Cavan received Direct Admit to the Motorsports Engineering Program at IUPUI. This means he will begin Motorsports Engineering classes from the first semester. Cavan also received the Jaguar Excellence Award 4 year scholarship for his good grades in high school. He will start school in the Fall of 2022 and graduate in the class of 2026. The Motorsports Engineering Program at IUPUI is considered the best Bachelors program in the U.S. for open wheel racing and he will have internships and jobs in racing during his time at school. Cavan wants to become a Lead Racing Engineer. His internship for next semester at NHS will be to spend the 19 weeks designing, building, and testing a race car. He will have experiences with a F1/Indycar engineer and a driver, a top DAG (Data Acquisitions Guy) in Indycar, a top Gearbox guy in Indycar, a painter at Andretti Motorsports, and time at the wind tunnel with McLaren Racing. When Cavan went for an interview with the director of the program, he found out the director was a swimmer when he was younger. The director was impressed that Cavan was a competitive swimmer, coach, athlete representative and volunteer along with doing well in school. They like to know that incoming freshmen can balance the hard classes with time spent doing internships and group projects. Being able to take classes at NHS like AP Physics, Aerospace Engineering PLTW and Digital Electronics helped Cavan know engineering was for him.
