Montana Swimming Spring House of Delegates Meeting Minutes

May 24, 2025

Virtual Meeting

The 2025 spring meeting of the Montana Swimming House of Delegates was a virtual meeting and was called to order at 10:00 a.m. on Saturday, May 24, by General Chair Jay Friend.

The meeting notice, which was duly and properly given, was posted on the LSC website, and emailed to clubs and board members. The meeting agenda is found in the appendix. Roll call was taken and those in attendance signified they were present. The attendance sheet is in the appendix. A quorum was present, and the meeting proceeded.

Welcome, General Announcements, and Introductions: General Chair Jay Friend welcomed everyone to the meeting.

Old Business

At Large Voting Delegates: The at large adult voting delegates were appointed at the fall HOD meeting.

- The at large adult board voting delegates include Records Chair Sean Marshall, Officials Chair Eric Belasco, Technical Planning Chair Beth Storey, and the Operational Risk Chair which Jay is the interim chair. At this meeting only Eric Belasco will be voting as an at large delegate. Beth Storey was absent. Sean Marshall voted for BAC.
- The elected athlete representatives present and voting at the meeting include Ellyn Lewis, Teague McElwee, PJ Delhomme, and Kaleb Montgomery.
- Brady Baughman will vote as the coach representative.
- The voting board members will include General Chair Jay Friend, Admin Vice Chair Eddie Lary, Program Development Vice Chair Jessica Marshall, Program Operations Chair Laura Parvey-Connors, Secretary Susan Huckleby, and Coach Representative Brady Baughman.
- The at large athlete voting delegates include Tyler Zarbock, BAC; William Wussow, BOZ; Trigve Chvilicek, BMA; Ella Kingsland, GFST; Asher Renshaw, HOT; and Lilianna Smith, HAV.

Agenda: The final agenda was posted on the website. There were no additions or changes.

Meeting Minutes: It was moved and seconded that the meeting minutes from the October 2024 House of Delegates meeting be approved as presented. The motion passed.

Reports of Officers: Written reports by the officers are posted on the website and are included in the appendix. Oral reports are summarized below.

- General Chair Jay Friend reported he and the board have had several conversations with Jane Grosser, LSC team services representative, on challenges in the LSC and ways to overcome those challenges such as funding and state meet bids and discussed the survey taken by USA Swimming. Mike Novell from Colorado is the new USA Swimming coach services person and will work with Montana Swimming.

- Admin Vice Chair Eddie Lary said he is getting to know the Montana Swimming coaches. He has been in Montana for one year now. He is talking with USA Swimming about what they can offer our athletes and teams.
- Treasurer's Report: Treasurer Matt Yovich was absent and sent his reports to Jay. Jay reported spending is on track with the budget. Matt suggested not changing the championship meet fees for next year.
- Program Development Chair Jessica Marshall had no report.
- Program Operations (Zones) Chair: Laura Parvey-Connors report is posted on the website. There are approximately 21 athletes interested in attending age group zones and senior zones this summer. There is a link on the zones page to sign up. Gear orders open June 1 and close June 25. Arena is again partnering with the LSC to offer a 30% discount on tech suits. Arena will donate backpacks to the team members. Again, this year the 'AA' time standards will be the qualifying time for zones for Montana Swimming. Swimmers who have a 'AAA' zones qualifying time will be entered in their events first. Swimmers with 'AA' times will be entered using the 160 bonus splashes available to the team.
- Secretary, DDEI, Times, Registration, and IT chair Susan Huckleby's reports are posted on the website. She congratulated Kaia Lyons, BOZ, on swimming a national top 10 time as a 12 year old in the 100 yard breaststroke with a time of 1:07.16 at the 2025 SN Southwest Regional Age Group Championships. Sy Pizzaloto, BAC, was awarded the spring Montana Swimming Reach Out grant to help offset his costs competing with Team USA at the 2025 Deaflympics in Tokyo in November. Applications for Scholastic All America open June 1 and close September 30.
- Coach Update: Kristen Wyatt reported she attended a meeting with Jane Grosser. The coach representatives want to bring back the coach retreat. They will work with USA Swimming to bring a coach clinic to or near Montana in the future. There are some teams with new head coaches and new assistant coaches. She requests each team send her a list of their coaches and their contact information.
- Ellyn Lewis and Teague McElwee introduced the new junior athlete representatives PJ Delhomme, MYST, and Kaleb Montgomery, BAC. Elly reported they attended the virtual Western Zone athlete meeting and learned some good things to bring back to the LSC.
- Operational Risk interim chair Jay Friend asked if an accident or injury occurred at practice or a meet, the person injured, or their parent, should fill out an online report of occurrence and submit it to USA Swimming.
- Safe Sport interim chair Jay Friend said if anyone had any concerns or complaints involving a safe sport issue to contact Jay or the US Center for Safe Sport and USA Swimming. He encouraged clubs to work on their safe sport recognized club status and if they needed assistance to reach out to Jay.
- Jay asked if anyone was interested in serving as the operational risk or safe sport chair to contact him.

There was no other old business.

New Business

Awards:

Nominations were accepted for the outstanding volunteer of the year, male and female athlete of the year, and the male and female sportsperson of the year. The male and female athlete of the year awards are based on power points. The sportsperson of the year must be a junior or senior in high school. Due to the nature of the virtual meeting, an electronic poll was set up for the delegates to vote for the awards.

2025-2026 Short Course Meet Schedule and Short Course Championship Meet Bids:

The 2025-2026 short course season meet bids were submitted and the draft schedule was posted on the website.

There were two bids received to host the 2026 Montana Swimming Short Course Championships. One bid was received from the Butte YMCA in the amount of \$15,000. Another bid was received from the Hardin Community Activity Center and Hardin Otters Swim Team in the amount of \$15,000.

There was one bid received from the Butte YMCA to host the 2026 Montana Swimming Junior BC Championships in the amount of \$8000.

The group discussed possible dates for both meets. High School State will be February 12-14 in Great Falls. Both Butte and Hardin were flexible with their meet bid dates. The athletes favored having state at the end of February with a week between it and high school state. The group favored keeping the BC Championships the week after state and making it a great championship meet.

M/S/P: It was moved and seconded to hold the 2026 Short Course State Championships February 26-March 1. The 2026 Montana Swimming BC Championships will be March 7-8. The motion passed.

M/S/P: It was moved and seconded that the 2026 Montana Swimming Short Course Championships be held in Butte February 26-March 1 with a bid of \$15,000 submitted by the Butte YMCA. The motion passed.

M/S/P: It was moved and seconded that the 2026 Montana Swimming Junior BC Championships be held in Butte March 7-8 with a bid of \$8000 submitted by the Butte YMCA. The motion passed.

There may be other tournaments in Butte, so teams were advised to make their room reservations early. Teams could send the approximate number of rooms needed for SC state and the BC Championships to Susan by October so she can contact hotels about setting aside rooms for each swim meet. Teams will need to make their own reservations.

KATS and HAV submitted no swim meet dates. GFST will host their meet fall meet October 24-26. The BOZ Teddy Bear will be December 13-14 in Butte. The GFST Snowflake meet date in January was not set. Kristen is finalizing dates for the January BY Rubber Duck Open. MAC will set their Winterfest meet dates once the high school meet dates are released. Other meet dates submitted in advance of the meeting are listed on the meet schedule posted on the website.

M/S/P: It was moved and seconded that the 2025-2026 Montana Swimming Short Course meet schedule be approved as currently proposed. The motion passed.

The short course meet schedule is in the appendix and posted on the website. If clubs need to make any changes to the schedule, contact sanctions chair Eric Belasco and webmaster Susan Huckeby.

Set the 2026 Montana Swimming Championship Meet Fees:

M/S/P: It was moved and seconded to keep the 2026 Montana Swimming championship meet fees the same as in 2025. The motion passed.

The 2026 championship meet fees will be:

- Surcharge: \$45
- Individual Events \$7
- Relays \$12.
- Outreach members pay a flat \$10 fee.

Late entry fees for the championship meets are as follows: (does not include new late qualifying entries)

- Surcharge \$50
- Individual; Events: \$14
- Relays \$24
- Outreach athletes pay a flat \$10 fee

Notes:

- New late qualifying entries pay the original championship entry fees, not the late fees. New late qualifying entry times were achieved after the original entry deadline but prior to the late entry deadline.
- Late fees are for entries submitted after the original entry deadline, but the times were achieved on or before the original entry deadline.
- Outreach athletes pay a flat \$10 fee to enter the meet. Teams entering relays with outreach athletes must pay the team relay entry fee.

Set Montana Swimming Registration Fees for 2025-2026:

Susan submitted a list of the 2026 fees with no proposed increases by Montana Swimming. Montana Swimming's \$36 portion of the premium athlete registration fee is the highest in the county. She proposed reducing the Montana Swimming portion of the outreach membership fee from \$2 to zero for a new total of \$5.00. Flex fees are set and cannot be increased. The USA Swimming portion of the club registration fee will increase to \$225 on September 1 for a total of \$305. The new club registration fee will increase on September 1 to \$750. The registration fees can only be adjusted annually prior to the August deadline and will be reviewed each May.

In discussions previously with Jane Grosser, it was suggested that USA Swimming allow the flex athlete membership to be opened to all ages, not just 12 and under athletes. Many swimmers join teams in our LSC for fitness reasons and do not compete. If they could join using a reduced fee flex membership, it would save them money and may encourage others to join our teams. Jane will take the topic back to USA Swimming. The change would have to be made through USA Swimming.

M/S/P: It was moved and seconded to reduce the Montana Swimming portion of the outreach fee from \$2 to \$0 and not increase any other portion of the Montana Swimming registration fees for 2026. The motion passed.

Other Business

State Meet Format Working Group: Jay is forming a working group to look at the meet formats for short course state and long course state. Could these swim meets be better? We need to serve our athletes well and the group will look at ways to do that. If you are interested in serving on this working group, reach out to Jay. You can also send ideas to Jay.

2025 Fall Montana Swimming House of Delegates Meeting: Due to several conflicts, the fall HOD meeting will be held virtually on Sunday September 21 at 10:00 am. Proposals are due August 10 to Eddie Lary with a copy to Susan Huckeby. Bids to host the 2026 Montana Swimming Long Course State Championships are due a minimum of two weeks prior to September 21. Send championship meet bids to Jay with a copy to Susan.

New late qualifying entries from HLST meet: New late qualifying entries from the HLST Last Chance meet will be accepted for Long Course State. The results from the swim meet should be in SWIMS by Sunday night July 13.

Resolutions and Orders

There were no physical ballots to destroy as this was a virtual meeting. Electronic ballots were deleted.

Adjournment

With no further business, General Chair Jay Friend adjourned the meeting at 11:45 am.

Qualifying Time Period: August 7, 2024 through the entry deadline.

The Montana Team Western Zone Age Group Championship Time Standards will be the 2024-2028 USA Swimming National Age Group Motivational Time Standards - "AA" combined Age Group Standards: 10&U * 11-12 * 13-14 for both genders. The "AA" time must be in an event offered for the athletes age group at Age Group Zones.

"AA" qualified swimmers will be entered into events using our LSC bonus swims. Each LSC is limited to 160 bonus swims (and just one bonus in the races 400 meters and above).

Swimmers with "AAA" times have the first priority in age division events including bonuses and they will be entered in 6 races. If we exceed 160 bonus swims then swimmers with "AA" times will be entered in 5 races each. We will fill as many relays as possible to give swimmers extra swims.

Diversity, Disability, Equity, and Inclusion Chair Report

2025 Spring HOD Meeting

The Montana Swimming Reach Out grant program awards funding to Montana Swimming teams to provide opportunities for low income/outreach, minority, LGBTQ, and disabled athletes to participate in swimming through such activities as learn to swim camps, scholarships, providing training equipment or swimsuits and more. In October the **Hardin Otters Swim Team** was awarded \$2500 to purchase a quality sound system for their pool. The system they were using was owned by a parent whose swimmer graduated last year. The sound system will allow them to continue to host quality age group and high school meets. In addition, a portion of the funds will be used to offer scholarships to needy team members. This spring the Montana Swimming board voted to award \$2500 to **Syler Pizzolato (BAC)** to help fund his trip with Team USA to the 2025 Deaflympics in Tokyo, Japan. Congratulations to the Hardin Otters and Sy Pizzolato!

I would like to thank Montana Swimming Athlete Representative Aeri La (MYST) and Finance Vice Chair Beth Storey (HDST) for serving on the grant committee. Thank you everyone for the continued support of the program. The fall 2025 grant applications and 2026 spring grant applications are posted on the website.

Information about the Montana Swimming athlete outreach membership policy can be found on the website. In 2021 we voted to add swimmers with a disability to qualify for outreach membership. Part of the qualifying process requires teams to submit a letter to their club registrar verifying the athlete is disabled and the athlete must register as a disability athlete in the appropriate category (P1, P2, P3). Low-income families may submit a letter to their club registrar showing the family is qualified for SNAP, WIC, TANF, Medicaid or other programs including the federal free or reduced hot lunch program to qualify for outreach memberships. A year-round outreach membership is \$7.00 per athlete. If a family member has lost his/her/their job or had hours reduced, you've experienced the loss of a parent or guardian, or gone through a divorce and your finances have been impacted, please check out the outreach membership as your children may qualify.

I would also like to encourage conversations between coaches, athletes with disabilities, and officials at swim meets to determine needed accommodations for a swimmer. Posted on the website is a form that can be completed by the athlete, athlete's parent or coach requesting accommodations and modifications at a swim meet. Accommodation and modifications may be granted at one swim meet but may not necessarily be granted at another meet for various reasons including different layouts of the pool and locker rooms. Always reach out to the meet referee in advance if you need accommodation.

I would like to encourage all our athlete members and non-athlete members to check the box for ethnicity when registering with USA Swimming this fall using the SWIMS online member registration (OMR) process. The information is used by USA Swimming and helps them understand if programming and resources are of value to everyone in the organization. The information does not identify individual people.

The USA Swimming Policy 19 for transgender athletes is posted on the website. The policy explains how a transgender athlete may compete in USA Swimming. It is also posted on the USA Swimming website.

The Montana Swimming website features a tab for diversity and inclusion as well as disability swimming. Numerous resources can be found there.

I am the Western Zone DEI Coordinator. As part of my duties, I chair the WZ DEI committee, post information on the WZ website, participate in the National DEI committee calls and the Zone Coordinators group calls, and disseminate information to the WZ DEI chairs. I am also a member of the LSC Outreach Manual update subcommittee. The WZ DEI Committee is in the early stages of planning for a possible WZ DEI camp and multicultural swim meet in 2027 and hopefully 2029.

2025 Spring Registration Chair Report

Montana Swimming currently has 1,250 athletes registered and 229 non-athletes. We had a high of 1300 athletes registered in 2013 and 229 non-athletes in 2022. There are 76 outreach athletes registered. We currently have 86 registered coach members and 81 registered officials. There are 15 registered clubs.

If you have a question about a registration issue, please email Jay Friend and me first before you submit a help ticker as we may be able to answer your questions faster.

Montana Swimming needs to set the 2026 registration fees at the spring HOD meeting. These fees must be set before the 2026 registration opens on September 1. I recommend no increases for Montana Swimming. (See the registration fee report)

The administrator membership is for club board members and other club administrators – not admin officials. Individual seasonal athlete memberships are good for 150 days from the date registered. The athlete may then upgrade to a premium membership and only pay the difference between the two memberships. Flex members must be 12 and under and may only swim in two sanctioned meets before they must upgrade their membership. They may not compete at the LSC championships meet level or higher. Meet directors and chaperones should register with an “other” membership. A person with an administrator only membership can’t be a meet director.

If non-athletes have multiple types of memberships, such as coach, official, and other, you only pay one fee – not a fee for each membership type. You do have to register for each membership. Clubs to be in good standing must always have a head coach in good standing and at least one registered athlete member.

Board members of clubs that are board run must all be USA Swimming non-athlete membership. You may register using the administrator membership. All clubs need to list their board members in the club’s hub account.

The club dashboard in the hub has had several new updates this spring. You can view these reports by going to club, my club, team management, reports.

The club member report will allow clubs to check if coaches, officials, athletes, and others have current memberships. The club roster can be sorted in several ways to show who is registered to your club by membership type. The club profile dashboard has graphs and charts detailing club membership over time, breakdowns by race and ethnicity, and more. The club flex athlete meet count will help coaches track when flex athletes have competed in two meets and need to upgrade their membership to premium. The club times report can be sorted to show top times by athletes in your club. IMX and IMR performances can be tracked in the IMX/IMR detail report and certificates can be printed in the club IMX certificate report. The club times progression dashboard will show how the times have progressed by athlete in your club over time. There are many other reports. Take some time and go through the reports and you may be pleasantly surprised at what information is available. Much of the same information can be found for the LSC as well that Jay and I can access.

Montana Swimming does check the registration status of athletes entered in meets if the club sends me a Meet Manager back-up prior to the meet. Send the MM back-up to me as soon as your entries close. You can always send another back-up if you have late entries. Sending the back-up sooner allows me to contact teams to correct registration issues including athletes who must complete the

APT. Any athlete 18 and older must have a current APT. Anyone who does not and competes in a meet creates liability issues for the host team as the athlete doesn't have a current membership and the times for that athlete will not upload to SWIMS.

Montana Swimming is no longer checking the registration for coaches and officials prior to swim meets due to changes to the report generated in SWIMS. Officials and coaches must show their current registration card on their USA Swimming app on their mobile device or may print a copy of their card to show the meet referee or designee.

Clubs will again have the option to opt in for bulk renewal this fall for athletes and non-athletes or both. Look for information to be sent out in July and early August.

Coaches and officials should send concussion certificates and Red Cross certificates for CPR, lifeguard, STFSC-W, and STFSC-O to Jay and me to post to your accounts. These certifications do not automatically upload to your account but must be manually loaded.

Montana State law requires that all youth sport coaches and officials take the concussion course each year. To follow Montana High School Association guidelines, you should take the NFHS course after June 1 each year. Montana Swimming only needs to upload your concussion certificate once to your account. Individuals and clubs should track if coaches and officials have completed with state law after the first year.

Fees include both the USA Swimming and Montana Swimming fees.

Outreach Athlete	\$ 5.00 (Year-round membership – low income and disability members only. Must meet criteria set by Montana Swimming – see below. MT Swim fee is \$0.)
Flex Athlete (12 & under only)	\$ 30.00 (Can't compete at MT Swim Championship meets or above. \$20 to USA-S and \$10 to MT Swim. May only compete in 2 sanctioned meet per year unless purchase a premium membership.)
Individual Seasonal Athlete	\$ 69.00 (Good for 150 days only from the date registered. Can't compete at zones and above. Individuals are only allowed one seasonal membership per same membership year. Must upgrade to premium membership once expired to continue to swim and compete. MT Swim fee is \$29.)
Non-athlete Coach	\$ 84.00 (MT Swim fee is \$14.)

Provisional Coach (new coach)	\$ 84.00	(MT Swim fee is \$14.)
Junior Coach (Ages 16-17 only)	\$ 84.00	(MT Swim fee is \$14.)

Non-athlete Apprentice Official	\$0.	(Good for 60 days from date joined. Allows you to train on deck before joining as a non-athlete official member)

Non-athlete Administrator (club)	\$ 30.00	(Membership for club board members and everyone else who isn't a coach, official or other – NOT for admin officials who must join as an official. NO MT Swim fee.)
Non-athlete Other	\$ 84.00	(Non-athlete members including chaperones, meet directors, safe sport club contact, LSC admins. MT Swim fee is \$14.)
Transfer to a new club	\$0	

NOTE: If you have multiple non-athlete memberships – such as coach, official, and other, you pay the \$84 fee once – not for each membership type.

Club Registration:

Club	\$305 --(\$225 to USA Swim, \$80 to MT Swim.) Includes year round clubs, seasonal clubs, and organizations.
New Club Registration Fee:	\$750 to USA Swimming.

Outreach Membership Criteria

Outreach memberships are offered to qualifying low income and/or disability athletes in Montana Swimming. A year-round outreach membership in Montana Swimming is \$5.00. The outreach membership must be applied for annually. The qualifying documents should be shown to the member's club registrar for verification (or in the case of unattached athletes to the Montana Swimming DDEI chair who will verify it to Montana Swimming registrar). Clubs and Montana Swimming may not retain the documents.

For low income families to qualify for outreach membership you must show one of the following documents or letters to the club registrar or Montana Swimming DDEI chair: Federal free or reduced hot lunch program, 1040 tax form, Food Stamps (SNAP) program, Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations (FDPIR), TANF, WIC, low income housing (Section 8, housing choice vouchers), low income energy assistance (LIEAP), Supplemental Social Security Income (SSI), private/parochial school based financial needs program, foster children, participation in Head Start, Medicaid, Medicare, Healthy Montana Kids Plus, Healthy Montana Kids, homeless, runaway, migrant, refugee, is a member of the club on a reduced or free scholarship, or their income is within the Federal Poverty Guidelines. Cases not falling under these circumstances may be appealed to the General Chair. Hardship exceptions may also be considered.

Outreach membership registration is also available to athletes who have a disability as recognized under the USA Swimming rules, Article 105. Any athlete with a disability applying for outreach membership must also be registered as a disability athlete. Families must show the club registrar (or in the case of an unattached athlete, the Montana Swimming DDEI Chair who will verify it to the

Montana Swimming registrar) information verifying that the athlete is disabled as recognized under the USA Swimming rules Article 105. Medical paperwork does not have to be submitted. Clubs and the LSC may not keep any paperwork provided. Disability is defined as a permanent physical or cognitive disability that substantially limits one or more major life activities.

Disability athlete registration categories include:

- Legally blind or visually impaired,
- Deaf or hard of hearing (MT only),
- Physical disabilities (such as amputation, dwarfism, cerebral palsy, spinal injury, mobility impairment, limb deficiency, wheelchair bound with high functioning upper body, non-ambulatory (wheelchair bound), limited use of all four extremities), and
- Intellectual/Cognitive disability (such as severe learning disorders, Down Syndrome, autism spectrum disorder).

Disability athletes may register to compete as:

- P1 athletes -- Non-ambulatory (wheelchair-bound), limited use of all four extremities.
- P2 athletes -- Ambulatory with assistance: includes dwarfism, multiple limb deficiency, wheelchair-bound with high functioning upper body.
- P3 athletes -- Ambulatory without significant assistance: includes single-limb deficiencies, blind/vision impaired; deaf/hearing impaired (MT only); intellectual, cognitive, and developmental impairments (including autism spectrum disorder and Down Syndrome); and other.

2025 Spring Times Chair Report

Congratulations to **Kaia Lyons, BOZ**, for being ranked nationally in the top ten for 12-year-old girls in the 100 yard breaststroke: 10th place with a time of 1:07.16 set at the 2025 SN Southwestern Age Group Regional Championships.

Last year Kaia also had national top ten times as an 11 year old in the 50 yard breaststroke, 100 yard breaststroke and 200 yard breaststroke.

Scholastic All America: I serve as the Western Zone women's tabulator on the Scholastic All America sub-committee. The online application opens June 1 and closes on September 30. Times must have been achieved between September 1, 2024, and August 31, 2025. Altitude adjusted times may not be used to qualify for Scholastic All America honors. Athletes must have completed the 9th, 10th, 11th, or 12 grade; have a 3.5 GPA or higher in academic subjects; and have a 2024 Winter Juniors qualifying time to be named to the SAA team. I encourage all qualified Montana Swimming athletes to apply. The athletes, their parents, and their club will receive an email notifying the athletes that they have a qualifying time. Athletes are directed to the application to apply.

SWIMS: Clubs may view times progression by their athletes in the club hub account. Clubs can also view the top times report for individual events and relays by their club members. New updates are being added monthly to SWIMS so check out what new data has been added.

Meet Results: Meet results are posted on the website on the past meet results page. I try to have the meet results uploaded to SWIMS and Team Unify within a day or two of receiving them.

SwimCloud: SwimCloud is an online platform showing meet results for athletes who wish to have their times available for college coaches to view. I do try to send the results to SwimCloud after each meet. I am unable to send them results from single team or dual meets – the team must submit those results. None of the times on SwimCloud are verified in the same manner as times in SWIMS. There have been concerns expressed across the country about providing results for Swim Cloud so USA Swimming may decide this will not be allowed in the future.

Meet Manager File Names and Report Headers: The correct manner to name your Meet Manager file for a meet is the Year-LSC-Club Code-Meet Name such as the 2025 MT BOZ May Classic. If names are too long, they will not upload in Team Unify. Also, under the report headers, please list the meet name, location, course, and include the sanction number. The USA Swimming rules require this information. You do not need to list the name of the meet referee. An example would be:

2025 MT BOZ Teddy Bear Classic, Sanction xxxx
Butte YMCA 25Y Pool, Butte, MT

Meet File Names: Some meet event file names that are too long to be uploaded onto the Team Unify platform, so I have had to shorten the names to upload the files. Please be aware of that potential problem when naming your Meet Manager files.

Time Trials: Due to how meets are set up in SWIMS 3.0, teams hosting a time trial in conjunction with an invitational meet must sanction the time trial separately from their invitational meet. Time trials need a separate sanction number, separate Meet Manager database and the entry swimmer fees must be paid to Montana Swimming. Please name your time trial something similar to your invitational meet if you wish. 2025 BAC Spring Fling Invitational and 2025 BAC March Time Trials are examples. You do need to specify the events you'll offer in your time trial meet announcement. For officials training purposes, training at time trials does not count toward the required number of sessions to become certified. Time trials also don't count towards needed sessions for N2 and N3 certifications.

Flex Athlete Competing in More than 2 Sanctioned Meets: Every year I encounter some problems with uploading results for flex athletes who competed at more than two sanctioned competitions. Flex athletes may only compete in 2 sanctioned meets and no championship meets unless they upgrade to a premium membership. As I encounter this when doing pre-meet registration recon, I do email teams to let them know of the problem.

18 and Over Athletes and APT: Athletes aged 18 and over who had not completed the athlete protection training prior to competing in a meet had their times rejected when uploaded into SWIMS. I did contact coaches of athletes when possible that I was aware of who had not completed the APT prior to a meet, but there were some athlete times that were not uploaded into SWIMS. If these times should appear in Team Unify, they cannot be used for entry using OME or with an event file when proof of time is required. I do try to delete out these athletes from the results file before uploading times in Team Unify.

Semi-final meet results: SWIMS 3.0 and Team Unify will now upload semifinal results from meets.

Mixed Relay Errors: A legal mixed relay must be composed of two males and two females. All girls and all boys relays are not legal mixed relays and their times will not be uploaded into SWIMS (relays with 3 girls and 1 boy or 3 boys and 1 girl are also not legal mixed relays). These non-conforming relays should be disqualified, and no names should be recorded. I encourage teams to offer girls, boys, and mixed relays at meets. The meet referee may combine those relays to swim together during the meet, but after the races are concluded the AO can adjust the relays and split the correct teams back into the correct events. If you have questions about how to do this, please contact me.

Relays: For relay times to be uploaded to SWIMS, each relay team in Meet Manager must list the names of the four swimmers who swam. The swimmers must be currently registered athletes from the same team. Relays must conform to the relay information listed on the event list as far as age and gender. Open relays may include swimmers of any age. Unattached swimmers may not swim on relays.

2025 Spring Scholastic All America Report



The Scholastic All America application for the 2024-2025 year will be available online beginning June 1, 2025.

For more information: <https://www.usaswimming.org/times/popular-resources/scholastic-all-america>

- The only method for application will be the online application on the USA Swimming website.
- The swimmer and their parents along with their club coach will receive an email letting them know the swimmer has a qualifying time for Scholastic All America with directions on how to apply. The athlete must go online and apply and upload a transcript (in pdf or jpeg format). Instructions for applying can be found on the USA Swimming website under Times>Scholastic All America.
- Parents, if you apply for your child, you must log into the child's SWIMS hub account to apply – not your parent account. (hub.usaswimming.org)
- Applicants must upload a complete transcript for the 2024-2025 academic year to their application. Report/grade cards will not be accepted.
- Applicants will be required to have a USA Swimming account.
- Athletes need to qualify with only one time and only one application will be accepted per athlete.

- Qualifying pool times for the applicant will be validated in SWIMS. Times **MUST** be in SWIMS and have been achieved between September 1, 2024, and August 31, 2025 (dates inclusive). The qualifying time standards are the 2024 Winter Junior National standards. Altitude adjusted times may not be used to qualify.
- Athletes with disabilities must have swum an individual pool time equal to or faster than the 2024-2025 Para Scholastic All America standards (posted on the SAA page) in any individual event noted within their self-reported P1, P2, or P3 grouping during the SAA qualifying period (September 1, 2024 – August 31, 2025) with the qualifying time in SWIMS (except for the 150 IM). A cap of 56 athletes will be named with 2 athletes/event/gender.
- Open Water applicants must have swum an individual pool time equal to or faster than the 2024 Winter Junior National qualifying time in the 800, 1000, 1500, or 1650 freestyle during the SAA qualifying time period (September 1, 2024 – August 31, 2025) with the qualifying time appearing in SWIMS **AND** participate in the 2025 USA Swimming Open Water National Championships. Participation in the 2025 Open Water Junior National Championships will not qualify you for SAA. If you wish to be recognized as an open water swimmer, make sure to select that on the application.
- Applicants will be required to have a transcript for the complete 2024-2025 academic year available for uploading to the application. Must have a 3.5 or higher gpa. Report cards and grade cards are not accepted. Grading scale is as follows: A=4; B=3; C=2; or A= 90-100, B= 80-89; C=70-79. Grades lower than a C disqualify the applicant. Non-academic subjects are not included in the gpa calculation.
- Must have completed the 9th, 10th, 11th, or 12th grade.
- AP, IB, and Honors courses will receive an additional one fifth of a point (0.2) on the grading scale.
- Applicants must have been a member at the time of the swim and a current member when applying for the 2024-2025 SAA team.
- Applicants must have all application documents completed by the application deadline of September 30, 2025, by midnight UTC. Late applications will NOT be accepted or considered.
- Once you apply, you'll receive a conformation email. If you don't receive it, contact Anissa Kanzari at kanzari.anissa@gmail.com
