II. Milestones prior to start of season

April/May

- Set tentative meet schedule with area teams and region teams
- Each team can schedule a maximum 8 meets including the Region meet
- Pick team suit
- Design/order team caps: remember, swimmers must wear uniform caps at meets
- Check with Athletic Director (AD) to ensure that high school joins SCACA and YOUR SCSCA association

July

- Attend SCACA (South Carolina Athletic Coaches Association)/SCHSL Rules and -Regulations
 Meeting
- Attend SCSCA (South Carolina Swim Coaches Association) meeting!!
- Be sure to provide your email address to SCSCA to receive important emails about the upcoming season etc.
- Take NFHS (National Federation of High Schools) certification courses

III. Prior to 1st Contest/Meet

- Obtain copy of SCHSL State Automatic/Consideration Times

IV. During Season

- For each meet: it is recommended that the home team confirm in writing the parameters for each meet.

- Each meet must have a certified Starter and Meet referee.
- Each meet must have at least two stroke/turn judges
 Contact your District referee to ensure that you have certified referees conducting your
 Home meets. Failure to have certified referees at your meets will cause your swimmers' times to not qualify to be submitted and posted to the South Carolina High School Swimming State meet rankings.
