- 7. Medical issues
 - 1. Two athletes were seen by paramedics. 1 for being kicked in the face and 1 for having a hard time catching her breath. Both were released to their parents.

6. ISO Observations

 Access to the beach needs to be more restricted in 2024. Parents were initially able to access the beach from the gate next to the concession stand without much resistance. This can be addressed in 2024 by positioning a volunteer at the gate who will monitor access. Also, it is recommended that the locker room/bathroom doors be locked on the road side of the building. Athletes should only be able to access this building from inside the fence. This will keep unauthorized individuals from accessing the beach through the locker room/bathrooms. 2. The system for athletes getting their bag tags when they exit the water should be re-examined. This year, as last, the athletes were instructed to grab their bag tags when they exited the water. However, this year, several athletes either didn't take their tags or took a tag of another swimmer. This led momentarily to a question as to whether there were any swimmers still left in the water. Fortunately, the coaches confirmed that all of their swimmers did exit. It is suggested that in 2024, a volunteer hands the tags back to the athletes and not allow them to take them. This should prevent any issues of tags not being picked up or the wrong tag being picked up.
