### **3.3.1 Convention Reimbursement Policy**

The intent of this policy is to cover reasonable travel, lodging and *per diem* expenses for voting members of Illinois Swimming (ISI) attending the USA Swimming (USA-S) National Convention ("delegates") as provided in the ISI annual budget.

The General Chair, Administrative Vice-Chair, Senior Vice-Chair, Age Group Vice-Chair, Coach Representative, and Senior Athlete Representative will receive reimbursement for their travel and lodging expenses. If any of the above delegates are unable to attend and an alternate representative attends in their place, said alternate shall receive reimbursement for their travel and lodging expenses.

1. The General Chair, with the advice and consent of the Board of Directors, may appoint additional delegates to attend the USA-S Convention (up to the extent allowed) when additional votes are made available to ISI, and those voting delegates shall receive reimbursement for their travel and lodging expenses as outlined above, provided that the delegate is currently active on at least one (1) USA Swimming Committee and is active in Illinois Swimming affairs (other than as a Club Coach.).

2. In addition, those ISI members who have a vote at the Convention by reason of a National position with USA-S, shall be reimbursed for their travel and lodging expenses, provided that the representative is also currently active in Illinois Swimming affairs (other than as a Club Coach.).

3. The General Chair, with the advice and consent of the Board of Directors, may also designate full-time members of the ISI Office staff to attend the USA-S Convention; such employees shall also be entitled to receive reimbursement for their travel and lodging expenses as provided for and outlined in the ISI Budget. Whenever appropriate, it is suggested that such employees shall be assigned one of the additional votes granted to ISI by USA-S.

Illinois Swimming March and April 2015 Financial Report

Financial Statements for March, 2015, and April, 2015, are attached. This report covers both months.

#### **Balance Sheet:**

Assets totaled \$1,036,760 as of April 30, 2015. On a year over year basis, assets increased by \$45K, or 4.6%. Biggest drivers of this change were: increases in cash balances (+\$49K) and sponsorships (+\$12K). Housekeeping note: Two dormant checking/money market accounts at Fifth Third Bank have been closed and those balances transferred to the Wintrust checking/money market accounts.

The AEF balance as of April 30, 2015 was \$635K, slightly down from \$638K as of April 30, 2014. However, this is overall net positive, given that \$50,000 was withdrawn from AEF in Fall, 2014 to fund program expenses. Under the ISI Policy & Procedure Manual Section 3.6, only amounts in excess of the minimum fund balance of \$500K approved by the Budget Committee may be used for program expenses.

#### Income:

Year-to-date operating income is \$150K, which is \$21K over the projected year-to-date budget. Year-todate revenue is \$36K under projected year-to-date budget (largely attributable to athlete registrations down by \$48K with positive off-set for additional sponsorship revenue). Year-to-date expenses also are under projected year-to-date budget (\$41K favorable to budget on Club Support). Page 2 of this Report has a Preliminary Year-End Forecast of projected variances to revenue and expense line items through the end of this fiscal year. This is a preliminary forecast, based on staff's current estimates. This will be refined, as we continue through the fiscal year.

#### **Reserves:**

Based upon ISI's current cash position of \$380K, ISI has adequate cash reserves to cover approximately 13 months of budgeted general and administrative expenses.

## PROPOSALS FOR AMENDMENTS TO THE FINA CONSTITUTION SUMMARY

- Changes to the FINA Constitution voted at the extraordinary meeting of the General Congress in Kazan will enter into effect immediately in accordance with the FINA Rule C 15.14.
- A new position of the First Vice President will be created. The FINA Vice President shall have the following roles and duties (C 18.3):
- in the absence of the President conduct the Congresses and FINA
   Bureau meetings with all the rights and duties;
- represent FINA in the absence of the President at FINA Competitions, ceremonies or other activities requiring the presence of the highest FINA authority.
- 3) The First Vice President shall be elected by the extraordinary meeting of the General Congress in 2015 from among the five Vice Presidents. The five Vice Presidents shall propose to the Congress one candidate for the position of the First Vice President from among themselves. This candidate shall be approved by the Congress by a simple majority in accordance with BL 3.5.2. If the candidate does not receive the required votes, the Vice Presidents shall present another candidate to the Congress.
- 4) Composition of FINA Executive

The FINA Executive shall consist of 8 members: President, First Vice President, Honorary Secretary, Honorary Treasurer and 4 Vice Presidents. Each continent must be represented in the FINA Executive (at least one person).

### **International Relations Strategic Priorities**

In January 2013, based on recommendations from the International Relations Committee (IRC), the USA Swimming Board of Directors adopted six strategic priorities. These priorities are to provide focus to USA Swimming actions, and to be touchstones for USA Swimming's volunteer and staff leaders, as well as any delegates and representatives to international events, meetings and congresses.

The six strategic priorities are:

- 1) Autonomy and Sovereignty of the Federation
- 2) Organizational Relationships
- 3) Leadership Development
- 4) Sport Development
- 5) Sport Fairness
- 6) Athlete Safety

Each of these strategic priorities requires consistent attention, with periodic updates based upon the changing landscape of the international sports industry and the Olympic Movement. Accompanying these strategic priorities, USA Swimming has also adopted several operating principles related to the support and funding of various international relations initiatives.

These operating principles are:

- USA Swimming will leverage its involvement by working in alliance with other funding entities. In this way, <u>our engagement can be viewed as a partnership</u>, not merely as a funding source.
- USA Swimming has <u>asked potential beneficiaries to articulate their most urgent</u> <u>priorities</u>, rather than assuming that we understand their needs or providing assistance based upon our convenience.

- USA Swimming has attempted to <u>make decisions about international relations</u> <u>initiatives in a strategic way</u>, rather than acting upon a series of short-term or ad hoc requests, in order to formulate a consistent, well-conceived game plan.
- USA Swimming financial resources, when used to assist others, need to conform to our standards of <u>accountability and transparency</u>, and be <u>undertaken without</u> <u>conflicts of interest</u>.
- USA Swimming operates within the annual operating budget approved by the House of Delegates, wherein funds have been allocated to <u>optimize organizational</u> <u>relationships and alliances</u>.
- USA Swimming recognizes political sensitivities and opportunities to leverage our presence, but fundamentally, we seek to help our sport grow and prosper worldwide. Therefore, while our efforts are not totally selfless, they are driven by a desire to increase the global importance and stature of our sport.

Recognizing the importance of continuity in our international relations efforts, and validating the importance of guiding principles that provide consistency to our initiatives, the IRC Strategy Task Force advances the strategic plan presented as follows:

### 1) Autonomy and Sovereignty of USA Swimming

<u>Objective</u>: Advocate for USA Swimming to select the athletes that represent the United States in international competition and determine the international competitions in which American athletes participate.

- Oppose any changes to Olympic qualification procedures currently in place, particularly Olympic qualification through short course competitions.
- Change Olympic selection procedures for open water swimming from "individuals" to "slots".

### 2) Organizational Relationships

<u>Objective</u>: Create, maintain, and nurture mutually beneficial relationships with international organizations to enable vigorous promotion, development, and growth of our sport.

Prioritize the following:

- Support leadership and sport development opportunities within UANA, with an eye toward strengthening political alliances.
- Engage in communications with other continental organizations in order to cultivate mutually beneficial political partnerships.
- Engage in regular meetings with the FINA leadership to discuss mutual concerns and opportunities.
  - Meetings should be apart from formal FINA meetings or events and generally not more than once a year.
  - Attendance should include the FINA Executive Director and President and the staff and volunteer leadership of USA Swimming (at a minimum).

#### 3) Leadership Development

<u>Objective</u>: Prioritize representation within international sport organizations to ensure influence regarding rules, policies, and procedures that have significant impact for USA Swimming and its athletes.

- Position USA Swimming technical leaders and recognized field-specific experts to occupy leadership positions in UANA and FINA.
- Recognize the importance of leadership succession by creating plans for replacement of current American leaders within international contexts.
- Exert influence to ensure an American representative in a leadership position on the FINA Technical Swimming Committee.

#### 4) Sport Development

#### Objectives:

- Encourage good governance, transparency, and ethical compliance as recommended in the Olympic Agenda 2020, specifically Recommendations 27 (Comply with the basic principles of good governance), 29 (Increase transparency), 31 (Ensure ethical compliance) and 32 (Strengthen ethics).
- Recognize the importance of the continued growth of our sport, through shared technical expertise to improve coaching and officiating capabilities globally and through expansion of low-cost swimming pool construction options

- Advocate and assist in the implementation of Recommendations 27, 29, 31 and 32 in FINA and other associated Olympic organizations.
- Encourage leading coaches and our most knowledgeable technical officials to share their expertise through the FINA Development Programme and other similar sport development initiatives.
- Motivate swimming pool companies to devise low-cost pool options that can be accommodated in open water locations.

### 5) Sport Fairness

<u>Objective</u>: Support agencies and programs that ensure athletes have fair and equitable conditions, particularly when competing at the highest level of sport competition.

Prioritize the following:

#### • Anti-doping:

- Encourage continued scrutiny of WADA regulations, USADA actions, and FINA Doping Panel decisions to ensure that doping violations are vigorously prosecuted, with sanctions appropriate to the banned activity.
- Advocate for strict adherence to WADA regulations by FINA, including enforcement of sanctions against coaches and team personnel who have assisted doping activities and ensuring that sanctioned athletes do not have access to training opportunities during their sanction period.
- Advocate for significant changes to the FINA anti-doping program, including:
  - Full-time professional anti-doping department with scientific expertise.
  - Professionalized target testing program.
  - Expanded blood program.
  - Incorporation of intelligence gathering into the FINA anti-doping program.
  - Transparent, systematic and timely review of national federation decisions.
- Oppose initiatives to modify swimsuit and technical equipment requirements as currently included in FINA By-Laws.

#### 6) Athlete Safety

<u>Objective</u>: Encourage and provide leadership in the development of rules, programs, and procedures that ensure athlete safety during training and competition.

- Monitor progress and suggest improvements to the implementation of FINA open water safety regulations at FINA events worldwide.
- Implement new safety measures in domestic open water events that can be thoroughly tested, and then, recommended for adoption by FINA.
- Exert influence to ensure an American representative in a leadership position on the FINA Technical Open Water Swimming Committee.

Board of Directors:

- 1. Staff Updates
  - a. Swimjitsu is coming to Chicago in July!
  - b. Joel Shinofield continues to work very hard on behalf of college programs nationwide. The CSCAA meeting is May 5-8 in Evanston; I was invited to attend their keynote speaker; Michael Lawrence was in attendance as well.
- 2. Action Items
  - a. IRC Recommendations—these items were explained more eloquently in Michael's report. The athletes have been vocal about ensuring that the number one priority is doping issues—maintaining a clean sport worldwide. USADA was recognized as the recipient of the Max Ritter award at the BOD meeting.
  - b. LSC and Zone Governance Study Proposal—the BOD approved the dollars necessary to conduct the study suggested by the governance committee. More information on this will be forthcoming.
  - c. Diversity & Inclusion Religious Freedom Restoration—the USA Swimming diversity committee met on Sunday following our meeting to discuss this issue. The emphasis is that our membership is prohibited from discriminating against any member pursuant to the code of conduct.

Rules and Regulations Committee

- 1. I will be attending our annual meeting the first weekend in June.
- 2. Several legislation items will impact athletes (more below under AEC).
- 3. I participated in a joint taskforce relating to the 120-Day rule that was chaired by Pam. Legislation will be presented clarifying the method of counting the 120 days referred to by the rule.

### Athletes Executive Committee

- 1. Zone Bylaws
  - a. Legislation is being proposed by the AEC to clarify that 20% of the voting membership of each Zone must be athletes.
- 2. LSC Athlete Representation on standing and ad-hoc committees
  - a. Several committees are not specifically required in the LSC bylaw template to have athletes on them, but it is recommended that inclusion of at least 20% athlete representation be the best practice. The AEC is looking into legislation to correct these issues, but those changes are not expected this year.
- 3. USAS Convention
  - a. We are looking into a collaborative meeting at convention this year between the athlete executive committees from Synchro and Diving to discuss international relations issues.
