke clips and see the legality of the strokes.

CJ Topic - CJ Masterminds

This session will discuss the importance of creating a CJ team and dividing essential tasks.

Starter Topic- Take your maaaaarrrrrkkkkks

Starting is more than "Take Your Mark." This session will focus on starting protocol and identifying false starts.

Referee Topic- I was asked to be a Meet Referee

Moving into the role of Meet Referee includes a lot of new responsibilities. We will cover the importance of this role and building CJs into any meet. (Meet Marshal)
