CHANGES FOR STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS

Some changes were made by the House of Delegates that will change the format of the state championships. All 8 and Under events will be Saturday and Sunday, rather than Friday and Saturday. The 400 freestyle relay will be Friday and the 200 freestyle relay will be on Sunday. Individual entries at the Montana State Championships will be limited to six individual events and three relay events, with a maximum of three individual events per day. In the past we have had a limit of seven individual events. Furthermore, Montana Swimming will combine the 15-16 and 17-19 age groups at the State Championships to a 15 and Over age group. Finals and consolation finals will be combined. See your coach for details of scoring, awards and qualifying times for this age group.

SPRING MEETING ANNOUNCEMENT

The Montana Swimming House of Delegates will hold their spring meeting in Bozeman May 20th after the Bozeman swim meet. Nominations for Male and Female Athlete of the Year as well as the Phillips 66 Award will be accepted and voted on.

ATHLETE REPRESENTATIVE ELECTIONS CHANGED
