HOW TO BECOME A:

Illinois Swimming Junior Official



What is Junior Officiating?

Junior Officials is a new program in USA Swimming that enables athletes 16-17 to become Stroke and Turn Officials. This presentation goes through the initial steps, certification process, and Jr. Official restrictions.




FIRST STEPS


This step requires an administrator from your Club

Before any athlete can become a USA Swimming Junior Official, they must be able to complete the technical training as stated in Rule 102.10.2 through USA Swimming University. To be able to do this, they must be added as a Junior Official to their club's membership list. Once a club administrator adds an athlete as a Jr. Official, in addition to "Athlete," they will be able to complete their training. Athletes will use a link provided to them by their club. **This link is club specific.** Do not share your link with others. Athletes will also need their 14 digit USA Swimming membership ID. It is important that athletes **do not create a second USA swimming membership.**

After accepting the terms, athletes will need to enter their name to agree and continue.

ADDING THE ROLE

Because Jr. Official was added to your membership role, you will see this screen. Here, click "Add new role to existing member." Again, it is important a second role isn't added or a new member isn't registered.


To add Jr Official as a membership role click "Add new role to existing member" and only select "Jr Official".

This will prevent a duplicate Athlete Membership. You will be charged \$17.00 for this added role of Jr Official.


Foundations of Officiating

SAFETY REQUIREMENTS





SafeSport for Youth Athletes

In addition to the **Foundations of Officiating** and the **Stroke and Turn Module**, all Junior Officials must complete the **Safe Sport for Athletes 13-17** and **Concussion Protocol Training**.

Concussion Protocol Training

You may have already completed the SafeSport module for athletes aged 13-17 for SafeSport Recognition for your club. Nevertheless, it needs to be completed and current to become a Junior Official.

UNIFORM

ALL Officials must be wearing the same outfit!

To fit in with your fellow officials, while on deck as an Junior Official, you <u>must</u> be wearing the appropriate uniform. The required attire for a USA Swimming Official is **a white shirt over blue**

bottoms, as well as white socks and shoes.







GUIDELINES

Remember you are representing IL Swimming while Officiating!

Once you complete your online training and receive an email from the Illinois Swimming Officials Committee you are ready to begin your <u>4 required supervised Officiating sessions</u> to complete your certifications. Please keep in mind the following:

- Need four sessions of supervised officiating to finish the certification process
- When you complete your online training, you will get an email from officials@ilswim.org
 - Can only officiate sessions the junior official is NOT swimming in
 - Cannot officiate for an LSC championship meet (ALL Regionals and State Meets)
