



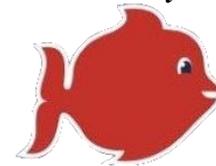

SITE	The URI Competition Pool is a 8 lane 25-yard 7 foot-wide lanes and non-turbulent lane lines. The timing system includes a fully-automatic Colorado Time Systems electronic timing system with touchpads at the finish and turn ends of the pool with a full color digital scoreboard. Four lanes will be separated from the 8 lanes of competition area by a bulkhead and used for continuous warm up and warm down. The finish end of the pool is 6 to 11 feet deep; the turn end of the pool is 6 to 11 feet deep. Spectator seating is for 350. The competition course has been certified in accordance with 104.2.2C(4). [The copy of such certification is on file with USA Swimming.]

FORMAT:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The meet will be swum as timed finals. The session will be seeded before warm-ups based on scratches received by the scratch deadline. Heat sheets will be available for coaches and posted on the pool deck. DISTANCE EVENTS (500 Free): will be seeded fast to slow in the following order: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ⊖ Fastest two heats of girls ⊖ Fastest two heats of boys ○ Remaining heats will be swum fast to slow alternating girls and boys heats.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ The slowest heat of girls and boys may be combined at the discretion of the Meet Referee ● No events will swim with more than one swimmer per lane
SCRATCHES	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Scratches for Friday (including the 500 free and both relays) are due Thursday Feb 12 at 9:00 PM and should be emailed to the Admin Official: meetentryne@gmail.com ● Scratches for Saturday's session are due 30 minutes after the start of Friday's session at the computer table or via email to meetentryne@gmail.com ● Scratches for Sunday's session are due 30 minutes after the start of Saturday's session at the computer table or via email to meetentryne@gmail.com ● For swimmers over-entered in events for a day or for the meet, coaches must scratch them down by the deadline to the limiting number of entries by the scratch due date/time. ● There are no penalties for no shows but a no show counts as a competed event.
ELIGIBILITY	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● All swimmers must be currently registered as athlete members of USA Swimming (USAS) <i>before 5:00 pm on the day before the first day of the meet.</i> ● Age is determined by the age of the swimmer on the first day of the meet. <i>TeamUnify users, please check for any swimmers with a birthday on 02/14 that they are in the correct age group. TeamUnify does not always age up a swimmer who has a birthday on the age up date.</i> ● Any swimmer entered in the meet must be certified by a USAS Member-Coach as being proficient in performing a racing start or must start each race from within the water without the use of the Backstroke ledge. When unaccompanied by a Member-Coach, it is the responsibility of the swimmer or the swimmer's legal guardian to ensure compliance with this requirement. ● Coaches must be registered before the start of the meet. ● If a swimmer who is not properly registered with USAS competes in a sanctioned competition, the host LSC will impose <i>a fine of up to \$100.00 per event against the individual, member coach, or a member club</i> submitting the entry. ● Deck Entries will NOT be accepted. ● All swimmers must have achieved the time from a sanctioned, approved, or observed meet that is posted in the SWIMS database.
BONUS EVENTS	<p>Any swimmer who qualifies for the 10 & Under Championships in any event, may enter bonus events in any other event in which their time is slower than the Age Groups cut. Bonus event times must be verifiable in SWIMS AND must meet the Bonus qualifying time</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Qualify in 1 event – get 3 bonus events ● Qualify in 2 events – get 2 bonus events ● Qualify in 3 events – get 1 bonus events ● All bonus times must be verifiable in SWIMS ● All bonus events must meet the Bonus qualifying time.
DISABILITY SWIMMERS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Athletes with a disability are welcome; they, or the athlete's coach, shall provide advance notice of desired accommodations to the Meet Director. ● The athlete, or the athlete's coach, is also responsible for notifying the Meet Referee of any disability prior to the competition.
ENTRY POLICY	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Swimmers may enter as many events in which they have qualified but may only compete in a maximum of six (6) individual events per day (including time trials) and a maximum of seven (7) individual events for the meet (not including time trials). ● Entry Deadline: Tuesday, February 3, 2026 @ 11:59PM

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All entry times must have been achieved since June 1, 2024. • All entry times must be entered in the meet course in which they were achieved. • No NTs are allowed. • No time updates are accepted. • Seeding Order: SCY, LCM, SCM. • Bonus times must have been achieved in short course yards (SCY)
ENTRY VERIFICATION	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • SWIMS DATABASE PROOF OF TIME: Times from the USA Swimming Sanctioned, Approved, and Observed competitions will be in SWIMS, the national times database. Times must meet qualifying time standards and any entry times not in the SWIMS database will be rejected. All entries will be verified before the meet. • Anyone entering a swimmer in events where a time is not in SWIMS, will be fined \$100 per events and the swimmer will be scratched from the event. This violation may jeopardize the team's participation in future New England Swimming championship meets. It is up to the team entering to verify that the swimmer's times are actually in SWIMS.
CUT PROTOCOL	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • If a session is over-subscribed the following cuts/adjustments may be made under the discretion of the Meet Director and Meet Referee and clubs will be notified no later than Thursday. • Relays may be limited to one entry per team • Bonus events may be cut
SUBMITTING ENTRIES	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Teams / Athletes must enter this meet in OME at www.usaswimming.org/OME by Tuesday, February 3, 2026 @ 11:59pm EST. Credit cards will not be accepted. Once you check out of the entry on OME, send the cover/liability waiver page, and a check to be received no later than Tuesday, February 10, 2026 to the address below. • It is the coach's responsibility to know the events for which the athlete is qualified. Entries can be modified in OME by adding to the original entry, but only BEFORE you check out. You cannot delete an online entry. Once you complete your online entry, you will be sent confirmation via e-mail by the OME program. Please print this report and include it with your payment and keep a copy for yourself. • Do not email your Hy-Tek entry file to the Entry Chair. • No refunds will be given for entries that are accepted or for entries that are rejected due to improper entry. • If mailed, mail completed signed entry cover page and waiver, and payment to the Entry Chair: <div style="text-align: center;"> <p>SAC Swimming PO BOX 190 Dover, MA 02030</p> </div> • Any team that fails to send payment, cover page and waiver form, by the entry due date may be scratched from the meet and may be assessed a \$100 fine at the discretion of the Entry Chairperson. If no payment is received after 30 days, the fine is doubled. This fine is payable to the Shawmut Aquatic Club. Late payment of entry fees may result in future exclusion from meets hosted by our club. • IMPORTANT: If payment is sent via Express Mail/FedEx/Airborne/UPS/etc., please ensure that a signature is NOT required for delivery. • Entries will be acknowledged within 24 hours of receiving the entry. Your entry is considered received only if you receive an acknowledgement. • All unattached swimmers must be declared as unattached, on the entry cover sheet, before the meet begins. • NEW CUTS DEADLINE: Any swimmer who achieves a new entry time between the entry deadline of February 3 and Monday February 9, 2026 may be added to the meet. This could be new swimmers with no cuts previously or added events for an already qualified swimmer. • New cuts can be made in qualifying times or bonus times. • A new qualifying time could include what had been a bonus event becoming a qualified event. • Teams must send their updated entries to the Entry Chair before 11:59 PM on Monday, Feb 9.

	<p>LATE ENTRIES: Any other additional entries (additional swimmers and/or swims) submitted after the February 3 entry deadline constitute late entries. Late entries must be submitted no longer than Monday, February 9, 2026 at 9 PM and are subject to the following penalty fees</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • \$25 per swimmer to add swimmer(s) not already in the meet • \$25 per relay to add relay entries to the meet • \$10 per swimmer to add event(s) for swimmer(s) already entered in the meet • These penalties do not apply to New Cuts entries • The Meet Referee has the discretion to waive the late entry penalty in cases of extraordinary circumstances. All late entry penalty fees must be submitted to the meet host prior to the start of the meet and will be split between the meet host and New England Swimming.
TIME TRIALS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Time trials will be offered at the discretion of the Admin Official and the Meet Referee if time allows, after each session. • At the discretion of the Admin Official and Meet Referee, a swimmer does not need to be entered in the regular meet to participate in a time trial. Valid USA-S registration must be provable and data provided as part of the time trial request. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Time trial swimmers not already in the meet must submit a time trial request by Wednesday, February 11, 9PM. Request must include name, team, date of birth, ID, event, and seed time. ○ Time trial only swimmers must pay both the swimmer participation fee and the travel fee in addition to the time trial fee(s). ○ Time trial only swimmers are only permitted on the pool deck for the session(s) in which they participate in time trials • Requests for time trials for swimmers already in the meet are due before the relays at the end of that session. Any time trial request known earlier, should be submitted as soon as possible. • Any time trial swimmers and/or swims not accommodated due to time and/or capacity constraints are eligible for refund.
RELAYS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Dual Human Confirmation of relay take off violations will be required at all New England Swimming meets. • Relays will be limited to 2 relays per team per event. • Relay only swimmers are allowed. They must be officially entered into the meet and are subject to the swimmer participation fee and travel fee. • Each relay must include at least one qualified swimmer. • All relay entries must have a seed time – coaches’ times and aggregate times are allowed. • Unattached swimmers may not participate in any relays. • Mixed relays must consist of four swimmers, two of each gender.
RELAY CARDS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Relay cards are due one hour prior to the estimated start of the relays. • Each coach shall pick up relay entry forms from the Control Table on which he/she shall list the competing relay swimmers, their first and last names and order of swimming for each entered relay. • Relay order may be changed up to the time of the swim.
FEES	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Individual Events: \$10.00 • Relay Event: \$25.00 • Time Trial Individual Events: \$10.00 • Time Trial Relay Events: \$40.00 • Per-Swimmer Participation Fee: \$30.00 • Per-Swimmer NES Travel Fee: \$2.00 (to be included in the check sent by the host team to NES) • Non-electronic entries: \$5.50 for individual, \$10.50 for distance and \$25.00 for relays.

MEET MOBILE	MEET MOBILE: Meet Mobile will be functional for this meet, (dependent upon satisfactory internet access) All users should be aware that Meet Mobile publishes unverified raw data that may not always be accurate.																																																			
WARM-UP	USA Swimming warm-up policies will be in effect for the meet. Teams will be assigned warm-up lanes and times after all entries are received. The pool will close 5 minutes before the beginning of each session. The pool will open for warm-ups for at least 60 minutes before the start of the meet as designated on the event list. At least two lanes will be available for warm-up/warm-down during the meet. See “Safety” for Warm-up safety guidelines.																																																			
AWARDS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Heat winner prizes will be distributed during the meet. • Medals will be awarded to the top 8 finishers for individual events and to the top 3 places in relay events. Medals will be presented to recipients at times selected by the Meet Referee and Admin Official. • Swimmers and coaches are responsible for making sure they are present to receive their awards. • Ribbons will be awarded for places 9th-16th in individual events and 4th-8th in relays. Ribbons will be collected by coaches in their team folders at the control table. • The top 8 high point winners for each gender will receive a special award. The high point ceremony will take place on Sunday at the conclusion of the session. 																																																			
SCORING	<p>An unlimited number of individual swimmers per team can score in an event. LEGAL SPLITS	<p>Individual Events: Preferably, Legal Splits should be requested before the event, by a coach, using a Legal Split Form (available from the Control Table), and the requesting party should supply an additional timer(s) on the lane for the split, if necessary, to ensure an accurate time (one timer with touchpad timing, three timers without touchpad timing). Timers must be positioned over the lane at the end of the racing course. Optionally, a Legal Split may be requested after the event using a Legal Split Form when using a fully automatic timing system. The Admin Official has discretion to either grant or deny the request after reviewing the available evidence. Backstroke Legal Splits must be requested in advance to ensure a legal finish.</p> <p>LEGAL SPLITS – Relays: All lead-off splits for relays are automatically loaded into SWIMS and do not require additional watches for validation unless there are no touchpads present, or the second swimmer starts in the water. If there are no touchpads, or the second swimmer starts in the water, a legal split form with three watches will be required for entry into SWIMS. Timers must be positioned over the lane at the end of the racing course. It is recommended that coaches report lead-off time discrepancies to the Administrative Referee or Administrative Official.</p>																																																			
SWIMWEAR	Per USA Swimming rules (102.8.1.F), 12&Under swimmers may not wear a Technical Suit at any Sanctioned, Approved, or Observed meet. The age of the swimmer is determined on the first day of the meet. Guidance on identifying compliant and non-compliant suits can be found on the USA Swimming website under Tech Suit Restriction for 12-and-Under Swimmers .																																																			
RULES	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The current USA Swimming Rules and Regulations including the Minor Athlete Abuse Protection Policy (MAAPP 2.0) will govern this meet. • Operation of a DRONE, or any other flying apparatus, is prohibited over the venue (pools, athlete/coach areas, spectator areas and open ceiling locker rooms) any time athletes, coaches, officials and/or spectators are present without written USAS approval. 																																																			

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Use of audio or visual recording devices, including cell phones, is not permitted in changing areas, rest rooms or locker rooms. In addition, photography behind the blocks is <u>not permitted</u>. ● PHOTOGRAPHY: As per NES policy, professional photographers contracted by M.F. Swimming, LLC, or press photographers who have been approved in advance by the Meet Director, are allowed on deck. Use of audio or visual recording devices, including a cell phone, is not permitted behind the starting blocks, including in any spectator area behind the starting blocks, nor in any other marked NO CAMERA ZONE, including on deck. All NO CAMERA ZONES will be clearly designated. Email the Meet Director with questions and requests. ● VIDEO STREAMING: All video streaming must be approved in advance by the Meet Director. Any such video stream must conform to all current SafeSport policies defined by USAS, NES, and the Meet Host. No video stream may originate from behind the starting blocks or from any other area marked as a NO CAMERA ZONE. ● Deck Changing is PROHIBITED. ● An athlete suspected of sustaining a concussion or exhibiting signs of a concussion, will immediately be removed from competition and shall not return to competition that day. The athlete may return to competition on a subsequent day, but only with a release authorization signed by a licensed healthcare provider. ● According to NES Best Practices, all athletes should shower before entering the pool. ● In accordance with NES Policy, only those coaches who have current, valid USAS credentials will be permitted to act in a coaching capacity at this meet. Coaches with expired or non-current credentials will be required to leave the deck area.
<p>SAFETY</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● No shaving is permitted at the competition site. ● No glass containers are permitted within the facility. ● Swimmers must be under the supervision of a coach. If a swimmer arrives at the meet without a coach, the swimmer should notify the Meet Referee before he/she warms up, and the Meet Referee will assign the swimmer to a registered coach for warm-ups. ● Lifeguards will handle all emergencies. <p>WARM UP SAFETY:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Diving will be prohibited during warm-ups except in specifically announced one-way sprint lanes. There will be no diving in the warm-up and warm-down areas at any time. ● For all warm-up sessions, swimmers must utilize a “sit-and-slide”/“three-point” entry to enter the pool for warm-ups, by first sitting on the deck, and then sliding, feet-first, into the pool. ● In extraordinary cases, due to bulkheads and other pool designs, it may be determined that it is unsafe or impossible for swimmers to perform the required sit and slide entry. In such extremely rare cases, the sit and slide rule may be modified. Exceptions to the sit and slide rule shall only be made when performing the sit and slide entry poses risk of injury to swimmers and/or risk damaging or ripping of swimsuits. An exception to the sit and slide rule shall only be made when the Safety Monitor, Meet Director, and Meet Referee have evaluated the risks and unanimously determined that the use of the sit and slide entry poses such great risk as to be unsafe. In these cases, the Safety Monitor, Meet Director, and Meet Referee must determine and agree upon an alternative safety plan to ensure swimmer safety.

<p>SAFE SPORT</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The USA Swimming SafeSport program is USAS’s comprehensive abuse prevention program dedicated to creating a healthy and positive environment free from abuse for all its members. Components of the program include, but are not limited to, providing education and training, enforcing policies (such as the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policy), rules and best practice guidelines, promoting healthy boundaries and mandatory reporting of violations. • The Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policy prohibits Adult Participants (as defined) from having one-on-one interactions with minor athletes which are not within an observable and interruptible distance from another adult participant. Adult Participants are required to abide by this policy in full during this meet. • Pursuant to USAS Rules and Regulations and federal law, it is every member’s responsibility to immediately (i.e., within 24 hours) report any incident of child abuse, including physical or sexual abuse, to law enforcement and the U.S. Center for SafeSport. Reporting must occur when an individual has firsthand knowledge of misconduct or where specific and credible information has been received from a victim or knowledgeable third party. A report to the U.S. Center for SafeSport may be made via telephone at 833-5US-SAFE (833-587-7233), or via online at www.uscenterforsafesport.org/report-a-concern. Various state laws may also require reporting to law enforcement or to a designated child protection agency. • For information on how to report other alleged violations, including without limitation the Code of Conduct found within the USAS Rules and Regulations as well as the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policy, please visit www.usaswimming.org/report. • All athletes age 18 and older must complete Athlete Protection Training in order to be a USA Swimming registered member in good standing. <i>Any athlete who turns 18 on or after February 13, 2026, who has not completed Athlete Protection Training by the first day of competition, will be prohibited from participating in the competition until such time as all membership requirements are completed.</i> Times achieved by an athlete who turns 18 on or after February 13, 2026, who competes in this USAS sanctioned event without completing this requirement, will NOT count for qualification or recognition. This includes participation as a member of a relay.
<p>FACILITY RULES</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • NO PARENTS ON DECK • NO GLASS ON DECK
<p>CHANGES TO MEET</p>	<p>Once a meet is sanctioned, changes can be made to the Meet Information before the meet only with the approval of the Co-Technical Chairs, Patrick Johnstone and Greg Gowern. Any change to the Meet Format after the meet begins will be at the discretion of the Meet Referee, and will be presented to the coaches at a coaches meeting.</p>
<p>WEATHER/FACILITY PROTOCOL</p>	<p>If weather or facility conditions make it impossible to follow the original timeline of events, the Meet Director and Meet Referee have a right to make changes to the meet sessions. The Meet Director will notify the teams of the changes with as much notice as possible. Cancellation of the meet, or a session, is the decision of the Meet Director, Meet Referee, and the Meet Jury.</p>
<p>MEET JURY</p>	<p>The Meet Jury will be made up of one official, one coach, and one athlete to be selected by the Meet Referee who will present issues and moderate the Meet Jury but not vote. When possible, the three members shall be from separate teams. The Meet Jury will decide all issues of eligibility, and anything not addressed in the Meet Announcement. The Meet Referee shall have authority as described in the current USA Swimming Rulebook.</p>
<p>DECK ACCESS</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Only current USA Swimming registered athletes, coaches, officials, and official meet staff are permitted on the pool deck. All non-athletes on the pool deck must produce proof of their valid USA Swimming registration when asked. Member Card shown on a mobile device is an acceptable proof of membership. Individuals without proof of a valid

	<p>membership in USA Swimming will be removed from the pool deck and will be fined by New England Swimming of \$100 to the coach, and \$200 to the coach's club.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Coach deck passes will be distributed to participating teams based on the number of meet entries: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ 1-3 swimmers in individual events or 1 relay only team: 1 deck pass. ○ 4-6 swimmers in individual events; 2 deck passes. ○ 7-9 swimmers in individual events; 3 deck passes. ○ 10-20 swimmers in individual events; 4 deck passes. ○ 21-30 swimmers in individual events; 5 deck passes. ○ 31-40 swimmers in individual events; 6 deck passes. ○ 41-50 swimmers in individual events; 7 deck passes. ○ 51 or more swimmers in individual events; 9 deck passes ○ Unattached swimmers with a team shall be included in the above schedule even if listed on separate entry blank. ○ Unattached swimmers not with a team: 1 deck pass • Additional deck passes can be purchased at the Meet Registration Desk for \$35.00, payable to the meet host team. Deck passes are non-transferable between teams • All coaches and officials must check-in at the verification table in the lobby each day before entering the pool deck.
OFFICIALS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Officials that know they will be attending the meet are highly encouraged to email the Meet Referee, Meghan McLaughlin and let her know your level of certification, team, and sessions you will be available. This is for pre-meet planning purposes only. All officials are welcome to work any number of sessions and walk-on officials are always welcome. The Officials' meetings will be at 45 minutes prior to the start of a session in the meet office. • All officials are encouraged to submit an Application to Officiate prior to the meet deadline of Tuesday, February 3. Any official submitting an Intent to Official form by the entry deadline will receive credit for the distribution of team work assignments. • For specific question concerning your availability of for further information please contact the Meet Referee directly.
TIMING ASSIGNMENTS	<p>Timing assignments will be assigned to teams based on the number of swimmers in each session and across the meet. Please be cooperative and punctual to the meeting and the start of the session. All timing assignments except Friday evening last for the full duration of the session. On Friday, lane specific timing assignments will last through the 100 IMs. Teams/parents will be responsible for timing their own swimmers in the 500 Frees on Friday. 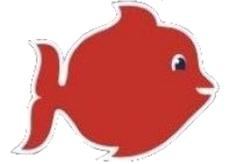

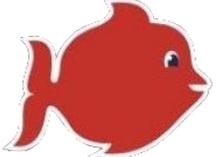
