Letter from your Officials' Chairperson – Judy Sharkey

Hope everyone had an enjoyable holiday season. The first half of the short course season has gone rather well with a few interruptions. We will still see some interruptions during the championship season whether it is no spectators or limited number of swimmers. Please follow all the guidelines as set forth by the venue you are visiting and please stay safe. As we approach championship season, I hope everyone will be able to assist our Meet Referees and attend at least one or two of our championship meets. If you haven't registered for 2022, please consider doing so as soon as possible.

During championship meet we inevitably see some disabled swimmers. Please review Article 105 of the rule book concerning disabled swimmers. Remember we judge the swimmer the same as you would any other swimmer except for the modifications given that swimmer for their disability. The swimmer is responsible for notifying the Referee, prior to the competition of any needed modification.

We will be offering clinics in the Spring. These include Stroke and Turn, Chief Judges, Starter and Referee. Please keep an eye on the NJ Swimming website for the dates and times of these clinics.

Registration Reminder and Process for 2022 – Ed Miller

It's not too late time to renew your USA-S membership and your official's credentials for 2022. Please note that there is one significant change for this year. You can now pay your dues electronically if you wish.

To still register for 2022, please read this summary and reference the information on the Becoming an Official link on the NJ Swimming Officials' Page website.

If you choose to pay electronically, go to the NJ Swimming website (www.njswim.org) and click on Forms Central. Scroll down the page to Officials and select Pay on Line. Then enter the required data and follow the payment instructions. When you have registered, print out a copy of the receipt and include it with the other documents required below. Including the receipt will greatly speed up the processing for your new cards.) Please be aware that electronic payment does not update your credentials; that only happens when you receive your updated NJS Official's card.

To pay by check, follow the above instructions but select Pay by Check. Print out and complete the membership application. Attach your check and send it to your trainer or Ed Miller, as appropriate.

For all, please print out your report from OTS or make a copy of your meet record card/sheet showing your sessions worked during 2021 and enclose it with the other documents. In view of the cancellation of many Spring and Summer meets due to the pandemic, the Officials' Committee has agreed to relax the session requirements for renewal again for this year. If you worked at least half of the required sessions (e.g., three sessions for a stroke & turn judge), that will be accepted as meeting the minimum sessions requirement for renewal. If you are still short, you may be able to meet the requirement by working some sessions this fall.

If this was your year to take a clinic and test, please see below for additional opportunities provided and follow the instructions of your clinic instructor.

If you need an updated background check, please do so before submitting your renewal paperwork. That makes it much easier for the NJS Office to complete your USA-S registration and get your new USA-S membership card to you more quickly. As with the background check, if you need to complete the athlete protection course, do so before submitting your paperwork as well.

For both the background check and the Athlete Protection courses, go to the USA-S web page (www.usaswimming.org/officials), scroll down the page and click on the icon for either the BGC or the APT. You do not have to submit completion certificates for the BGC or APT, as the results are automatically entered into your file.

Please wait until you have all the necessary paperwork together to send your materials to me. Also, please do not e-mail some of the paperwork and mail the rest. Send your completed paperwork to Ed Miller, at 140 Concord Street, New Milford, NJ 07646.

Do not send your paperwork to the NJS office. That slows down the process as they have to then send the paperwork to me, and during the crunch time, they rightly work on the athletes first, so your paperwork can sit for some time.

What is an OQM (Officials Qualifying Meet) - by Raymond Wong

An OQM (Officials Qualifying Meet), are meets that primarily allow officials to gain a higher level of knowledge through mentoring and evaluation while becoming familiar with national deck protocols providing increase consistency across LSCs. Through evaluation and certification, recognizing those officials who have demonstrated their knowledge of swim officiating at each level and position the ability to serve on the national decks. N2 and N3 national certifications are usually offered at these meets. Officials looking to work at any national meets 2 stars and up, you will need to obtain at least an N2 or even N3 certifications (depend on meet level). Officials who are interested in obtaining an evaluation for an N2 or N3 will need to work at least 4 sessions with 3 sessions being evaluated by a national evaluator. Once an application is submitted with an approved for advancement evaluation, officials can work on national deck that required N2 or N3 requirements. Such certification may also require a combination of several things including the evaluation, local participation at meets, continuing education, and the training and mentoring of other officials.

New Jersey Swimming is currently looking into providing a few OQM meets within the state each year. This will give some of our NJ officials the opportunity to advance to N2 or N3 without needing to travel out of state while providing these educational and mentoring opportunities. National Evaluators could be brought in to further assist with mentoring. This will be a great chance for those that would like to gain additional knowledge with travel restrictions while increasing the service we provide to the NJ swimming community.

The last OQM offered in New Jersey was the 2019 LC Summer Eastern Sectionals. Stay tuned, as more information to come on which meet will be our next OQM.

Other Swimming Meets Opportunities

Another area of service for officials is the Para Swimming community. Para Swimmers compete under the same FINA guidelines with some adaptions at either separate meets or included in USA swimming meets. Those adaptions can be found in your USA Swimming rule book in Article 105. However, the general rule that if a body part is absent or cannot be used, it is not judged; if it is used during the stroke or kick, it should be judged in accordance with the USA Swimming Rules & Regulations. Judgments should be made based on the actual rule —not on the swimmer's technique. Please read the entire section so that you are prepared for future possibilities. U.S. Paralympics swimming is continuing to run virtual online clinics with the next opportunity in February. These clinics are for any officials who are interested in learning more about Paralympics Swimming and/or just a refresher since it has been so long since any of us have been at a pool.
