

ON DECK:

Announcer:

- Like to talk? Want to be close to the action? Being the meet announcer could be your thing!
- Read off names for each heat with their lane numbers.
- Home meets only

Console Operator:

- On the job training is necessary.
- Must be trained or willing to learn console takes times from touchpads and puts them into the computer
- Home meets only

❖ Officials:

- These are trained and certified volunteers. Trainings are in September and October each year
- All of the officials below must be 21 years of age or older.
- Administrative Official
 - Duties:
 - Supervises the entry/registration process, scoring, ensuring equipment operating correctly.
 - ◆ Accurate processing of entries & scratches (seeding meet).
 - ◆ Certifying times are correct and recorded properly.
 - ♦ Recording DQs approved by Referee.
 - ♦ Determination and publication of the official results
 - Home meets only
- Level 1 Official
 - The stroke, turn and relay take-off judge of meets.
 - Must start as a level 1 before becoming a Level 2.
 - Home & Away meets



- Level 2 Official
 - The Referee, Starter and Chief Judge of meets.
 - Can also be the stroke, turn and relay take-off judge of meets.
 - Must start as a level 1 before becoming a Level 2. Served a minimum of 8 sessions as a Level 1 Official.
 - Home & Away meets
- Meet Manager Operator
 - Uses Meet Manager Software to download times from the Console and works with the Admin Official to ensure the times are accurate.
 - Home meets only

❖ Orca Wranglers:

- Bring swimmers from the 8 & Under, 9-10s and 11-12s behind the blocks for their events.
- Home & Away meets

Photographer:

- Someone to take pictures on deck (you will be allowed on deck but not behind blocks) to take candid shots of the swimmers.
- Will then email Bryn pictures so she can email out to the team.
 - Home meets only

❖ Place Judge:

- Can you write down the numbers 1 through 6 or 8? If so, you can do this job.
- You will sit at the finish line and write down the order of each head by lane number.
- You are just the back up to the touchpads, plungers and stopwatches.
- Only hazard to the job is getting splashed!
- Home & Away meets



❖ Runner:

- No, you don't actually run, you walk quickly.
 - This person gets the event cards from the head timer and takes them to the scorer's table. Another job where you can be close to the swimmers!

❖ Timers:

- Timers Behind the Blocks
 - Easy job, and best view of the swimmers!
 - Press the button on the stopwatch at the start, press it again when the swimmer in your lane finishes, and write the time down.
 - Home & Away meets
- Back Up Timer:
 - Yup, this is another job with a stop-watch.
 - You start the watch just like the other timers but are there only if somebody goofs up – then you hand your watch over to them.
 - Easy, right?
 - Home meets only

OFF DECK:

❖ Snack Bar:

- Home meets only
- Snack Bar Set-Up:
 - Report to the snack bar after dropping off your swimmer.
 - You'll help set out the food and get everything ready for the hungry hordes.
- Snack Bar Workers:



- Report to the snack bar before the meet starts to sell the items at the snack bar.
- You will ALWAYS get to break away to see your swimmer compete!
- Snack Bar Break-Down:
 - Does your swimmer take forever to get out of the locker room? Well, then, might as well be productive and help take down the snack bar while you wait!
 - You will pack up the snack bar into bins neatly for the next meet.

❖ Volunteer Check-In

- Check in volunteers to ensure everyone has shown up to do their jobs.
