Thirty-eight Channel Cat swimmers traveled to the CUDA Christmas Invite Dec. 6th and 7th in Wenatchee and what a splash they made! Channel Cats not only won the meet (and we were way out numbered by the host team), we also brought home 4 high point trophies and 164 new best times. **Olivia Gillett, Matt Lanzara, John Markillie** and **Tallie Mortensen** competed as Channel Cats for the first time as well. Welcome and way to go!

Ryan and Scott Francis were high point winners for the boys 9-10 and 13-14 year olds and for the girls, **Megan O'Leary** (13-14) and **Jenna Mehlenbacher** (15 & over) earned high point honors. Congrats and nice job swimmers!

Some of our swimmers had some great time drops as well...Adin Anderson dropped over 22 seconds in the 100yard breaststroke and over 12 sec. in the 100 fly. Delaney Anderson dropped over 11 seconds in her 100 fly as well. Courtney Comrie dropped 12 seconds in her 100 fly while Makaylah Ferrito dropped over 23 seconds in her 100 yard breaststroke and over 18 seconds in the 50 fly! Scott Francis dropped over 16 seconds in the 100yd. breaststroke and **Jillian Hendry** crushed her best time in the 200yd free by over 20 seconds! Elizabeth McCarthy took off over 11 seconds in her 100yd. fly while Gabby Villareal dropped over 15 seconds in her 200yd. breaststroke. Channel Cats were just on fire! Cole Westendorf and Porter Withers both dropped a bunch of time too. Cole dropped a whopping 17 seconds off his 50yd. butterfly and **Porter** dropped over 10 seconds in his 100yd. IM. That's some great swimming Channel Cats...I'd call that kind of swimming a great success!

Four Channel Cat swimmers attended the **Jingle Bell Splash** in Moscow, Idaho the same weekend as the Cuda meet. No coaches were sent to this meet but results show that **Hailey Murphy** qualified for the Washington State Senior Champs in Federal Way by dropping time in her 100yd. butterfly! **Blair Murphy** dropped time in the one event she swam and **Claire Schaef** whooped up dropping time in 8 out of her 10 events and nabbing two new team records!! Congrats swimmers on a very nice job!

WA State Senior Champs – We had guite the adventure going to Federal Way the weekend before Christmas. Eighteen swimmers were signed up for the meet. Three swimmers decided not to attend before even leaving for the West side. We drove over there Thursday morning hoping to swim the 1,000 freestyle that night. We found out that the King County Aquatic Center (KCAC) had closed the pool, and that events for Thursday had been cancelled. Then Thursday evening we got word that they cancelled Friday's events as well. I spoke with the meet director Thursday evening and asked her to let me know as soon as possible on Friday if they were going to cancel the meet all together so we could check out of the motel and head for home. Friday morning we took the kids around the corner to the Super Mall there in Auburn. We ate lunch and had still not heard from the meet director by 1:00pm so we decided to check out of the motel and head for home. We started driving home on Highway 18 when I got a call from the meet director telling me that the pool would be open on Saturday, and there would be swimming. The three car caravan pulled off the road in North Bend and I let everyone know that the meet would be happening on Saturday. At that point one car with six swimmers decided to continue home to the Tri-Cities. The other two cars, with nine swimmers, turned back around and headed back to the motel to check back in. After a few calls to some coaching friends, I secured a practice at Mt. Ranier High School so the swimmers could get in and practice Friday afternoon. Saturday we arrived at the KCAC and each swimmer was allowed to swim three events in a time trial format. We finished up about 2:30pm, and quickly got loaded up and made our way across Snoqualmie Pass to beat the oncoming storm. It was guite the adventure! But it taught the athletes that you can't always have things go perfect and sometimes you have to deal with adversity.

Our Upcoming IMX / 10 & Under Meet: Call for Volunteers

Our team is hosting the **IES 10 and Under Championship and IMX Extreme Challenge** (an Invitational meet) on the weekend of January 24 - 25, 2009. This is a call for your sign-ups for positions that are needed to host the meets. The timeline is approximately as follows:

Saturday, January 24	Sunday, January 25
7 am – Parents needed for setup	7 am – facility open
9 am – Concessions & Hospitality set up.	9 am – Concessions & Hospitality set up.
10 am – Warm-up begins; Meet Marshals needed; set up completed	10 am – Warm-up begins; Meet Marshals needed; set up completed
11 am – 10 & Under Meet starts – Positions: Head Timer, Lane timers, Timing Console Operators, Announcers, Clerk of Course, Office staff, Officials	11 am – IMX Meet starts – Positions: Head Timer, All Lane timers, Timing Console Operators, Announcers, Clerk of Course, Office staff, Officials
5 pm (estimated) End of 10& Under Champ Meet Warm-up for IMX meet begins; Meet Marshals needed.	5 pm (estimated) End of Meet; All needed for equipment
6 pm: Start IMX Meet	removal, pack-up and facility clean-up (takes about 1 hour)
Positions include Head Timer, ALL lanes timed by TCCC, Timing Console, Announcers, Office Staff, and Officials.	

Needed Positions:

- Equipment / Facility Set Up: 10 people.
- ♣ Head Timers : Two per meet, per day rotate on/off
- Lane Timers:
- ♣ For 10 & Under Meet; 10 15 in order to cover assigned lanes
- For IMX Meet 32 positions to cover on Saturday / 64 on Sunday: the host team is fully responsible for timers when hosting an invitational. (Note: We will call for volunteers from visiting teams, but need to be prepared to cover all slots as the host.)
- Concessions: 5 people and a leader: Concessions are limited to pre-packaged foods and canned/bottled drinks. Coffee and hot water included. Will set up in Aquatic Center Lobby.
- Will sell Heat Sheets
- ♣ Hospitality: 3 5 people including leader:
- ♣ Providing food for coaches and officials in the equipment room just off the pool deck.
- ♣ Announcers: 3 people rotate throughout the meets.
- ♣ Console Operators: 2 5 people; with experience and willing to train.
- ♣ Clerk of Course: 2 people for the 10 & Under Meet: assisting the 25 yard swimmers in line up per heats.
- ♣ Office Staff: As coordinated and lead by our Administrative Referee, Kari Weinman.
- Officials: As coordinated and lead by our Meet Referees, Jerry Bennett (IMX Meet) and Doug Wertz (10 & Under Meet)
- Meet Marshals: 2 people for each warm-up period: will provide for safety observation (do not have to be officials).

As a team, the Channel Cats have a great reputation for hosting well run meets. The reputation has been earned by folks such as you who have given your time unselfishly. Most of these positions don't require training, just a can-do attitude; proper instruction will be provided in lane timing, and for the head timers, and the repetition takes care of itself. Announcing can be a little intimidating, but as with all jobs, is a lot of fun. We do expect that people work multiple jobs....serving as a lane timer in addition to some other task. Bottom line, the adage, "many hands make light work" rings so true in this situation.
