

WHY POOLS & GLASS DON'T MIX

Not only is broken glass on a pool deck a safety concern for the barefoot users walking around, glass is nearly invisible when it's in the pool, and can present a very real danger to swimmers.

SAFETY CONCERNS FOR BROKEN GLASS

- Broken glass can puncture bare skin on the pool deck or in the water
- Broken glass can be inadvertently ingested while swimming or get in a swimmer's eye
- Broken glass can cause damage to filtration systems

THE COST OF GLASS BREAKING IN/NEAR THE POOL

Since glass is virtually invisible once it enters the water, the only way to ensure all broken glass is thoroughly removed is to **DRAIN** and **CLEAN** the pool. That means draining **HUNDREDS** of **THOUSANDS** of gallons of water at the cost of **TENS** of **THOUSANDS** of dollars; a very slow process that means closing down the pool and canceling programs for a minimum of **TWO WEEKS**.
