



TYDE – BRONZE LEVEL ATHLETE CODE OF CONDUCT

The purpose of a code of conduct for athletes is to establish expectations for athletes' behavior. By signing this code of conduct, I agree to the following statements:

I will respect and show courtesy to my teammates and coaches at all times.

I will demonstrate good sportsmanship at all times, including at practices and meets.

I will set a good example of behavior and work ethic for my younger teammates.

I will be respectful of my teammates' feelings and personal space. Swimmers who exhibit bullying, sexist, racist, homophobic, or otherwise inappropriate behavior will be faced with consequences.

I will show respect for all facilities and other property (including locker rooms) used during practices, competitions and team activities.

I will refrain from foul language, violence, behavior deemed dishonest, offensive, or illegal.

I will refrain from using social media and networking in a manner that is contrary to the YMCA and TYDE's mission.

There shall be no drinking of alcohol or use of tobacco products (including vaping) or illegal drugs or any substances banned by USA Swimming.

If I disagree with an official's call, I will talk with my coach and not approach the official directly.

I will obey all of USA Swimming's rules and codes of conduct, including all Safe Sport regulations.

I will strictly follow all TYDE Covid-19 guidelines.

I will have pride in being a TYDE swimmer and will act as an ambassador for the program.

As a member of TYDE's competitive program, I understand that I should plan to participate in meets.

In order to be successful, it is recommended that:

Bronze Level 1 swimmers attend 2 out of 3 practices offered each week.

Bronze Level 2 swimmers attend 3 out of 4 practices offered each week.

Bronze Level 3-4 swimmers attend 3 out of 5 practices offered each week.

I understand that a violation of this code of conduct will be subject to disciplinary action determined by my coaches and TYDE administration.
