Webcasting – PK – at this point we do not have a sponsor for the webcasting (\$800/day for a "bare bones" webcast). SM - This is a non-budgeted item and if we go forward, it will have to be included in some divisional budget. PK - there are some options - not covering all sessions, etc. ML - Feels that Illinois Swimming should abandon this idea and time could be better spent soliciting sponsorships for other areas. KM- Athletes who do not make the

meet, do watch the meet. We are in an electronic age and this is another way to showcase our athletes. PK – not a continuous viewership. SM- Please forward any potential sponsors to Pete

Athlete Banquet – PK – Looking to tie the banquet in with the Spring HOD .. possibly a brunch on Sunday AM. Concern would be the number of participants. A stand-alone event with a guest speaker on a Saturday is also an option. Speedo noted that the HOD weekend is a Grand Prix weekend. A weekend in May could be a better option, possibly Memorial Day weekend. BM – participation on a Fri/Sat of Memorial Day weekend could be a challenge. SM – Holiday weekend isn't ideal, but it is a meet-free weekend. MLAU- Memorial Day weekend is not a good travel weekend. SM –

Make-a-Splash – PK- Breaking news – Chicago will be hosting a stop on the 'Make a Splash' tour. Illinois Swimming will take an active role in that event. June 12-14, 2015. SM – Forward ideas to Pete on how ISI can become involved and take advantage of this opportunity.

Doping practice – Something we need to be aware of? ML – Increasing the number of tests is something USA is working on. All foreign athletes are subject to testing when there are in the USA. (WADA USADA) New rule coming that will prohibit any USA swimming member from associating with someone who is under suspension.

Qualifying concerns and the impact on our national events. ML – procedure – qualifying time standard in a FINA-approved event. FINA has restricted the number of qualifying events a Federation can offer (4). We (USA) submit up to about 20 different events. Therefore, all of our Grand Prix meets will not be able to receive FINA approval. KM- What is the impetus for the controls? ML – Unknown ... 190 events in Europe .. someone thought that was too many. March 1st begins the qualifying period.

Illinois Swimming Feb 2015 Financial Report

Balance Sheet:

Assets totaled \$1,044K as of Feb 28, 2015. On a year over year basis, assets increased by \$45K or 4.5%. The change was driven by increases in cash balances (+\$32k) and accounts receivables from sponsors (+\$16k).

The AEF balance at 2/28/15 was \$634K which is \$134K above the principal contributions to the fund. The fund's charter does not permit distributions when its balance is at, or below, the level of principal contributions, i.e. only earnings are available for withdrawal.

Income:

Our year to date operating income is \$171K; however, the bulk of our programing, including club support, championship meets and camps, has yet to commence. Earnings in the AEF have totaled \$22,331 thru Feb '15. It is important to note, if the current level of earnings persists, Illinois Swimming may not have the volume of earnings in the AEF to fund Club Support at the level that was used in its'15 plan.

In the accompanying financial statements the Feb '15 revenues and YTD revenues are overstated by \$10,896 due to the inclusion of the disputed withholding of 12% of the meet entry fees from regional hosts. The correction has been made in March with the funds being sent to the clubs.

Based upon the last membership report received, reflecting numbers thru January '15, membership levels are projected to be below our budget by 500-800 resulting in a potential revenue deficit of \$5k-\$8k vs budget.

Unfortunately, in the accompanying financial statements QuickBooks has not yet been updated by our staff to reflect the '15 budget adopted by the Fall House of Delegates. The Executive Director of Illinois swimming, who has the direct responsibility for the production and review of the financial statements, was notified of the obvious and glaring deficiency in our records at the November Board meeting but has neglected to remediate the problem.

Reserves:

Based upon our current cash position of \$382K we have adequate cash reserves to cover approximately 13 months of budgeted general and administrative expenses.

 - Updated information from USA swimming Rules and Regulation :DECK CHANGING INFORMATION

At the 2014 USA Swimming House of Delegates meeting, the House passed R-9 which changed the sanctioning requirement for meets:

202.2 REQUIREMENTS FOR SANCTION — Sanctions are issued, withheld or withdrawn in accordance with the following regulations:

- .1-.8 [no changes]
- .9 Application for sanction must be accompanied by a copy of the complete meet announcement which must include the following:

A-H [no changes]







The following statement: "Changing into or out of swimsuits other than in locker rooms or other designated areas is prohibited."

The Rules and Regulations Committee, working in conjunction with the Safe Sport Committee, Athletes' Executive Committee and Officials' Committee agreed on the following definition of "Deck Changing":

Deck Change - Changing, in whole or in part, into or out of a swimsuit (excluding a drag suit) in an area other than a permanent or temporary locker room, bathroom, changing room or other space designated for changing purposes while at a practice, competition, or other pool-related activity.

It is important to note that although the House changed the wording in article 202.2.9.I to "prohibit" deck changing, it had the opportunity to <u>but did not</u> specify a penalty for a swimmer performing a deck change. We are put in a position where LSCs and officials are left with no direction regarding what, if any, penalty should be levied against an athlete observed deck changing. The risk here is that there will be varying degrees of enforcement of 202.2.9.I. In the first three months of this year we have seen exactly that.

It is the consensus of the Rules and Regulations, Safe Sport, Athletes' Executive and Officials' Committees that the preferred approach to dealing with deck changing is to view the change in 202.2.9.I as the House's desire for a paradigm shift regarding deck changing: what was once considered acceptable is now unacceptable in the sport. Our focus should be on educating our members that deck changing is not acceptable and can put our athletes at risk. The consensus of these committees is that LSCs should be encouraged not to adopt a punitive approach to enforcing this provision of our rules but rather work collaboratively with coaches to stop instances of deck changing across the sport.

The following is provided for LSCs consideration:

- 1. Officials' eyes should be on the pool not looking for swimmers who might be deck changing.
- 2. Should deck changing be observed, officials should not attempt to intervene to stop it, but rather note the gender and team of the swimmer as well as the location of the deck change. Report this information to the Referee when time permits. The Referee should work with the Meet Director and/or facility staff to communicate with the coach of the swimmer(s) that were deck changing. This communication should provide the information and ask for the coach's cooperation to get the swimmers to change in the designated areas in the facility.
- 3. Meet Directors and Referees should ensure that the Meet Marshalls and host facility staff are aware that swimmers should only be changing in designated changing facilities. Meet Marshalls and facility staff should not intervene directly with swimmers that are deck changing; rather, they should note the gender and team of the swimmer as well as the location of the deck change and deal directly with the coach in question.
- 4. If the coach of the swimmer(s) is uncooperative regarding requests to comply with getting swimmers to change in the designated changing areas, report details of the instance to the LSC Safe Sport Chair and General Chair for follow-up.

Hopefully this guidance provides LSCs, coaches, officials, athletes and their families a starting point for a discussion on how we can effect increased athlete safety and security by eliminating deck changing in our sport







Safe Sport Updates-

The first Safe Sport webinar of 2015 took place on Wednesday, Jan. 14. The webinar shared the vision and plans for Safe Sport this year. Dr. Roch King, Assistant Professor of Athletic Coaching Education at West Virginia University and long-time swim coach, also shared his experience and tools of creating a positive team culture. Dr. King's expertise provided a snapshot of how to implement a culture of Safe Sport at the club level and showcased the benefits for coaches, athletes, officials and parents. Safe Sport Leadership Conference Information:

The 2015 Safe Sport Leadership Conference: This conference was a huge success. The conference took place from Feb. 8-10 in Colorado Springs, Colorado. There were more than 150 attendees including USA Swimming members that traveled from around the country representing many LSCs and clubs. The conference focused on Safe Sport at the local level with the objective of providing attendees with tools to help create a culture of safety at their club or LSC. The conference began with a powerful keynote address from Danielle Bostick, a former swimmer and sexual abuse survivor. Other presentations included topics of effective hiring practices, facility risk management and crisis management. Illinois swimming will have the forms on the Illinois new website under Safe Sport once it goes live.

LSC Safe Sport Chairs Workshop: This workshop is meant for members that are serving in the Safe Sport Chair/Coordinator role in their LSC. The workshop will take place in Denver on the weekend of June 6-7. The two-day workshop will parallel the theme of education in Safe Sport this year, providing attendees with tangible takeaways to promote and engage Safe Sport in their Clubs, LSCs and Zones. Stay tuned for more details.

One of the topics covered at the Safe Sport Leadership Conference was the difference between bullying and conflict. Taking the next step in creating a culture of safety, USA Swimming hosted more than 150 USA Swimming members and NGB representatives at the second 2015 Safe Sport Leadership Conference, Feb. 8-10 at the Colorado Springs Marriott.

Featuring tangible, actionable tools that can be easily implemented at the LSC and club levels throughout the country, the conference covered topics such as effective hiring practices, risk identification and crisis management.

"The 2015 USA Swimming Safe Sport Leadership Conference was a seminal moment for our program and the swimming community," said Susan Woessner, USA Swimming's Safe Sport Director. "The response to the conference has been overwhelmingly positive and attendees left feeling empowered with tools and information to foster positive sport culture in their club, LSC, NGB or organization. We are so grateful to the presenters who shared their time and expertise to make our sport a safer environment for all."

The three-day conference began with a keynote address from Danielle Bostick, a former swimmer and sexual abuse victim, followed by seven sessions. The presentations included an FBI representative, USA Swimming Board of Directors members, Safe Sport staff and industry specialists.

Safe Sport Chair HOD Report -April 19, 2015







"This year's Safe Sport Leadership Conference was a true milestone for our sport," said Chuck Wielgus, USA Swimming's Executive Director. "Our organizational leaders and membership are becoming increasingly comfortable in talking about very serious issues, and this in-turn is raising awareness throughout our sport, and raising awareness is the key to reducing abuse." Below are the highlights of each session:

Managing Bullying and Conflict

Nancy Richey, Age-group swim coach

Richey attended the 2014 National Age Group Summit, and is a swim coach in Boulder, Colorado. In the midst of a season, Richey notes that swimmers may spend more time with teammates and coaches than with their family. "It is our job as coaches to develop this culture of inclusion," said Richey. "It's important to remember that we are developing people, not athletes. The child matters more than the sport."

Developing this culture of support is instrumental in creating an environment for athletes to grow beyond maximizing their swimming ability. According to Richey, this means learning what motivates athletes in a positive and challenging way.

Creating this culture will minimize the amount of bullying and conflict in a club.

Richey also noted a key distinction between bullying and conflict: Bullying is intentionally and persistently causing harm to another individual, while conflict is usually a mutual disagreement. When a situation arises, it's important to truly identify what is happening and why. What one athlete feels is problematic could be attention-seeking in the mind of another. Asking questions of all involved is critical to identifying the core issue and resolving it.

Get the Right People on Board: Effective Hiring Practices

Melanie Lockwood Herman, Nonprofit Risk Management Center Executive Director

Herman focused on how to make sure organizations get the right people on board. Hiring a new employee can impact the trajectory of an organization. A great employee can take the organization to new heights, while the wrong employee can cause potentially inconceivable damage.

Herman shared common hiring mishaps and pitfalls, such as how clubs often short-circuit the process by skipping position description and moving too quickly into recruitment. There is also a belief that hiring a new employee falls on a single Individual when it should be a team-hiring process. Also, there often isn't an emphasis on references, which is a vital screening tool.

"References should be used to verify information provided on an application and also obtain a third-party view of the candidate's past performance," said Herman. "I urge swim clubs to check and give employment references. It is possible to do both with a high degree of safety."

Swim Staff Select was also discussed. The free, online HR tool rolls out at the end of summer. This service allows clubs to create templates for job applications, interviews and reference checks, which will cut down on time club administrators spend on paperwork.

Facility Management and Risk Identification

Michael Osborn, FBI

Osborn, who swam and played water polo in college, is a 16-year veteran of the FBI with 13 years dedicated to crimes against children exploitation.

Although it's impossible to eliminate the threat, it's important to mitigate it. There are various ways to minimize the threat beginning with understanding the facility's strengths and weaknesses. Know the site's access points and control the flow of people by identifying who can access specific areas of the venue. If someone is taking photos who isn't a regular team member or looks out of place, question that person or bring in security to identify their interest in being there.

It's also important to assemble a leadership team tasked with creating a facility and risk identification plan. This plan creates guidelines for photographers on deck, locker room monitoring and pass access.

"This session was incredibly informative and practical," said Bob Crunstedt of Minnesota Swimming. "Learning about facility management and what to look for in your venue gave some great insight on what we can prepare for on the front end of not only meets, but practices, too."

Bystander Engagement

Lauren Sogor, Public Health Communications Expert and Account Supervisor at Hager Sharp

Sogor provided a brief background on bystander effect and how it relates to children in youth sports. Bystander effect is the idea that when individuals see others around during a crime, the individual disperses responsibility and assumes others will report it. The goal is to stop dispersing responsibility and make a shift toward intervention.

Bystander intervention is the act of feeling empowered and equipped with the knowledge and skills to effectively assist the prevention. Having the tools and resources to intervene breeds confidence in stopping inappropriate actions.

"Let's treat warning signs and red flags as an opportunity for abuse prevention," said Sogor.

Since 2010, USA Swimming Safe Sport has made incredible strides at providing members the tools to recognize, respond and report inappropriate behavior.







When Culture Breaks Down: Crisis Management

Melanie Lockwood Herman, Nonprofit Risk Management Center Executive Director

According to Herman, a common crisis management mistake is to try to imagine crisis events as detailed scenarios and plan accordingly. This is not usually how it works. Organizations do not get to choose the source, the cause or timing of the crisis. The best practice is to develop crisis plans that will be helpful in a wide range of scenarios.

Other key aspects were the importance of information gathering before making declarative statements, identifying proper spokespeople, showing compassion and being concise.

"When you're developing these broad plans, get the perspective from a large pool of people," said Herman. "Once all perspectives are heard, the crisis response team will be appointed and can create a more detailed plan."

Online Child Exploitation: What Can I Do

Michael Osborn, FBI

Osborn closed the three-day conference with a powerful presentation on online child exploitation.

"We have an opportunity today," said Osborn. "We are giving you resources and tools to be ready. Imagine the impact we can make. Through these presentations, I'm hoping we reach hundreds of thousands of people. There are multiple NGBs in attendance, and you are our sounding board and biggest advocate."

It is important to understand the power of the word. Having open, honest and age-appropriate conversations between kids, parents, coaches and teachers can help prevent abuse.

"Clearly at the USOC, USA Swimming and the other NGBs represented (at the conference), this is an important topic," said Osborn, who presented on behalf of the FBI. "The fact that you have a sports entity like USA Swimming dedicating resources to producing educational materials and conferences like this speaks for itself."

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Coaches Representative Report BOD April 8, 2015

- In June we will finish the 2014 joint mentoring program with Indiana Swimming. Pam is working directly with Tony Young at Indiana Swimming to facilitate this. Several IN coaches will spend a few days with either FOX or STSC (a few coaches with each) observing a practice, meet session and other activities. Previously there were delays in getting Indiana coaches over to Illinois to complete the program, which had been funded by USA Swimming, Illinois Swimming and Indiana Swimming. The coaches committee is currently brainstorming ideas for the 2015 USA Swimming Mentoring Program.
- For the first time we held a social event for coaches and officials at all seven Regional sites. The intent was to set up a meeting place for coaches and officials to gather after the Saturday afternoon session. Most of the events were attended by only a handful of people, with the Barrington social appearing to be the largest. The committee agreed that we would like to try this again in the summer, and see if we can work with the site hosts more this next time around. We also held a social event during Senior Champs at Moxee Restaurant. This event was more successful based on numbers, and something we would also like to do again this summer.
- At the NCSA meet in Orlando several teams took over the IL Swimming Twitter account to have some fun and highlight performances by Illinois swimmers. This is something we could extend to other big Championship meets not taking place in Illinois.
- The committee is planning to use the new version of the Illinois Swimming website for better communication and as a valuable resource tool for coaches. We have discussed providing material on certification courses and instructor contact information, highlighting in-house opportunities like the Coaches Education Grant Program, and promoting links to educational resources and sites.

The Committee next meets on 2 May 2015 in Colorado Springs. Following is a summary of recent activities:

The Strategic Review and Planning Group has been meeting regularly. A new "Strategic Priorities (Draft)" document has been developed as a "road map" for near term and future IR decisions.

The IRC is proposing amendments to the Rules that:

- 1) prohibit a coach member from coaching, training or providing swimmingrelated advice to any swimmer who is serving a period of ineligibility or provisional suspension for an anti-doping rule violation;
- 2) require forfeiture of any compensation paid by USA Swimming to a coach resulting from performances achieved by an athlete guilty of an anti-doping violation.

All clubs and coaches were recently sent notice of a new (2015) WADA rule prohibiting anyone who has been declared ineligible or is serving a provisional suspension for doping from participating in any capacity with a USA Swimming member club.



Other activities:

SPEEDO SECTIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

The University of Iowa was the host of the Spring 2015 meet. Reviews of the meet were very good with very few problems noted. The time standard target of 700 swimmers was met (718 actual swimmers) with 200 "non-resident" swimmers participating in the meet. Fourteen new Meet Records were achieved. Time standards for future meets are established with a "not faster than" requirement set by the Sr Development Committee

Future meets: 15-18 July 2015 (University of Minnesota), 10-13 March 2016 (Pleasant Prairie, WI—long course), 21-24 July 2016 (Brown Deer, WI), 9 - 12 March 2017 (University of Iowa), 19-22 July 2017 (University of Minnesota).

CLUB EXCELLENCE REVIEW TASK FORCE

The Task Force (Michael Lawrence – Chair, Rick Shiperd, Dave Berkhoff, Kathleen Prindle-Klein) has been meeting weekly. A new program will be proposed to the Sr Development Committee in April.

APA (ATHLETE PARTNERSHIP PROGRAM) REVIEW

A Task Force has been named to review the current APA and make appropriate recommendations. The group first meets in May with additional work throughout the summer and final recommendations made in October.
