- To qualify for the Mid Penn Conference Championships, swimmers must have swam the entered event during the current high school season in an official PIAA meet and can produce documentation to support that race, if requested. The time above does not guarantee entry into the meet, they are for guidelines only. The number of participants will be based on the **Top 32 times** for relay events and the **Top 32 times** for individual events. Each team shall be permitted to enter a maximum of 1 (4 alternates) relay in the relay events and 4 individuals in the individual events.
- In order to provide sufficient recovery time between Championship races, medals will be given and swimmers recognized after the Boys race for each swimming event. *The coach of the each medal-winning swimmer will present the medal to their athlete.*
- **The order of swimming events will be as follows for the Mid Penn Championships (starting Friday)**  
1. 200 Medley Relay, 2. 200 Freestyle, 3. 200 Individual Medley, 4. 50 Free, 5. 100 Butterfly, 6. 200 Freestyle Relay, **(starting Saturday)** 7. 100 Freestyle, 8. 500 Freestyle, 9. 100 Backstroke, 10. Breastroke, 11. 400 Freestyle Relay (32).
- Mid Penn Plunge at Northern High School
  - The Mid Penn Plunge is an alternative end-of-the-season meet held the Friday and Saturday after the Mid Penn Championships at Northern High School. This year will also include a Diving competition at a date to be determined. Divers who dive at the MPC Championships will not be eligible for the Plunge Diving meet.
  - The two-day Mid Penn Plunge provides a competition opportunity for swimmers from all Mid Penn Conference high schools who have swimming and diving teams (swim schools) and do not participate in the Mid Penn Championship Swimming Meet (athletes may dive at Mid Penns and swim at the Plunge) and from area non-swim schools.
  - A Mid Penn swimmer may swim in either the Mid Penn Swimming Championships or the Mid Penn Plunge, but not both. An athlete may dive at the Mid Penn Diving Championships and swim at the Mid Penn Plunge, as long as they abide by the event limitation across both meets.
