7:02 pm – 17/22 Quorum of at least 12 reached – BOD Meeting called to order by General Chair, Matt Craven

- 1. Welcome remarks from Matt Craven including notice that Jamie Bloom resigned due to a change in her circumstances and will announce her replacement at the end of the meeting.
- **2. Secretary's Report, Michelle Mitchell:** Edits needed on the minutes from the June 7, 2016 meeting from Rick Osterberg and Betsy Russell were discussed. Motion to table acceptance of minutes made and seconded. Motion passes unanimously.
- **3.** Treasurer's Report Joe Frazier recited account balances for the record. Joe indicated that finances are experiencing normal ebbs and flows all very typical.

Carol reviewed club grants indicating repeat and new applicants. Carol solicited assistance from a coach and an official to revamp the grant in order to encourage smaller club's participation.

Shout outs were given to several clubs who achieved the highest percentages: Phoenix Swimming for the highest IMX participation at 88%. NSSC for hosting the most calendar meets at 19. ABF for achieving the highest number of performance athletes in the NE Championships and ACES Aquatics for the highest retention rate of 111%

- **4.** Treasurer's Report accepted into record by way of acclamation.
- **5. USA Swimming Convention** A total of 17 individuals from the LSC plan to attend. Matt asked the attendees to refer to website for scheduled meetings and report in on what meetings they will attend so that we have optimal coverage. A NE Swimming scavenger hunt is planned for the NE attendees.
- **6. Awards Banquet/Clinic Update** The Awards Banquet is planned for October 2 at the Newton Marriott with a "comfort food" buffet. Carol solicited assistance and attendance from board members. Elizabeth Beisel is the keynote speaker. Elizabeth will also be giving a clinic on October 1 that filled up within 4 hours of opening on Sept 1st. The Awards Banquet is near capacity of 600 attendees.

7. Calendar Committee - Matt Craven

- a. LCM season wrap up
- **b.** SCY season 11-14 Age Group Championships will be held at Boston University in 2017. Discussion of the non-progression Championship meets time line for swimmers that have an inconvenient birthday prompted the AG Chair, Sean Geary, to promise to discuss with his committee on different solutions and will bring it back to the board at the next meeting.

8. Committee Reports

a. Senior Committee Report - Chuck Batchelor commented that the recent LCM Senior championship meet was a success. The SC Senior meet will take place in December, 2016 and will include bonus

cuts. The 15-18 Age Group meet will take place in the Spring of 2017.

- **b. Age Group Committee Report** Sean Geary noted the recent 11-14 LC Champs that took place at Harvard was well run and certain issues were noted to correct next year. For the upcoming SC Champs meet, awards will be given one event later in attempts to keep the meet moving efficiently but to give the timing operators and swimmers a pause.. The new cut times for SC are ready. Carol Healey indicated that they will be posted on the NE Swim website by Thursday, September 15.
- c. Coaches' Report No report made as Marshall Muir and Nick Rice were absent.
- d. Officials' Report Paul Memont commented that Betsy Russell and Joanie Beisel are attending the Convention, Tristin Mannion and Matt Soska are attending the Officials Clinic for New Referees and that Ken Galica is attending the Mentoring Clinic. In addition, it was agreed that a standard protocol is needed to address the issue of hospitality for officials including budgetary consideration. Hospitality varies across teams and should be standardized and supported in support of officials who volunteer long hours. Alan Sanders is heading this effort.
- e. Athletes' Report Elise Atkinson presented that they their mission statement is currently available on the Athlete page of the NE Swim website. They are also planning a November-December newsletter and are searching for a relevant topic.
- f. Inclusion Report Nadine Johnson-Jesionek plans to leave her post once a successor is identified. Nadine shared recent events including an inner-city meet, an equipment donation event, a clinic where Ree Jeffrey, former Olympian, visited. Nadine also attended the Diversity & Aquatics convention in Florida where boy scouts and adults including an 80 year old learned to swim. Nadine was moved by the impact of the convention.
- g. **Technical Report** Laura Matsuzak presented the following:
 - Attached proposals
 - SWIM MEET WEB POSTING APPROVAL #1 Laura Matuszak motioned to pass, Joe Frazier and Rick Osterberg seconded the motion, Motion passed unanimously. Note Official results should link to NE Swim website with a permanent link.
 - DISTANCE EVENT ENTRY FEE INCREASE PROPOSAL #1 Laura Matuszak motioned to pass, Joe Frazier and Rick Osterberg seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.
 - TIME TRIAL EVENT ENTRY FEE INCREASE PROPOSAL #1 Matt Craven motioned to pass. Motion passed unanimously.
 - LOTTERY PROCESS FOR NON-NEW ENGLAND TEAMS DURING THE LONG COURSE SEASON PROPOSAL #1 – Laura Matuszak motioned, Rick Osterberg seconded the motion, Motion passes 7-0-8.
 - ON DECK CREDENTIALS FOR OFFICIALS AND COACHES #1 The Board first voted unanimously to amend language to say '...all coaches and officials will receive a bracelet, ink stamp or other identifier from meet host (to demonstrate current credentials)...'. Secondly, the Board voted unanimously to adopt this change. Note all language changes should be consistent throughout the document.
 - Additional Items Discussed
 - There was a discussion of whether invoices should be presented to substantiate bids. No agreement was reached.
 - Carol Healey expressed that NE Swim should run championship meets as meet hosts many times complain about the burden of doing this. No conclusion was reached at the time.
 - Brief discussion on some technical proposals
- h. Safe Sport Report None, as Anne Kaufman was absent.
- i. Office Report Carol Healey shared that the office is still based out of her home no office space has been identified yet. Carol requested that everyone complete the LSC Leadership course on the US Swim website (link emailed) before the time of the next board meeting.
- j. Safety Report Priscilla Davis expressed the need for report of occurrence forms. There have been several 'bottom strikes' which are being reviewed including depth of water and height of blocks. Athletes should follow diving progression to avoid bottom strikes. This could be a good topic/education point for the upcoming Athlete newsletter. Priscilla plans to prepare a safety document on this subject.

9. Zones Report –A summary of the recent Zone meet in NY was presented and reviewed. Ninety-eight swimmers participated. Many personal best times were achieved. Refer to report for details.

10. Appointments –

- Nadine Johnson-Jesionek remains the Inclusion Chair while a search for a successor takes place.
- With the advice and consent of the Board, Matt moved to appoint Brian Crawford (SC) to the position of Vice Chair. Brian is knowledgeable, organized and a top notch coach. The Board unanimously agreed and the motion passed. This appointment stands until the May, 2017 House of Delegates meeting at which time it will be revisited. It is not an automatic progression.

11. New Business -

- For reimbursement of Inclusion meet expenses, there is a \$7,500 cap in the Budget. This can include a combination of expenses from five meets. There is a maximum of 3 meets per swimmer. Joe Frazier motioned to pass. Rick Osterberg seconded. Motion passed with 13-0-1.
- LSC Camp at the Olympic Training Center for swimmers 13&U.
- **12. Next Meeting Date/Closing** The next meeting date will be announced by email and posted to the NE Swim website.

 - 2. Meet Announcement Posted On Host Team Website
 - a. Meet announcements posted on host team websites must be posted on an individual website page, dedicated to the meet information for one meet only. This website page must to linked from the New England Swimming calendar website with a perpetual, non-recycled URL.

This policy will take effect on April 1, 2017.

Clerical Note: Update the numbering under F. Meet Entry Acceptance

Additional Clerical Note: The New England Swimming Office is required to archive all New

England Swimming sanctioned and approved meet results, meet information and meet event files.

DISTANCE EVENT ENTRY FEE INCREASE PROPOSAL #1 ADOPTED

Technical Committee recommends that this motion be considered.

Background: At the request of New England Swimming member teams, the Technical Committee seeks to increase the meet entry fee for distance events, 400 yards and longer, and to add the \$.75 surchage for distance events, 400 yards and longer.

LOTTERY PROCESS FOR NON-NEW ENGLAND TEAMS DURING THE LONG COURSE SEASON PROPOSAL #1

ADOPTED

Technical Committee recommends that this motion be considered.

Background: The Technical Committee seeks to update the procedures for the lottery process of meet entry acceptance during the long course season to protect New England Swimming teams.

Change the following sections of the New England Swimming Policies and Procedures:

- II. SWIM MEET POLICIES AND PROCEDURES
 - H. Meet Policies
 - 1. General Policies For All Meets
 - f. Lottery: If a meet becomes oversubscribed, and if there are two or more entering teams tied in sequence of receipt, a lottery shall be conducted by the New England Swimming office to determine the sequence that the tied teams will be accepted into the meet. The New England Swimming office will share the results of the lottery with all teams participating in the lottery. For all long course meets, non-New England Swimming teams (including Maine) will be selected last in the lottery process.

This policy will take effect on April 1, 2017.

ON DECK CREDIENTIALS FOR OFFICIALS AND COACHES #1

Technical Committee recommends that this motion be considered.

Background: The Technical Committee seeks to update the procedures ensuring that all USA Swimming Officials and Coaches have visible deck credentials at all New England Swimming sanctioned and approved meets.

Change the following sections of the New England Swimming Policies and Procedures:

- II. SWIM MEET POLICIES AND PROCEDURES
 - L. Running a Swim Meet
 - 4. USA Swimming Memberships Cards: New England Swimming policy requires that all coaches and officials display their membership cards <u>or Deck Pass</u> while on deck at swim meets. The Meet Director, and all those working on deck at a meet, excluding Marshals and Timers, must be registered with USA Swimming.

As of September 1, 2015, Official's membership cards are considered their white card printed from OTS, not a colored card sent from the NES office. All Officials must display their white cards on deck at swim meets.

The meet host will check the credentials of every coach on deck at the meet. Coaches may present their Deck Pass membership card, their New England Swimming printed membership card or their membership card printed from the USA Swimming website.

Coaches who are eligible to be on deck based on their USA Swimming coaching credentials

will receive a bracelet, an ink stamp on their hand or other visible identification for the meet from the meet host.

The Meet Referee will ask any "coach" without a card visible identification to leave the deck without exception. The referee will also make a list of all those without cards visible identification. The list will be sent to the New England Swimming office to be checked. If a "coach" who was asked to leave the deck is found not to be fully registered (current certifications in CPR, Safety Training for Swim Coaches, the background screen, and completed education requirement) the "coach will be fined \$100.00 and the team will be fined \$200.00 to be paid within 30 days. Any "coach" who refuses to leave the deck will cause the team's swimmers to swim unattached for the remainder of the meet.

This policy will take effect on April 1, 2017.

Additional Items Discussed:

- 1. Distance session subsidies will remain in place.
- 2. The request to increase Observation Fees to \$10.00 per splash was removed.
- 3. The New England Swimming Office and the New England Swimming Technical Committee is collaborating to address to potential need for a premium facility fee. We will create a Task Force with a coach, a parent, an official and a swimmer on it to survey the New England Swimming community. We are also seeking philosophical guidance from the New England Swimming Board of Directors later in this meeting.
- 4. The New England Swimming Technical Committee is seeking guidance from the New England Swimming community regarding long course meet entry acceptance policies, specifically concerning the allowance on non-New England Swimming teams within the 75% of accepted teams in our long course calendar meets.
- 5. All New England Swimming community members are reminded that host teams are required to fulfill all of the duties and responsibilities for running sanctioned and approved meets. Host teams are not permitted to assign attending teams to provide timers or other meet staff. Attending teams may choose to provide volunteer timers and volunteer meet staff, but the conditions of their acceptance into the 75% of accepted teams must not be dependent upon such support. The updated meet announcement template will reflect this rule reminder.
- 6. The request to prevent officials from directly notifying 12 and younger swimmers of disqualifications was rejected as it is in conflict with USA Swimming policy which states that "an attempt be made to notify either the coach or swimmer of a disqualification." All coaches and teams are reminded that they may notify the Meet Referee before the meet start regarding the special needs of their athletes so that the officials can make the appropriate notification based on the athletes' individual needs.
- 7. The New England Swimming Office is working to update the meet template for the Long Course 14 and Under Championship Meet as well as the Board Member Guidelines and Responsibilities and the Committee Chair Responsibilities.
- 8. The New England Swimming Technical Committee will present the Athlete Reimbursement Policy at the January meeting of the New England Swimming Board of Directors.
