The SUNY Cortland pool is configured as a 6 lane, 25-yard course. Water depth at start is 5.5 feet deep and at turn end is 3.5+ feet. Colorado electronic timing system will be used. The competition course has been certified in accordance with 104.2.2C (4).

Inclement Weather/Cancelation: We will make every effort to inform each team if there is a change in the meet schedule due to inclement weather.

ELIGIBILITY

ATHLETE

YMCA Membership: An athlete must be a YMCA member in good standing who holds an annual, full privilege membership at the YMCA.

<u>Amateur Status</u>: An athlete may not have represented a college, university or other post-high school institution in any competition and may not have accepted pay or compensation for competing as a swimmer.

<u>Unattached Athletes</u>: There is no unattached status in YMCA Swimming.

Age: Age is determined as of your age on 12-1-23.

YMCA Meet Participation: Be a current full privileged YMCA member for the team you are representing.



Athletes with a Disability: Swimmers with a disability are welcome to enter this meet. The coach or team entry person must alert the meet director and the meet referee as to the need for any special accommodations or seeding arrangements at the time the entry is submitted. If modifications to USA Swimming rules are necessary, then the coach or athlete must notify the meet referee of any disability prior to competition.

COACH

Required Certifications: Coaches must hold current certifications in the following courses in order to receive a deck credential: Professional Rescuer CPR, First Aid, Safety Training for Swim Coaches (a Lifeguard certification may be used if accompanied by completion of the Safety Training for Swim Coaches online content) and Principles of YMCA Competitive Swimming and Diving. A list of the acceptable certifications can be found in the Swimming Addendum to the Rules That Govern Competitive Sport.

<u>Coach Registration:</u> Each coach must have completed the annual YMCA online team and coach registration process. Coaches who are not registered and approved will not be permitted on deck.

<u>Teams without A Coach at the Meet:</u> All athletes and teams must have at least one certified and credentialed YMCA coach designated as being responsible for their supervision during competition. When a YMCA team will not have a coach present, that YMCA may authorize an eligible coach from another YMCA attending the meet to be responsible for their athletes at the meet. The Meet Director and Meet Referee must be notified of this situation.

TEAM

<u>Team Registration</u>: Each team must have completed the annual YMCA online team registration and paid the annual registration fee.

<u>Insurance:</u> Each team that participates in the meet must have a current and correct Certificate of Liability Insurance, in effect through the last day of the meet.



ENTRY INFORMATION

ENTRY LIMITS: 1. There are no restrictions on the number of entries per team in individual events.

- 2. The host reserves the right to limit the number of heats in certain events as well as close entries at any time.
- 3. There is no limitation to the number of mixed relays a team may enter in a relay event.
- 4. Swimmers may swim up to 4 individual events and 1 relay.

USA-S IDs: Only USA-S registered athletes should have an ID number in the Meet Entry File.

\$20.00 per relay event (\$5.00 per swimmer)

\$5.00 deck fee (one-time fee per swimmer)

COACHES MEETING/SCRATCH MEETING:

Coaches meeting will be announced prior to each session. Please provide courtesy scratches to the meet manager.

OFFICIALS AND TIMERS MEETING: Officials and timers meeting will be announced at the meet prior to each session.

PROCEDURES AND OPERATIONS

RULES:

The meet will run under YMCA Rules that Govern Competitive Sports, Addendum to the YMCA Rules that Govern Competitive Sports, CNY Swim League, USA-S Technical Rules.

MEET FORMAT:

The meet will be swum using a Timed finals format. Swimmer's age will be determined as of December 1, 2023. ALL RELAYS WILL BE MIXED. (2 GIRLS AND 2 BOYS).

EVENT SEEDING: Events will be seeded Slowest to Fastest. The Meet Referee/Administrative Official reserve the right to combine heats.

SCRATCH PROCEDURES: An athlete is considered entered into an event unless he/she scratches from that event. If an athlete does not scratch from an event and does not swim the event, that event still counts toward the athlete's total number of events for the meet.

DECLARED FALSE START: An athlete may also withdraw from a heat or swim-off by electing to take a declared false start. Such declaration must be made known to the Deck Referee before the heat or swim off is announced. A declared false start counts as an event swum for the athlete and will be counted in the maximum number of events allowed for each athlete.

WARM-UP SAFETY PROCEDURES: Teams will be assigned lanes for warm-ups. During designated warm up sessions, athletes may only enter the competition pools feet first. The exception is during specific warm up periods when sprint lanes are designated for practicing racing starts.

Bull Pen: 10 & under swimmers and 11 & up will be bull penned at the diving well area



Cortland YMCA Stingers 1st Annual Snowman Classic

JANUARY 14, 2024

STARTS:

'Fly-over' starts will be used at this meet. All swimmers (except for Backstroke starts) should remain in the water at the completion of their race until the next heat has begun. Protests against the judgment decisions of starters, stroke, turn, place and relay take-off judges can only be considered by the Referee and the Referee's decisions will be final USA-S Rule 102.23).

CONDUCT AND RESTRICTIONS:

The Meet Referee reserves the right to dismiss any swimmer, coach and/or spectator from the competition due to inappropriate conduct

- Deck access is limited to only registered and approved coaches, swimmers, and working officials.
- Deck Changes are prohibited.
- No Glass containers are allowed in the facility.
- The use of audio or visual recording devices, including a cell phone, is not permitted in changing areas, rest rooms or locker rooms.
- Massage tables are not permitted.
- Individuals are responsible for the security of their personal belongings and are encouraged not to bring valuables to the meet venue and not to leave items unattended.
- Swimmers are not permitted in the spectator stands
- Shaving is not permit in any areas of the facility.
- Folding chairs on the pool deck are for timers only.

1,2,3 High Points

Relays: $1^{st} - 12^{th}$ Place (place awards only no points)

SPECTATORS

ADMISSION FEES & PROGRAMS:

Admission Fee: None

Programs will be available for purchase at the door Parking at SUNY Cortland is free in designated areas.

Heat Sheets/Programs: Available for sale

CONCESSION STAND: Concessions provided by SUNY Cortland will be on site.



T-Shirts: Apparel will be available for purchase online. Website coming.

Suit & Equipment Sales: None on site

Athletic Apparel: Swimmers must wear shirts and footwear outside the pool deck.

HANDICAP SEATING: Handicap seating is available at the venue on deck.

CONDUCT AND RESTRICTIONS:

- No Flash Photography at the start of competition races.
- Parents are responsible for the conduct of their children. Children are not allowed to roam the facility unattended.
- The use of audio or visual recording devices, including a cell phone, is not permitted in changing areas, rest rooms or locker rooms.
- Deck access is restricted to athletes, coaches, officials and meet volunteers.
 All non-athlete members must have proof of registration or a credential while on deck and present them upon meet management request
- Spectators are not permitted on deck. Permission is granted via Meet Director for handicap accessibility.
- No smoking, drugs, or alcohol are permitted in the swimming complex.

LIABILITY, SAFETY AND EMERGENCY PROCEDURES

INSURANCE: Each Association participating in this meet must have insurance coverage for representative(s) including leadership and participants who will be in attendance for the period of travel from their Association to the meet, during the entire period of the meet and return to their Association. Appendix 3 must be signed by each association participating in the meet.

LIABILITY LIMITS:

- In granting of the USA-S/Niagara LSC approval, it is understood and agreed that USA Swimming and Niagara LSC shall be free and held harmless from any liabilities or claims for damages arising by reason of injuries to anyone during the conduct of the meet.
- In granting the YMCA Sanctioning, it is understood and agreed that YMCA of the USA shall be free and held harmless from any liabilities or claims for damages arising by reason of injuries to anyone during the conduct of the meet.

EMERGENCIES: the facility personnel will handle all emergencies at the meet. These individuals will provide CPR and first aid as needed and will ensure that



individuals with serious injuries are transported immediately to the nearest hospital for further treatment. Defibrillators will be on site.

Any coach, athlete or official who recognizes an emergency situation should immediately inform the facility's personnel and then make sure the vicinity of the emergency is clear for the emergency personnel to do their job.

UNACCOMPANIED ATHLETE: Each athlete must have a certified coach responsible for him/her while on the pool deck. The coach of the athlete must authorize in writing a coach from another team to represent their team and be responsible for the swimmer(s).

CONCUSSION AWARENESS: This meet will follow the YMCA of USA Concussion procedure. Anyone who observes or has knowledge of a potential head injury should immediately notify lifeguards and/or hired medical personnel. Once the injury report is completed, the lifeguard and/or hired medical personnel will notify the Event Staff, the athlete's coaching staff, and the Meet Director.

If a head injury occurs, the action plan below will be followed:

- 1. Athlete is removed immediately from participation by the Meet Director
- 2. Athlete must be evaluated by a licensed health care professional experienced in identifying and treating concussions. In addition, the athlete must be in compliance with the laws that are in effect within the jurisdiction where the meet is held.
- 3. The coaching staff will inform the athlete's parents or guardians about the possible concussion and give or send them the fact sheet on concussion.
- 4. The athlete will not be allowed back to warm-up or compete until a health care professional, experienced in evaluating concussions determines that the athlete is symptom-free and is OK to return to participation.

LIGHTNING POLICY: The National Lightning Safety Institute, National Athletic Trainers Association, American College of Emergency Physicians, USA Swimming, and YMCA of the USA all recommend or require closing an indoor pool during an electrical storm. This policy will be followed at the meet.

EVACUATION PROCEDURE: If evacuation is deemed necessary, all persons shall evacuate the venue via the procedures posted on site at the facility and announced at the venue.
