SWIMMERS OF THE MEET

Senior

He was able to drop a total of 24 seconds over his events where he went best times in the 50, 100, 200 free, 100 back, 50 and 100 fly, where he achieved his Sectional cut! Great job, Max!

From the start of the season he has been actively trying out new techniques and working on refining his stroke, and his results showed.
