

# **2022 USA Swimming Annual Business Meeting**

## **USA SWIMMING BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING**

### **SAFE SPORT UPDATES – Liz Hahn**

Safe Sport Recognition Program (SSRP) 64% of clubs engaged in the USA Swimming Safe Sport process, 22% are SSRP and 42% are in process.

US Center for SafeSport have conducted a series of audits across different sports and NGBs. SafeSport has been fully engrained in USA Swimming's culture. Recommendation is that an additional staff member would be present moving forward when rub downs / massages are in process in addition to the existing MAAPP compliance which is in place.

Real Response Reporting – the anonymous reporting process is working well.

New Staff Members – two additional members have been added to the SS team and will be the primary point of contact for reports that come into the SS department.

Joel Shinofield announced that Abby Howard will be departing USA Swimming following the ABM to assume a new role at West Point.

### **USA SWIMMING CREDENTIALING POLICY**

MSA: to Approve USA Swimming's Credentialing Policy to include in the Policy Manual. Will memorialize the current practice.

### **INDIVIDUAL DUES**

MSA: Recommendation to pause of increases in individual membership dues following the ten-year plan of \$2 per year. A freeze in fee increases may permit USA Swimming to focus more so on growth of the developmental side of the sport. A final increase will be considered at the 2022 HOD in regard to the Seasonal Membership. There will be some additional discussion regarding club dues and what that may look like moving forward.

### **ATHLETES' ADVISORY COUNCIL**

Caitlin Leverenz Smith introduced the members of the AAC

The AAC have ensured compliance with the Ted Stevens Amateur Sports act and the UPOC Bylaws by representing all athletes. The AAC utilized weighted voting to maintain the required 33 1/3% membership requirement for the newly formulated HOD. The ongoing challenges of ongoing education on what the AAC is, what the role is, what their engagement would look like.

AAC created effective feedback cycle to National Team Staff. The AAC continue to work collaboratively with the AEC (Athlete Executive Committee) to better represent all athletes. Priorities for 2022 and beyond include: continuing to ensure athlete voice with 33 1/3% athletes on committees and working groups AND effectively bringing the athlete voice to the Board of Directors. Tim Hinchey spoke about the potential opportunities for engagement between the AAC and the USA Swimming Foundation Board moving forward.

### **COACH ADVISORY COUNCIL**

Jamie Bloom and Tim Bauer were introduced to present some suggestions for the Board's consideration.

Tim started by complimenting the AAC.

Tim outlined that most coaches are passionately opinionated and open to providing feedback. Tim outlined the process to date, soliciting and collating feedback. A goal of the CAC will be to ensure appropriate coach representation on the Senior Committee, AG Development, Risk Management etc.

**JUNIOR COACH MEMBERSHIP** is an area that is critical to support clubs and coaches, essentially creating an apprentice role, eliminate:

The age restrictions and go to 16 and over

USADA requirement

CPR requirements as they will always be under the supervision of a certified coaching member,  
STSC In-Water Requirements

### **ZONE DIRECTOR COUNCIL**

Pam Lowenthal (CZ Non-Coach Director) and Ryan Gibbons (SZ Athlete Director) introduced the ZDC and reviewed the mission statement of the ZDC – being that connectivity between NATIONAL and the MEMBERS. Pam outlined efforts to provide a comparable competitive experience for athletes across all four zones for the athletes and families at the grass roots of the sport. The Sectional Business Manual remains a work in progress. The ZDC reiterated the necessity for a collaborative effort with the CAC, AAC and other committees. Ryan outlined the goal make the ZDC an increasingly valuable asset for the sport. Essentially by becoming proactively responsive, the ZDC can become a catalyst for change, a supportive tool accessible to the board, staff and committees. Ryan stated a critical component for this to be successful in ongoing transparent communication and idea sharing from of the stakeholders – the creation of institutionalized communication.

## LONG-TERM STRATEGIC PLANNING

End 1.1: Develop plans to account for potential evolutions of the NCAA related services

Ends 1.2 & 1.3: Address long-term membership growth, recognizing intention of attracting more and diverse swimmers to the sport and ensuring club viability, sufficient access to water to meet future demand growth.

End 1.4: Develop long-term and holistic approaches to risk management and opportunity investment.

Concerns were shared re: the ongoing challenges with the changing scenery of conference realignment and diminishing collegiate competitive opportunities.

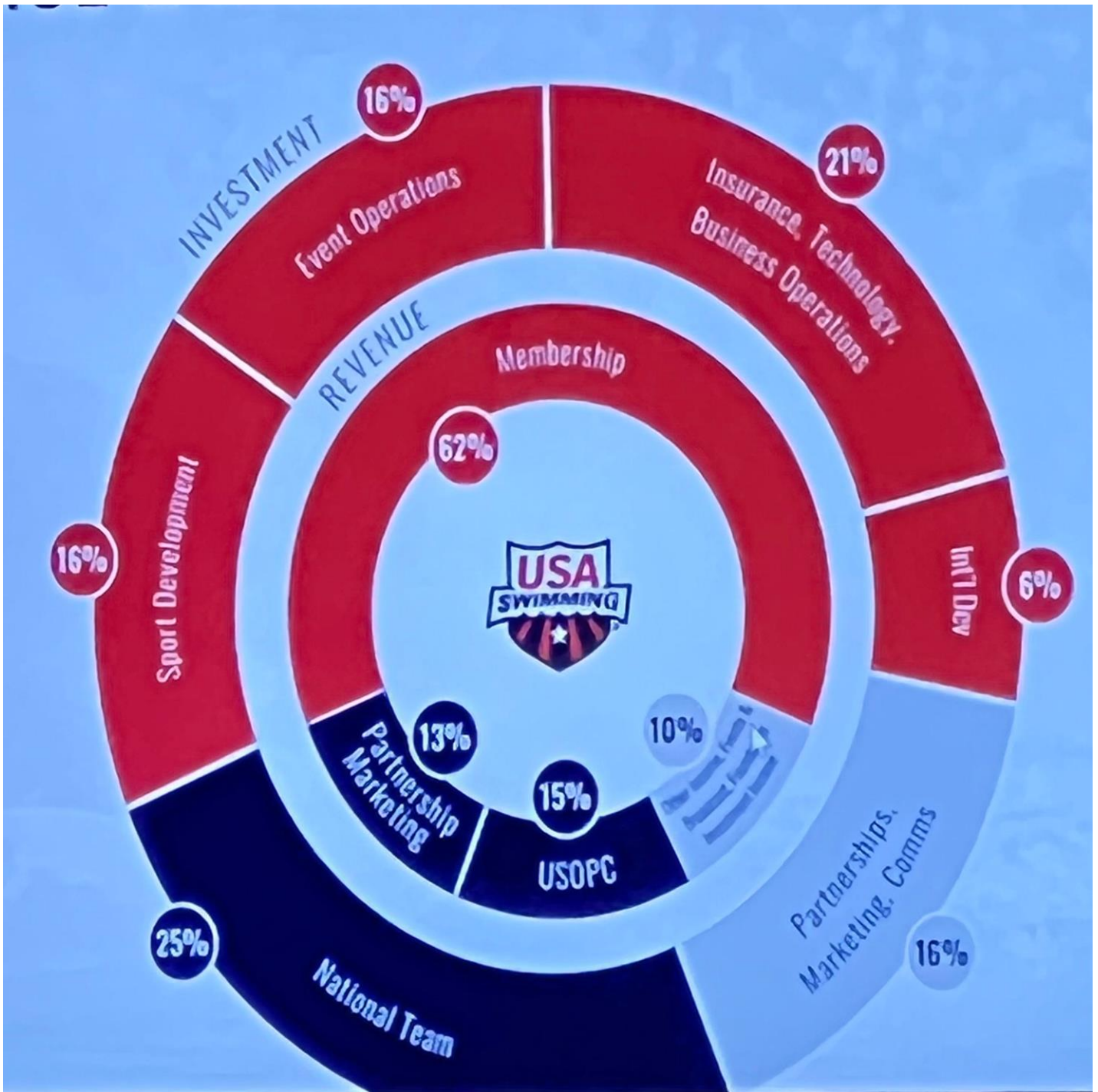
