SWIMMERS OF THE MEET

Bronze

- **Spencer Aurnou-Rhees** – Even though he is only eight, Spencer placed 10th in the state of Ohio in the 10 & under 200 free, bettering his time by three seconds. He also anchored the state champion 10 & under 200 medley relay with another lifetime best. This boy rocked the Bowling Green pool!

Silver

- **Christian Hosler** – Christian had a great meet with numerous best times and individual Top 16 finishes. He swam on state championship relays as well!
- **Leah Stamm** – Like Christian, Leah had a great meet and swam to numerous best times and individual Top 16 finishes. Leah also swam on state championship relays.

Gold

- **Jordan Aurnou-Rhees** – Jordan is receiving this recognition for obvious reasons: she won all seven of her individual events; she set a meet record in the 50 fly; she helped her relay team win a state championship; and she was named the outstanding female swimmer of the Junior Olympics.

Platinum

- **Pearson Spychalski** – Pearson won state championships in the 100 fly and 100 IM. He broke a three-year-old state record in the 100 IM, won the 11-12 boy's High Point trophy, broke nine Ohio State Swim Club team records and helped his relay teammates win three silver medals.

Senior

- **Tyler Long** – Lifetime best in the 200 fly and 100 free, and helped the 13-14 boys 200 and 400 medley relays place first overall.
- **Abbey Newman** – Lifetime best in the 100 fly, constant support of the OSSC, and never giving up!

National Team

- **Jack Saczawa** – Jack put on a dominant performance this weekend in the backstroke events, winning the 100 & 200 backstroke events by several seconds each. Both of Jack's backstroke times rank top 20 in America in his age group. Jack placed in the top eight in all of his individual and relay events, including first-place finishes in the 200 and 400 medley relays. Great job, Jack!
