Indianapolis, IN - Thirty CPSC swimmers took to the blocks down at the IUPUI Natatorium, March 16-18, and came out tops in NWI and 4th place overall at the Age Group State Championships. Scoring a

total of 678 total points, the Bulldogs walked away with 11 individual team records (Aly Tetzloff - 50 Free, 50 Back, 100 Back, 200 Back / Hannah Kukurugya - 500 Free, 200 Fly, 200 IM / Kelsi Artim - 100 Breast, 200 Breast / Jake Hektoen - 50 Free), 4 relay team records (13-14 Girls 200 Free & 400 Free relays, 200 Medley & 400 Medley relays), 2 individual State Champions (Kelsi Artim - 100 & 200 Breast), 1 relay State



Champion (13-14 Girls 400 Medley Relay), 6 individual runner ups (Hannah Kukurugya - 500 Free & 200 Fly / Aly Tetzloff - 50 Free, 100 & 200 Back, 100 Fly), 1 relay runner up finish (13-14 Girls 200 Medley Relay), one swimmer achieving 2 Grand Prix cuts (Kelsi Artim - 100 & 200 Breast), and 1 relay State Record (13-14 Girls 400 Medley Relay).



It was an amazing finish to a great season that had 14 of the 23 individual state swimmers scoring individual points helping CPSC to achieve the second best finish ever in club history!

Indianapolis, IN - March 29-31. It was a collection of some of the greatest US Olympic swimmers in recent years. Cullen Jones, Brendan Hansen, Missy Franklin, Christine Magnason, Amanda Weir, Dara Torres, Ryan Lochte, Jessica Hardy, Dana Vollmer, Katie Hoff, Kate Zeigler, Arianna Kukors, Anthony Ervin, Nick Brunelli, Nathan Adrian, Peter Vanderkaay, Amanda Beard, Tyler Clary, Ed Moses, and Michael Phelps, just to name a few....

And right there in the thick of all the races was four of Crown Point Swim Club's finest swimmers.

With television camera's on and screaming fans in the stands, Hannah Kukurugya, Aly Tetzloff, Connor Wood, & Holly Schuster posted a season best 93.75% best times and set 11 CPSC team records in the process. Thursday's races seemed to set the tone for the whole meet. Aly Tetzloff dropped 2.2 seconds in the 100 Freestyle and finished 64th out of 173 entrants. Next up was Connor Wood in the 200 Breaststroke, where he dropped 10 seconds and finished 57th out of 79. Finishing off the days events were Aly Tetzloff and Hannah Kukurugya in the 100 Butterfly. Tetzloff took of 5.8 seconds and Kukurugya shaved off nearly a full second to end up 78th and 42nd respectively, out of 139 entrants.

Friday started off with an amazing race in the 400 IM. Hannah Kukurugya dropped a full 7

seconds to end up finishing 20th and qualifying for the evening finals. Tetzloff continued the great performances with a 3.6 second drop in her 200 Backstroke and finished tied for 48th out of 100. The last event of the preliminary swims had both Kukrugya and Tetzloff in the 50 Free. Both girls dropped time, Tetzloff dropped .5 of a second and Kukrugya dropped .9 of a second to finish tied for 94th and 104th, respectively, out of 155 entrants. In the Saturday Finals, CPSC's only final swim came from Hannah Kukuruyga in swimming's most challenging event, the 400 IM. While she did not drop time from the morning's preliminary swim, she still finished 5.7 seconds faster than her entry time and ended up 21st overall in the event.

On the final day of the meet, Saturday held the most swims for CPSC with all four swimmers participating in 2 events. Hannah Kukrugya swam the 200 Fly and 200 IM and dropped 1.5 and .8 seconds, respectively to finish 36th (out of 62) and 52nd (out of 151) in her last two races. Holly Schuster swam both the 100 Breaststroke, where she dropped .9 of a second and finished 70th out of 98, and the 200 IM where she ended up finishing 85th out of 151 entrants. Connor Wood, fighting back a fever and chills, gutted out both the 100 Breaststroke and 200 IM to drop just over 1 second in both and finish 62nd (out of 73) and 84th (out of 99), respectively. Aly Tetzloff's last two events for the meet, the 100 Backstroke and 200 IM, produced drops of 1.2 seconds and .7 seconds, respectively, to end up finishing 51st and 47th overall.
