House Of Delegates Report

As the team's representative to the Inland Empire Swimming (IES) House of Delegates, I attended the semi-annual meeting, held at the **brand-spank'in-new**, **awesome**, **community/aquatic center in Coeur D'Alene**, **Idaho** on Saturday, October 3rd, 2009. I don't want to tell you about the aquatic center because you'd probably break down in tears, knowing what opportunities we are missing in the Tri-Cities without one....but, if you really care about it, you will email, write, attend meetings etc., to let your respective city governments know where you stand.

But I digress, the fall HOD meeting always follows the USAS Convention, which was held in Chicago this year. **Hot topics** from the convention included: 1) Swimsuit regulation changes – the same as already described / promulgated via email to the club 2) an emphasis on USA's development and growing interest in Open Water Swimming – IES encourages clubs to get involved/host events, etc. 3) and award of the 2010 Western Zone Meet to San Jose, CA, to be held August 10-14, 2010. There was also discussion regarding the development of a Senior Western Zone Meet, location and date to be determined.

As for IES, we had a pretty good Olympic Year bounce with an overall membership increase of 25%. Meet attendance was up across the board, with good participation by the "West Side" in our summer meets. Also, IES swimmers had a great result at the Western Zone meet in Hawaii.

We will soon have another member club in IES – the Baker Swim Club (Oregon) has applied for membership in the Inland Empire, a request that was approved by the HOD. Similar to Pendleton and La Grande Swim Teams, Baker will enjoy improved competitive swimming opportunities in a Local Swim

Committee that has similar demographics. On that note, there was an appeal to all Inland Empire teams to seriously consider attending one or two of the meets offered by our new member clubs. Admittedly, people are used to attending the same meets each year, and in the spirit of greater growth and opportunity, the organization should support the new member clubs.

The HOD also approved the annual budget, with one addition; which was to extend swimmer support to our disability swimmers and their attendance to national meets. Elections included two positions – the Senior Swimmer Chair, to which Coach Todd was elected, and the Coaches Representative position, to which Kevin Wong (SWAT) was elected.



This year is the year where USAS provides support in the form of speakers and workshops on all topics. This is a great opportunity for parents and swimmers alike. Please plan to attend. Loren Eddy (husband of Coach Karen), the IE Club Development Representative, presented awards for the Toyota Virtual Team Challenge. You can read more about this at the USAS website, but basically your swimmers earn points based on their times in designated strokes that comprise the Individual Medley. While awards for improvement went to La Grand and Spokane Waves Swim Clubs, it was noted that **TCCC ranks in the top 200 teams nationwide in this competition!**

Two other awards were presented to our own this year: **Todd Stafek was awarded Coach of the Year and yours truly was named as Official of the Year.** In many areas, TCCC continues to lead the way in the Inland Empire, through the combined efforts of the team swimmers, coaches and parents. I encourage all of you to continue in your support of the team by volunteering at events and projects, and keeping your swimmers healthy and motivated throughout the year.

Going to your first meet?

All right! If you want to know what events you are swimming, check the bulletin board outside the pool or ask your coach. Check your paperwork for your warm-up times and PLEASE BE ON TIME! When you arrive at the meet, you will be able to purchase a "Heat Sheet" for \$5-7 that will list start times for all of your events. Most of all have FUN!
