



Process for Selecting Meet Referee/Administrative Referee/Administrative Officials for Middle Atlantic Swimming® Championship Meets

Selecting the right officials for championship events is crucial to ensure fair competition and uphold the integrity of the championship meets. The following is a comprehensive process that Middle Atlantic Swimming® Officials Committee Chair has implemented to select the MR and AR/Lead AO for LSC championship meets.

1. Determine Event Requirements

- Identify the Number and Types of Officials Needed
 - o Meet Referee Required at all Championship Meets
 - o Administrative Referee Required at
 - SC/LC Seniors
 - SC/LC Juniors
 - LC Silvers
 - o Administrative Official Required at
 - SC Silvers (Prelims/Finals Experience Preferred)
 - SC 10 & Under

Define Roles and Responsibilities

 The duties and responsibilities of the MR and AR/AO and how they interact with each other and the Meet Director are defined in the Middle Atlantic Swimming® Standard Operation procedures for MR and AR

2. Establish Qualification Criteria

Certification Levels

- Must hold appropriate USA Swimming (USA-S) certification (DR, AR, AO) for meet/position.
- USA-S membership must be current and in good standing.

• Experience Requirements

10 & Under Meets

- Previous experience as MR/AO at a multi session, multi-team meet
- DR/AO for at least 1 year and 10 sessions
- Host Club Officials preference taken into consideration

Silvers Short Course

- Previous experience running (or shadowing) a full Prelims/Finals meet
- DR/AO for at least 1 year and 10 sessions
- Host Club Officials preference taken into consideration

Silvers Long Course

- Must have served as MR/AR at SC Silvers, Juniors or Seniors
- Selection Host Club preference taken into consideration

Juniors Short Course

- Must have served as MR/AR at SC Silvers, Juniors or Seniors
- DR/AO for at least 3 Years, 30 sessions in the role being applied for
- Prior experience using USA-S National Deck Protocol
- Selection Standard Selection Considerations
- Prior experience in 2-pool scenario preferred

o Juniors Long Course

- Must have served as MR/AR at SC Silvers, Juniors or Seniors
- DR/AO for at least 3 Years, 30 sessions in the role being applied for
- Prior experience using USA-S National Deck Protocol
- Selection Standard Selection Considerations

Seniors Short Course

- Must be at least N2 DR/AR (OQM Requirement)
- DR/AO for at least 3 Years, 30 sessions in the role being applied for
- Prior experience using USA-S National Deck Protocol
- Selection Standard Selection Considerations

Seniors Long Course

- DR/AO for at least 3 Years, 30 sessions in the role being applied for
- Prior experience using USA-S National Deck Protocol
- Selection Standard Selection Considerations

3. Open the Application Process

• Application Announcement

 Publicize the application process through official Middle Atlantic Swimming[®] channels, including the website, newsletters, and direct emails to registered officials.

• Application Materials

 Provide a standardized application form requesting information on certifications and experience.

Submission Deadlines

Clearly state the opening and closing dates for applications to ensure timely processing.

• Standard Online Application Form

- o Name, USA-S Membership ID
- Position Applying for
- Location(s) for all meets official is willing to work
- Would official like to shadow a MR or AR?
- o Is official's team a Host Club?
 - Which meet(s)?
- o Does official have previous experience running a multi-session multi-team meet?
 - How Many? Which one(s)?
- How Long has official been certified as DR/AO?
- O How many sessions has official worked in the last year?
- o Is official committed for all sessions including tech meeting and other zoom meetings?
- List any National Certifications official holds.

4. Assemble a Selection Team

- Selected by Officials Committee Chair
- Term is one year (1 Short course, 1 Long course)
- Makes recommendation to Officials Committee Chair for approval
- Recommendation shall be presented to the Officials Committee Chair by 11/15 for SC and 4/15 for LC
- Officials may not participate in selection process/discussion for the meet(s) for which they are applying
- Members of the Selection Team
 - Officials Committee Chair Non-Voting Breaks Ties
 - LSC Executive Director designee
 - Previous MR, Silvers and Above (Non- Officials Committee member)
 - o Previous AR/AO, Silvers and Above (Non- Officials Committee member)
 - 2 Current Officials Committee members
 - Previous Meet Director, Silvers and Above

5. Evaluate Applications

- Review Qualifications
 - o Verify certifications, experience, and compliance with all requirements
- Review Standard Selection Considerations
 - Availability
 - Commitment to attend all sessions (including tech meeting)
 - Willing to travel
 - National Certification
 - N2
 - N3
 - MASI Meet Experience
 - Number of sessions worked locally as DR/AO (Prelim/Final except for 10 & Under)
 - MR Number of sessions at position other than DR
 - USA-S Meet Experience
 - Experience at Zone meets & above
 - Diversity and Representation
 - Encourage opportunities that represent the LSC community
 - o Professionalism
 - Demonstrated ability to work with other key meet personnel
 - Clear and communication skills on and off pool deck

6. Selection and Notification

Primary Selections

- Choose officials who best meet the criteria and needs of the championship meet.
- o If necessary, Officials Committee Chair will solicit qualified applicant(s) for open position(s).
- If this process does not produce enough qualified applicants, Officials Committee Chair may assign official(s) to fill open position(s).

Notification

- Send official communication via email to all applicants regarding their selection status
 - Officials Selected/Assigned
 - Provide details about the next steps
 - Send Middle Atlantic Swimming® Standard Operating Procedures for MR/AR
 - Officials Not Selected
 - Make recommendations for further experience
 - Encourage shadowing at championship meets
