- 1. The legislative items will be considered in block order.
- 2. Section A contains items which have been withdrawn by the maker. If there is no objection from the House, the items will be considered withdrawn.
- Sections B and C will be considered as omnibus motions, except for those items pulled for discussion.
 Within the block, delegates will be given the opportunity to pull items. Section D will be considered one item
 at a time. Changes to the rules adopted because of changes by FINA are informational only and are not
 included in any block.
- 4. To pull an item, type "PULL R-#" in the "Ask a Question" box with your name and LSC or committee in the LUMI Global platform. Anonymous requests will not be recognized.
- 5. Items pulled will be considered in numerical order after the respective omnibus motion.
- 6. Omnibus motions are in the affirmative as motions to approve the block of items.
- 7. Other motions should generally be stated in the affirmative.
- 8. Any amendment requires simple majority for approval. The subsequent amended main motion will require the original percentage (majority, 2/3 or 90%). An entirely new item will require 90% for adoption.
- If you wish to speak to an item, please reference the attached LUMI Global instructions which can also be found at https://www.usaswimming.org/about-usas/governance/convention-2020. Anonymous requests will not be recognized.
- 10. The LUMI Global platform will be used for all voting matters.
- 11. A main motion may only have two amendments pending at any one time.

The makers have requested these items be withdrawn. If there is no objection, a motion authorizing withdrawal of these items will be considered passed EXCEPT if pulled.



How to Login

After Logging in

- After logging into the virtual platform, you must connect your Computer Audio to the Zoom Webinar that is inside the Lumi Platform. To do this:
 - Click on the blue "Join Audio by Computer" button that pops up on the right Zoom panel of the virtual platform.








Speaking during the virtual meeting

• Once the Chair opens the Speaking Queue, if you wish to request to speak, click the messaging icon in the upper menu bar:




- 1. Use the quick terms guide to enter your intent to speak in the text box at the bottom of the screen and hit the 'send' arrow icon to send your message into the queue.






2. The Chair will announce the order of delegates to speak. **WHEN** you are called upon to speak by the Chair, <u>raise your hand in the Zoom Platform</u> on the right side of the screen:




3. Once the production staff have enabled your microphone, <u>Firstly</u> you will be prompted to click "ALLOW" on the pop up from your web browser to give your browser access to your microphone, (you only need to do this the first time you speak).



4. **Next**, you will unmute your microphone in Zoom:



Voting during the virtual meeting


- When a motion / election is put before the meeting, the voting will automatically pop up within the

Accessing documents during the virtual meeting



Pro Tips

The following are tips to prepare for the best virtual meeting experience:

- You must join the meeting on a desktop or laptop computer, do not join on a mobile device.
- We do recommend using **Chrome** web browser for the best experience. Microsoft Edge is also supported browser. Do not use Internet Explorer.
- If possible, connect to the Internet via an Ethernet cable. If using WiFi, ensure that you are close to your wireless router and that your connection is stable.
- Headsets are helpful for hearing audio more clearly.
- Should you hit the Zoom 'Full Screen' button, be sure to hit 'Escape' on your keyboard to take you back to the side by side view to access voting and the speaking queue.





Getting Connected

The following are tips for getting connected to the virtual meeting:



Each Local Swimming Committee (LSC) has been authorized by USA Swimming to issue the sanction or approval for all swimming competition and benefits, exhibitions, clinics and entertainment involving competitive swimming within its geographical boundaries, except that USA Swimming shall sanction all open water competitions and national swimming competitions as defined by the President/CEO or his/her designee. Additional requirements/conditions for sanction or approval, other than those listed in Article 202, may be established by a vote of the LSC House of Delegates in accordance with LSC Bylaws.

- .1 Jurisdiction of the Rules & Regulations Committee The USA Swimming Rules & Regulations Committee is authorized and directed to assume jurisdiction over (a) changes to the mandatory portions of the Required LSC Bylaws, (b) approval of the use of certain alternative provisions set forth in Required LSC Bylaws, (c) review and approval of all Bylaws adopted by the LSCs and (d) review and approval of all subsequent amendments to the Bylaws by an LSC and related matters. The USA Swimming Rules & Regulations Commit-tee may adopt rules and procedures to govern the invocation and exercise of this jurisdiction which may be appropriate and helpful and in the best interests of the sport of swimming.
- .2 Request for Approval An LSC may request permission to change mandatory provisions of the Required LSC Bylaws or request an approval as required in Required LSC Bylaws in a written application conforming to the rules and procedures adopted by the USA Swimming Rules & Regulations Committee. The request shall be addressed to the Chair of the USA Swimming Rules & Regulations Committee. The approval power of the USA Swimming Rules & Regulations Committee over requested changes to mandatory parts of the Bylaws shall be applied generously where an LSC demonstrates a need for the changes.
- .3 Action by Committee The changes may be approved or disapproved in their entirety, or the USA Swimming Rules & Regulations Committee may modify the requested change as appears to be in the best interests of swimming. The USA Swimming Rules & Regulations Committee may adopt reasonable rules and procedures regarding the form and content of the application for permission, its deliberations and decisions.
- .4 Deadline for Decision The USA Swimming Rules & Regulations Committee shall make its determination within forty-five (45) days of receipt by its Chair of the request; failing which, the request shall be deemed to have been approved unless the Chair shall certify that more than ten (10) approvals are pending at the end of that period.

- .1 The annual meeting of the House of Delegates shall be held at any date, time, and place, <u>including via telecommunication</u>, as may be fixed in the notice of such meeting.
- .2-.4 [no changes]
- .5 Each member shall have one (1) vote on each matter submitted to the House of Delegates. There shall be no voting by proxy. At all meetings of the House of Delegates only those members duly certified and present (including virtually present at all meetings conducted via telecommunication) shall be permitted to vote.
