Re: ISI/The Swim Team Store Partnership

As was mentioned during the April 9 Board of Directors meeting I had been working on finalizing an agreement between Illinois Swimming and The Swim Team Store to present for approval. Attached please find the proposal in whole for your further review-however, I believe it is best to summarize the terms of this proposal for simplicity sake and to help you make a speedy approval decision.

In summation:

- The Swim Team Store (TSTS) will become "The Official Supplier of Illinois Swimming" under terms of this agreement. As such, TSTS joins Speedo (Exclusive Swimwear Manufacturer) as sponsors of ISI to date and ISI will provide to TSTS the following:
- Exclusive link to TSTS site from the ISI site as "The Official Supplier of Illinois Swimming".
- Signage at all ISI Championship events.
- P.A. Announcements at all ISI Championship events.
- Advertising space in all ISI Championship Meet "Heat Sheets" and other ISI published materials
- ISI mailing list access (as a point of information-this element is also included in the Speedo agreement and it is understood that access would be limited to ISI coordinating this process either via a third party (mailing house) or some other agreed upon means. By no means would ISI be relinquishing the membership mailing list).

- Officials Apparel Program- ISI Officials will be able to purchase shirts and perhaps shorts
 or pants as part of their uniform exclusively from TSTS and ISI would receive an accrual
 (revenue percentage) based on number of goods sold.
- Illinois Swimming Apparel Program-TSTS would be exclusive supplier of ISI branded merchandise to be sold primarily via the website (TSTS to create this site as a link to from ISI website). Program would be managed by TSTS under ISI direction. Items with ISI branding would include but not be limited to polo shirts, sweatshirts, t-shirts, performance t-shirts, etc and marketed to the general public. TSTS would provide services such as ordering goods, embroidering, silk-screening, order taking and fulfillment. ISI would receive accrual.
- Vendor Opportunity at ISI Championship Meets- Items to include swim gear, suits, goggles and non ISI branded apparel. Host club would receive a 12% accrual. Additionally, if Host Club chooses to utilize the services of TSTS for event specific merchandise-TSTS would accrual at the rate of 50% of revenue generated from sales for all event specific items sold.

<u>Illinois Swimming would receive:</u>

- Advertising allowance (cash) of \$5,000.00 per year-\$2,500.00 prior to the start of Short Course Championship season and \$2,500.00 prior to the start of Long Course season.
- As "Official Supplier of Illinois Swimming" merchandise sold in conjunction with Team Illinois (Zones and Mid-States) would be accrued to ISI at a rate of 20%. Based on past history potential value of this element would be \$5,720.00. This would help to offset budget line item currently allocated for uniforms (suits, caps, t-shirts).
- An accrual (revenue) of 10-22% on ISI Apparel Merchandising Program. As outlined earlier this would be primarily web-based program except when these items are sold at ISI Championship Meets. Since this is a new program with no past history it is difficult to provide projections. My belief is that this program can generate attractive revenue over time which could prove fairly lucrative.
- An accrual of 10% on Officials Apparel program.

In summation, I believe this partnership has merit on several fronts-it provides cash, reduces a budget line item and establishes the possibility of great revenue potential via the Merchandising programs. With a certain due diligence in mind, I found that everyone who has dealt with TSTS, and in particular, Mark Hines, speaks highly of him, the service he provides, the professionalism and his enthusiasm. He has two kids swimming out the Redbirds Swim Team, his son, a sophomore, swam in the IHSA State Finals. Lastly, I'd like to add that I had extensive conversations with Kiefer regarding sponsorship. Although the direction of those conversations was aimed towards Title Sponsorship and came with a higher price tag, it seemed there was awhat can Illinois Swimming do for our business- mentality rather than a partnership. Additionally, there was some general concern about Kiefer's ability to service Team Illinois and thus the concern trickled down to the other program elements as well.

Follow-up points: I believe there is ample evidence to discuss whether the Vendor Opportunity at Championship Meets should indeed revert back to Host Club or to ISI itself. From a Host Club standpoint this would mean several thousand dollars of "lost" revenue but for ISI it would mean four events at several thousand dollars of "gained" revenue. (i.e. the loss to a Host Club is rather minimal while the overall gain to ISI would be rather significant if we decided to revert this revenue back to ISI)

- ➤ One day (Both Prelim and Final) to be used for Illinois Swimming business purposes. Invitations to be extended to potential sponsors for business entertainment purposes. Chicago 2016 will also have a suite at the Trials and as such will be entertaining high profile city and FINA officials. If necessary, and the availability exists, we might be able help them with any potential overflow. Date for our use TBD.

Olympic Trials Recap

We were able to provide 24 full time current, part-time and former Illinois Swimming athlete families with tickets to the Trials. Sales totaled \$1,200.00 and we had a parent/coach who originally was interested in purchasing \$2,400.00 of tickets but later cancelled. From a business entertainment standpoint on July 2 Mark Hines from The Swim Team Store and Wally Hayward, Chairman of Relay Sports and Entertainment joined me for the prelim and final sessions. Business cancellations included AthletiCo, Regional Marketing Director for Lexus, along with an agency representative, and Jeff Urban from Gatorade. We filled all of the sessions with the exception of Sat prelim and finals and the Sunday final session. Offer was also extended to ISI coaches that were in attendance and several accepted. To briefly summarize-had many very positive and grateful comments from families of athletes. The issue of the cancellation came about as a misinterpretation of purchase/complimentary policy and the suggestion for future endeavors like this would be to not commingle purchase/giveaways but rather have as strictly "goodwill" and distribute again to families on a complimentary basis.

Media coverage included Tribune articles on Matt Grevers and Mary Descenza, Pioneer Press article on Julia Andracki and Sam Wilcher, Kane County Chronicle article on the St Charles Swim members heading to Trials as well as a piece on CLTV again on the SCST. Although Phil Hersh from the Tribune is covering the Track and Field Trials the correspondents from the L.A. Times have thus far focused on local stories of note and athletes with local ties (i.e. Christine Magnuson). Contacts were made with CBS, NBC, ABC, FOX and Comcast but unfortunately could not garner any coverage.

Sponsorship Status

Finalizing letter of agreement/contract with The Swim Team Store. Additionally, AthletiCo has agreed to partner with ISI for the upcoming Long Course season by providing massage therapy for athletes at Senior Championships and for Coaches/Officials at Age Group Championships. In addition to services rendered ISI will receive \$1,500. Focus shifts to Title Sponsorship of Championship Meets with several proposals currently in the marketplace.

Make a Splash/Learn to Swim

As was briefly outlined in an email to all- World Sport Chicago Executive Director (new E.D. came on board last Fall) Scott Meyers met several weeks ago with Pat Hogan, John Cruzat, others at USA to discuss Make a Splash and collaborating with the Chicago Park District. The result of this meeting and I might add it happened rather quickly was that John Cruzat along with Wanda Butts came to Chicago for a whirlwind tour of churches, community centers, several radio stations to talk about the drowning epidemic in the black community. Additionally, Mayor Daley held a press conference to discuss this matter as well. Pam and I attended the initial planning meeting along with reps from the CPD, Chicago 2016, USA and World Sport and I attended the press conference. Moving forward World Sport is soliciting Chicago Pro Sports athletes, political figures and other recognizable personalities to do Public Service Announcements about "Learn to Swim". We were asked to garner our resources to help in this matter as well as keep World Sport in the loop for any news of note about African American swimmers within ISI. Politics aside, it was brought up that the Obama daughters were involved in the Midway Aquatics learn to swim program and World Sport through their network will try to enlist the support of Michele Obama. Additionally Lauren Jiggets, daughter of Dan, who is also a newscaster was mentioned. Other items of note that were discussed were the possibilities of having High School facilities that are under the auspices of the CPD stay open later during the week once school starts and perhaps open on Saturdays to maintain learn to swim programs. ISI has made it clear and known that we are willing to provide whatever resources we may have available to work in conjunction with these other entities.

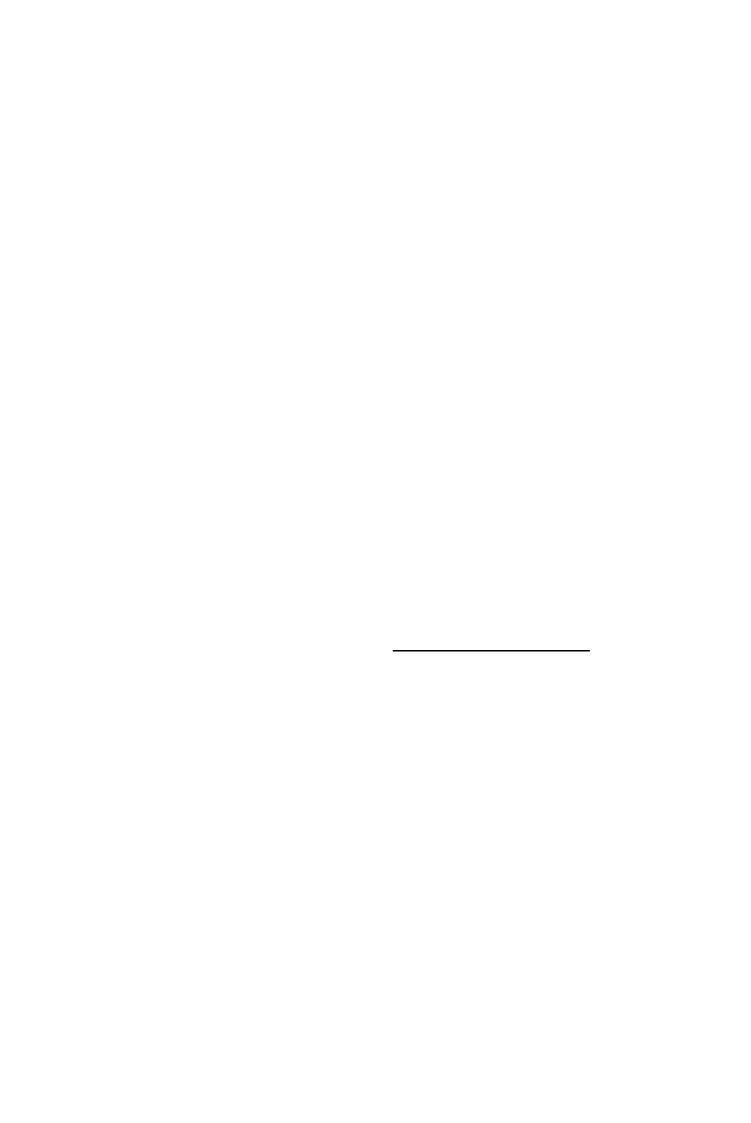

The events surrounding the initiation of a National Board of Review petition that was initiated by the Team Illinois Head Coach at the 2008 Zone Meet held in Indianapolis was discussed at length. Issues relating to the USA Swimming Responsibility clause (207.8.3), USA Swimming processing of eligibility clause (102.11.4) and the ruling of the eligibility petition that occurred in the Eastern Zone last year. MOTION: Illinois Swimming will not pursue any further action regarding the National Board of Review Petition that was initiated by the Team Illinois Head Coach at the 2008 Zone meet. 2nd, passed by unanimous vote.

It was decided that the General Chair will contact the General Chair of Indiana Swimming as well as the meet director for the Zone meet and verbally inform them of our decision in the above matter as well as discuss any concerns with regard to mis-communication that occurred as a result of this situation. In addition to the verbal contact the General Chair will draft a letter officially stating the above items and will then consider the matter closed.

In an effort to avoid a situation such as this in the future for our LSC or another LSC it was decided that our Zone Director, Bill Schalz will forward the suggestion from our LSC that two items be incorporated into the Zone manual/meet information as follows:

- That the host LSC provide minimum and maximum time standards in their set up files that are distributed to participating LSC's for each event. We recognize that this will not completely solve the issue but will hopefully provide an additional safteynet for athletes, coaches and hosts trying to uphold the rules that are already in place.
- 2. That the USA Swimming rule 102.11.4 regarding the timeliness of eligibility protests be spelled out and included in the Zone manual and/or zone meet information.

Finally in an effort to provide support and guidance to individual members of USA Swimming that are acting on behalf of our LSC in such capacities as Zone Team coach/manager, Mid-States coach/manager and Camp coach/director. A policy will be drafted and presented at our next regular BOD meeting, outlining procedures for guidance and protocol for filing a petition beyond the event venue. Once adopted, the policy will be distributed to all USA Swimming members who serve in an Illinois Swimming LSC capacity in the future.

AGE GROUP VICE-CHAIR REPORT BOD – September 17, 2008

<u>2008 Regional Championships Entry Process:</u> Due to the numerous issues with our Regional Meet set-up/restrictions and the OME entry system thru USA Swimming's web site, we will be returning to the hytek entry file system for the Regional Championships only.

2008 Fall Camps: We will be running three fall camps (Catch the Spirit and Feel the Power) again this season. We will run two camps in the chicagoland area and one camp in southern Illinois. Our chicagoland sites are Vernon Hills (CATS) and Oswego (DLTA). Our southern site is once again Springfield (SUSA).

2010 LC Championship Series / Bid: The Age Group Committee has been working on proposing a LC Championship series for Summer 2010. Details on this championship series will be discussed at the Fall HOD by Jon Cabel, Bob Kizer, and me, and we are looking to get this passed at the Spring HOD so we can accept subsequent bids for LC 2010. This would be originally viewed as a one-time, championship meet format, with our hopes that it can become a regular event (possibly in Olympic years). The major change in our current format is that we would have a 12&U 3 day prelim finals meet and a 13&Over 4 day prelims/final meet. We would be adding some events to the 12&U meet and 10&U swimmers will have prelim/finals. There would be some adjustments to the 13/14 and Senior standards to make a manageable meet. This would be scored as two separate meets and then as a combined state championship. These meets would replace our current Senior Champs and Age Group Champs for that season only. We are looking to hold the 12&U meet on the same weekend as Speedo Sectionals, to avoid conflicts for our Senior athletes. We would then host the 13&Over meet on preferably the following weekend, depending on the dates bid by our zone. The Senior Chair has been contacted regarding this idea and we are looking forward to working with the Senior Committee to make this meet a reality. I would be happy to discuss specific details if anyone has questions.

<u>2008-2009 Time Standards / Regional Assignments:</u> The time standards for the Age Group Championships (SC & LC 2009) were going to be attached to this report. I realized this morning there was a significant error in the standards and am trying to get them fixed right now. If possible, I will email them out later this evening, or just submit them for our next meeting with the Regional Standards. I have attached the Regional Team Assignments for 2009. Most of the teams are assigned to the same regional they attended last year, and we are hopeful for a bit larger AM sessions than last year. All of these will be presented at the Fall HOD

Re: Report for BOD meeting 9/17

Senior and Age Group Champ meets were successfully conducted. Overall we had good participation by our officials. A couple of items will require follow-up should the UIC facility be used for a long course venue:

- 1. Lanes 1 and 8 need outside lane lines. Width of these lanes is different than lanes 2-7.
- 2. Blocks were loose and problematic. A re-swim was required due to a block coming out of the deck at the start. Wooden shims were used to stabilize blocks.
- 3. Timing harnesses have not been properly maintained; as they were examined from a troubleshooting perspective a large amount of corrosion was noted.
- 4. Protocol needed for in water exchanges for 200 medley relays. Had 2 instances were outgoing swimmer interfered with incoming swimmer preventing a legal touch. This needs to be resolved with the Age Group chair to establish prior to the meet expectations of swimmers/coaches/officials.
- 5. Protocol needs to be changed for relays to clear the deck area of the finishing relay team. Inadequate room for 10 people behind each lane. This will add a bit to the timeline and require the host to provide crowd control.

The new members of the officials committee have met 3 times (once in person at Senior Champs and 2 conference calls). The following clinics have been scheduled:

- 9/14 clinic for new officials (Maverick host at Naperville Central HS)
- 9/21 recertification clinic for existing officials (Bloomington Normal Swim Club host at State Farm training facility in Bloomington)
- 10/4 recertification clinic for existing officials (New Trier host at New Trier West HS)
- 10/25 clinic for new officials (West Chicago Sharks host at West Chicago HS)
- 11/1 clinic for new officials (New Trier host at New Trier West HS)
- 11/2 clinic for new officials (Champaign Heat host at Centennial HS)

Working on plans to effectively:

- Staff championship meets
- Continue development of officials including national certification
- Recruit and retain officials
- Continue training of officials
- Continue officials communications. Working with Bob Welch to identify process with ISP to do mass mail without current limitations of sending emails in batches of 50 on the half hour (current limitations by officials committee members).

Jim Audet resigned from the committee. Cathy Harris, under separate action, has been identified as a replacement for Jim.

Position: Stroke & Turn Judge

Minimum Age: 18

Education & Training: Join USA Swimming as a Non-Athlete member.

> Attend an ISI Officials Clinic and pass the USA Swimming Stroke & Turn Judge on-line certification test with a grade of 80% or better.

> Relay Take-Off and Chief Judge Positions are also covered in this clinic.

*Evaluation & Certification: On-deck written evaluation by a qualified Trainer for a total of 4 sessions at no less that 3 sanctioned meets with at least 2 different Trainers. Evaluations must be signed by the Trainer and Meet Referee. Signed evaluations must be sent by the Trainee to the ISI office. The Trainee session will also be listed by the Meet Referee in the Meet Sanction Report to the ISI office.

> The ISI Trainee certification/session card should be used a proof of clinic attendance for training. All on-deck training sessions will count toward the minimum session requirements for Annual Renewal.

The ISI Stroke & Turn certification/session card will be issued by Official's Chairman or their designee after notification by the ISI office that on-deck training requirements and completion of the USA Swimming certification test have been met.

*Education & Training, Evaluation and Certification Notes:

- 1. All on-deck Trainers must be certified for a period of not less than 12 months in the position that they are training. Assignment of an on-deck Trainer must be approved by the Meet Referee.
- 2. All on-deck training sessions must be completed at USA Swimming/ISI sanctioned meets.
- 3. A session is defined as being at least 2 hours long and must include each of the strokes. It is the responsibility of the Trainer and Meet Referee to adhere to this definition.
- 4. Trainees shall perform in the full capacity of the position, including making disqualifications calls, during all on-deck training sessions. However, the Trainer shall approve all Trainee disqualifications before reporting the disqualification recommendation to the Referee. One Trainer may evaluate multiple trainees during the same session upon the approval of the Meet Referee. The Trainer may also make disqualification calls within the assigned jurisdiction of the Trainee(s).
- 5. Trainee certification occurs and is effective upon successful completion of the Officials Clinic and receipt of an ISI temporary session card (buff). Trainees will have a T-prefix next to their position abbreviation. Any Trainee who, upon a retrospective review, has been found to have failed to meet the minimum standard(s) for **Education and Training** may have their Trainee certification revoked and may be subject to disciplinary action.
- 6. Position certification occurs and is effective upon successful completion of ondeck training evaluations, successful completion of the USA Swimming certification test and receipt of an ISI certification/session card (white). Any certified official who, upon retrospective review, has been found to have failed to meet the minimum standard(s) for **Evaluation & Certification** may have their certification revoked and may be subject to disciplinary action.
- 7. Prospective clinic candidates must request pre-approval from the Official's Chairman or their designee to attend a clinic. Pre-approval is defined as documentation that the candidate has met the minimum criteria to be eligible to attend the ISI Officials Clinic for the position requested.

 - b. Objectives for the Committee for the 2008-2009 swim season continue to be:
 - i. Train officials within the LSC
 - ii. Staff the ISI Championship meets and encourage national certification
 - iii. Recruit and retain officials
 - iv. Communicate with officials on a monthly basis:
- 2. Controlled Meet Warm-Up and Safety Guidelines
 - a. Concerns have been expressed regarding the enforcement of the Controlled Meet Warm-Up and Safety Guidelines. As a reminder, it is the responsibility of coaches and referee to ensure the safety guidelines are followed. If they are not, the referee and safety marshalls have the authority to remove swimmers and/or coaches from the pool for the remainder of the warm-up session.
- 3. Officials statistics (trainees are included)

We have 534 officials as of 9/29/2008. This number includes:

- 265 Stroke and Turn Judges
- 74 Administrative Judges
- 89 Starters
- 106 Referees

87 officials have one or multiple National Level 2 certifications

22 of these officials also have one or multiple National Level 3 certifications

All clubs are encouraged to have officials, and meet host clubs are encouraged to have at a minimum 1 referee, 1 starter, and 1 additional official.

4. Officials Clinics

- a. 2 officials recertification clinics have been completed
- b. 4 officials training clinics have been scheduled (one is complete)
- c. We are looking for clubs to host the spring training clinics. Please let us know in October if and when your club would be willing to host a clinic (April May timeframe). Detailed information on hosting clinics is available on the ISI website in the officials section under clinic information.
- 5. Officials Tracking System (OTS)
 - a. USA-Swimming provides an officials tracking information system containing officials meet information sessions worked, national evaluations completed, national certification request processing, and activities.
 - b. We will be moving towards maintaining sessions worked information on OTS. This will require meet referees to ensure the sessions worked information is input in OTS. More information will be communicated to officials, especially referees, as we move in this direction. Goal is to allow officials to see how many sessions they have worked and eliminate the paper session cards.
 - c. Officials contact information may be maintained by officials on the USA-S website using their account. This information may also be linked to the USA Swimming Membership record.
 - d. OTS is the processing vehicle for national certification.
- 6. Plans are to have all Illinois championship meets set up as Officials Qualifying Meets for national certification. We hope to identify other meets which satisfy the national certification requirements to provide additional opportunities for officials to become and remain nationally certified.
- 7. Convention items noteworthy from an officials perspective
 - a. Rule change on swimsuits. Swimsuits worn for all 12 & under age group defined competition shall not cover the neck, extend past the shoulder, nor past the knee. The Referee shall have authority to bar offenders from the competition until they comply with the rule. This rule is effective in May 2009.
 - b. Use of underwater cameras expected in future national championship meets. Expect to move from confirming the call to making the call, with breaststroke likely to be the first stroke.
 - c. Clarification was provided regarding lead-off relay splits for mixed gender relays. The lead-off splits, if swum legally, are valid regardless of the relay gender classification.
 - d. The Dolphin Timing System from Colorado Timing Systems was discussed. This is a system which provides the watch times wirelessly to the computer eliminating transcription errors. There are several modes it may be operated in: (1) All watches started by the starting system (a semi-automatic system like buttons); (2) All watches started by one timer; (3) All watches started by the individual timer. Please let the Officials Committee know if anyone in our LSC is or is planning to use the Dolphin Timing System.
 - e. The swimmers with disabilities section has been updated.

Still under development: (For Long Course Champs 2009)

- Hand Book from ISI to Host club outlining what the areas of responsibilities are, and what
 is expected of all parties.
- Development of survey for meet evaluation, similar to what USA swimming does for there
 events. Looking to further develop into on-line feedback format.

Officials: Officials Training for this season has started with clinics already being held, and turn out seems excellent. We will continue thru next year with the clinic format we have been using, with some minor tweaks as we move along. I have asked Rome and his committee to continue to focus on our clinics and see what more we can do to remove any and all hurdles that may be stopping people from becoming/staying an official.

Recertification has begun and with this year being a test requirement year (once every 2 years). We are also offering recertification clinics across the state which officials can attend instead of taking the recertification test.

Migration of Officials Database from Local to USA Swimming Officials Tracking System is still ongoing, with Kim, Rome and Pam all assisting in getting it to where it will meet our needs. We have had conversations with the National Officials Taskforce members regarding need improvements and these are planned for this year. Once these have been completed we should be able to complete the migration and make this our sole tracking, and certification database.

<u>Computer:</u> If you have been to the ISI Website you have noticed that it has undergone a complete overhaul. Much work was done by Pam, Jacob, and Peter to get this accomplished, and the results are excellent, with a site that is streamline and meets the needs of our members. If you have any suggestion or feedback please let us know.

- Bill Welhnofer shared that our athlete endowment fund has been affected by the recent financial calamity. Equity prices are down approximately 45%. Our fund is 65% equity-based and 35% fixed-income and therefore, has bee affected dramatically by recent events. The fund may have "lost" \$100,000 to date and the future is still uncertain. Doug Lennox agreed with Bill Welnhofer that we are in this for the long haul and any adjustment in our fund distribution might put us in a position where we would not be able to take advantage of situations in the equity market that are forthcoming. The reality is that we might be looking at a couple-year recovery time. Welnhofer did comment that with the parameters that are in place regarding the use of this fund (requiring a \$500,000 balance before it can be used), it will be quite some time before we will be able to use this fund as we hoped and planned.
- Corporate fundraising and sponsorship opportunities will be very difficult and may have a negative influence on our 2009 budget. Peter Kozura has not heard negative responses from any of the potential sponsors to date. AthletiCo and The Swim Team Store will be returning. A couple other sponsors are still under consideration.
- Budget relief could come in the fact that we could be benefiting from the USA Swimming projection of a 7-9% increase in athlete registration. Our budget calls for our athlete registrations to remain flat.

2008 USAS Convention, Atlanta, GA Bob Welch Report

Below is a brief synopsis of the meetings and/or workshops I attended at this years USAS Convention in Atlanta GA. I wanted to thank our members and Board of Directors for appointing me as one of our At-Large votes and allowing me to participate in this year's convention. One of the intangible benefits attendance at convention, I feel, is that it is one of the only times that the entire Board of Directors for Illinois Swimming is together and dedicated and focused on our sport. The convention is like a small incubator full of all the needed material (resources such as USA-S Staff, Committee Members and Chairs, along with published material) to help our LSC leadership continue to develop, and plan the many possibilities for the future of Illinois Swimming.

At the HOD meeting on Saturday both Jim Wood and Chuck Wielgus expressed there extreme pleasure at how well Olympic trials event was. One of the memorable quotes for me was from Jim Wood expressing what was what he thought was the best part

"The best part however might not have been all the world records, but the experience we gave 1,200 athletes who did not make the Olympic team and might never make one in the future. We gave all of those swimmers an opportunity to compete on a stage like no other and an experience they will remember for a lifetime."

Chuck outlined the five major priorities that we are adopting as the most important advancements for the next four-year window. Beside for the three we have had from many years Build, Promote, Achieve; we have added Improve LSC effectiveness and Support the USA Swimming Foundation. Copies of both Jim and Chuck's reports can be found on the USA Swimming web site.

<u>USA Swimming's make A Splash Program:</u> Kim O'Shea Program Manager for USA Swimming Make Splash, presented an overview of last years partnership and promotional opportunities of the USA Swimming Foundation's National child water safety program Make A Splash. The Program Managers from Metro Atlanta Boys & Girls clubs did a panel discussion of all there experiences in creating and running the lessons program in there pilot program. Also covered where Future Major Programs, The Local Partner Program, and Promotional efforts.

Chuck explained that part of the plan is to have 500 Local Partners by the end of the quad ads part of the plan to Support the foundation. Any club with Learn To Swim program will want to look at the Make a splash program and the USA Swimming Foundations web site.

Rules & Regulations Committee: The Rules & Regs committee met to discuss proposed legislation (proposed changes and additions). They also discussed proposed changes to the LSC bylaws templates. Attendee in the audience have the chance to ask questions and provide comments on the proposed changes which the House of Delegates votes on at Saturdays HOD meeting

Officials Committee: The officials committee had presentations from those officials who represented USA Swimming at the Olympic Games in Beijing and there comments about the venue and competition and the experience that we believe is needed to host a meet like this. They also shared the results of the survey done by a task force formed to assess the current official's certification program. Article 105 Interpretations (Inclusion of Swimmers with Disabilities at USA Swimming Meets) was also presented.



2008 USAS Convention, Atlanta, GA Bob Welch Report

LSC Development Committee: LSC Development hosted the LSC General Chairs Luncheon and ED Chuck Wielgus spoke about the soon to be introduce LEAP (LSC Evaluation & Achievement Program) and the intent is to motivate LSCs through communication, education and recognition to strive for higher levels of effectiveness. The program will provide a roadmap to LSC effectiveness and success in four key areas: Business & Organizational Capabilities; Volunteer Development; Club & Coach Development; and Athlete Development. This item was further and fully discussed at Fridays LSC General Chairs Meeting.

Discussion was also hosted on how an anticipated membership bump following the Olympics will be affecting the LSC and the respective programming.

<u>Governance Committee:</u> Governance Committee meeting focused discussion on the two pieces of legislation that they have proposed and one item that was proposed by Wells Obrien regarding a possible coast saving idea to limit the Rules changes to every two years, which would offer savings in rule book printing and committee meeting costs.

<u>Central Zone:</u> Central Zone had a full agenda of topics from New Zone Director (non Coach) to a newly USA Swimming funded Senior Zone Champ. The Zone voted to establish this meet in 2010 and it is required to be on either the first or second week in August. Some new rules where presented and passed regarding the zone manual and they will be posted on the zone website as soon as possible.

Open Water Meet Directors & Officials Seminar: Presentations by John Kinny who was an Open Water official at Beijing Olympics and what and how the organizers did an outstanding job. He also showed the Officials Training Video which showed the many facets of planning, physical prep, conduct, and wrap-up of an open water competition.

Greg Cross Ft Meyers Open Water Race Director spoke at length about the planning and conducting of an Open Water Competition. Key to an Open Water is that it should be a safe and fun environment with a level playing venue for the athletes so that they leave the event having a very good experience that is also enjoyable.

National Evaluators Training for Officials: Jim Sheehan outlines the start of a training program for Evaluators with the primary goal of develop consistency and provide a breadth of opportunities to train, educate, and mentor. Key to this was that we remember the officials being evaluated are volunteers and doing this for the benefit of the swimmers. The evaluations process is a teaching and mentoring process and in not a simple 'grading process' The primary goal is to continually improve the knowledge, experience, and capabilities of our swimming officials.

Doug Lennox agreed with Bill Welnhofer that we are in this for the long haul and any adjustment in our fund distribution might put us in a position where we would not be able to take advantage of situations in the equity market that are forthcoming. The reality is that we might be looking at a couple-year recovery time. Welnhofer did comment that with the parameters that are in place regarding the use of this fund (requiring a \$500,000 balance before it can be used), it will be quite some time before we will be able to use this fund as we hoped and planned
- Corporate fundraising and sponsorship opportunities will be very difficult and may have a negative influence on our 2009 budget. Peter Kozura has not heard negative responses from any of the potential sponsors to date. AthletiCo and The Swim Team Store will be returning. A couple other sponsors are still under consideration.
- Budget relief could come in the fact that we could be benefiting from the USA Swimming projection
 of a 7-9% increase in athlete registration. Our budget calls for our athlete registrations to remain flat.

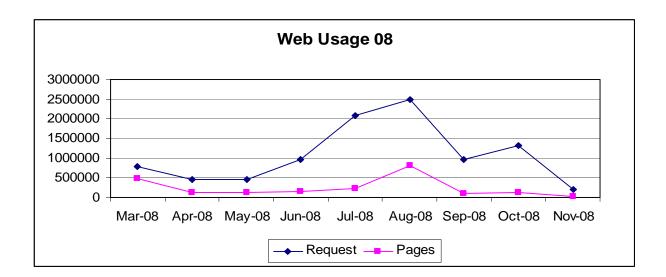

- (1) The Officials' Committee (OC) recommends the scholarships for Jayne Spittler, Randy Clark, and Fred Pigott. Bob Van Oost pulled his request as he is unable to make the champ meet. Scholarship checks should be issued to the in the amounts \$300. Jayne's scholarship is from the summer. These scholarships were approved at the last BOD meeting.
 - a. Lisa Olack has submitted a scholarship request for Short Course Nationals. The OC recommends approval for her scholarship request. This request requires BOD approval. Note: Approval for these scholarships will result in disbursements of \$1,200 300 of which is from the summer. Checks are requested to be sent to the participants November 25 with the exception of the check for Jayne Spittler which should be mailed as soon as the check can be issued.
- (2) The list of recommended officials for regional and champ meet referees and champ meet lead positions will be updated at the next OC meeting (11/18). The updated list will be shared at the December BOD meeting. Plans are to have the officials for the champ meets identified prior to the end of the year.
- (3) We will be doing what needs to be done to have Senior and Age Group Champs established as 'Officials Qualifying Meets'.
- (4) The fall training clinics have been completed successfully. A glitch occurred at one of the sites regarding pool time with swimmers for officials to train with. - (5) Changes have been made to the way trainees may make calls during the training sessions and how training sessions count. Those changes are:
 - a. Trainees may make calls beginning with their second training session. An exception to the minimum standards as documented on the USA-S website has been received from the National Officials Chair, Jim Sheehan.
 - i. The trainee will still be under direct supervision of a trained official who will also act as chief judge with overlapping jurisdiction with the trainee. This is not intended to over-officiate the swimmer but to ensure all swimmers are fairly observed while providing a better training situation for our trainees.
 - b. All training sessions will count towards the annual certification requirement. In the past, training sessions did not count towards the annual worked session requirement.
- (6) Emails to officials may now be done much more easily. We are utilizing the ISI email account which does not have the spam limitations of 50/100 emails per hour in conjunction with MS Office 2007/03 capability of doing an email mail merge.

Status

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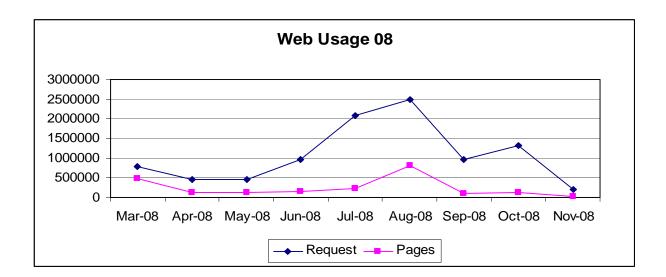

Re: Report for BOD meeting 11/12/2008

- (1) The Officials' Committee (OC) recommends the scholarships for Jayne Spittler, Randy Clark, and Fred Pigott. Bob Van Oost pulled his request as he is unable to make the champ meet. Scholarship checks should be issued to the in the amounts \$300. Jayne's scholarship is from the summer. These scholarships were approved at the last BOD meeting.
 - a. Lisa Olack has submitted a scholarship request for Short Course Nationals. The OC recommends approval for her scholarship request. This request requires BOD approval. Note: Approval for these scholarships will result in disbursements of \$1,200 300 of which is from the summer. Checks are requested to be sent to the participants November 25 with the exception of the check for Jayne Spittler which should be mailed as soon as the check can be issued.
- (2) The list of recommended officials for regional and champ meet referees and champ meet lead positions will be updated at the next OC meeting (11/18). The updated list will be shared at the December BOD meeting. Plans are to have the officials for the champ meets identified prior to the end of the year.
- (3) We will be doing what needs to be done to have Senior and Age Group Champs established as 'Officials Qualifying Meets'.
- (4) The fall training clinics have been completed successfully. A glitch occurred at one of the sites regarding pool time with swimmers for officials to train with. Updates to the 'Letter of Understanding' are underway to avoid a repeat. Thanks to the following clinicians who made the training sessions a reality (others were available but not required):

- (5) Changes have been made to the way trainees may make calls during the training sessions and how training sessions count. Those changes are:
 - a. Trainees may make calls beginning with their second training session. An exception to the minimum standards as documented on the USA-S website has been received from the National Officials Chair, Jim Sheehan.
 - i. The trainee will still be under direct supervision of a trained official who will also act as chief judge with overlapping jurisdiction with the trainee. This is not intended to over-officiate the swimmer but to ensure all swimmers are fairly observed while providing a better training situation for our trainees.
 - b. All training sessions will count towards the annual certification requirement. In the past, training sessions did not count towards the annual worked session requirement.
- (6) Emails to officials may now be done much more easily. We are utilizing the ISI email account which does not have the spam limitations of 50/100 emails per hour in conjunction with MS Office 2007/03 capability of doing an email mail merge.
