CENTRAL MINNESOTA AQUATICS CODE OF CONDUCT

All people associated with the Central Minnesota Aquatics Swim Team are expected to act with sportsmanship, dignity and respect for others always (practices, locker rooms, meets, other).

This includes coaches, swimmers, staff, parents, and officials. Poor sportsmanship includes:

- 1. Arguing with coaches, officials, teammates, parents, opponents or spectators,
- 2. Using threatening or profane language,
- 3. Baiting or taunting coaches, officials, parents, teammates, opponents or spectators,
- 4. Uncontrolled behavior on the deck and in spectator areas.

Poor sportsmanship will carry, at a minimum, the following consequences, which will be enforced by the Head Coach and Board of Directors:

- First Offense: Verbal warning/reminder
- Second Offense: Removal from practice and parent contacted.
- Third Offense: Meeting with Board member, Coach, Parent and Swimmer
- Fourth Offense: Dismissal from the Team

Anywhere between the first and fourth offense, dismissal from a meet may be a consequence.
