Code of Conduct

The following is applicable at all team practices, as well as home and away meets

The following conduct is prohibited:

- Obscene or abusive language and/or behavior
- Inappropriate displays of affection
- Offensive clothing
- Fighting, taunting, bullying, or threatening remarks and/or gestures
- Smoking
- Pets
- Irresponsible or destructive behavior
- Any and all actions that may cause a disruption or hinder the enjoyment of the facility.
- Theft or destruction of personal or public property
- *Swimmers shall respect and show courtesy to their teammates, opponents, volunteers and coaches at all times.
- *If a parent/swimmer has an issue with a coach please take the issue to the Administrative Director.
- *Be on time and ready to get in the water for warm ups.
- *Bring extra caps and goggles, put your name on all of your things.
- *No dunking, foul language, hanging on lane lines, splashing, spitting, hitting, trash talking, belittling or any other behavior deemed as horseplay is allowed.
- *Swimmers are expected to exhibit good sportsmanship at all times.
- *If a swimmer/parent has an issue with another swimmer they must see the Administrative Director and shall not approach the swimmer/parent.
- *Swimmers/parents shall never confront an official about a DQ. This is the coach's responsibility.
- *Swimmers/parents are required to be respectful and courteous to all meet volunteers at all times. If you have an issue please see the Administrative Director.
- *Destruction of bathrooms/facilities and theft of property will be prosecuted under law. The swimmer and family of the swimmer will be responsible for all damages and fees incurred upon collection or prosecution of damages.
