Local athletes break state records, another pool record falls on day three of KMSC Pro-Am Classic Swim Meet

Two amateur swimmers from the King Marlin Swim Club broke state records, a pool record fell and eight male and female swimmers battled for the 50-yard Free Champion title on day three of the KMSC Pro-Am Classic.

The four-day meet ends Sunday at the Oklahoma City Community College Olympic Festival Pool. Admission is free.

Sixteen-year-old **Rylee Linhardt**, a KMSC swimmer from Edmond, cut almost four seconds from her best time to break the state record in the 15-16 Women's 500-yard freestyle. She swam the event in 4:50.76, breaking Whitney Lynn's record of 4:52.91 set in 2000. She took fourth place overall.

Winning the race was professional **Stephanie Peacock** of Swim Florida with a time of 4:42.67. Amateur **Haley Yelle,** Mansfield Aquatic Club (Texas), finished second with a time of 4:48.13. **Danielle Kudis**, Schroeder YMCA Swim Team (Wis.), had the third-place finish with a time of 4:50.76.

Earlier in the day, 14-year-old KMSC athlete **Kellie Fischer**, Edmond, swam a personal best time of 57.59 in the preliminaries of the women's 100-yard back to topple the 13-14 Girls state record of 57.84 set 10 years ago by Samantha Woodward. In finals, Fischer finished fifth with a time of 57.64.

Amateur Courtney Caldwell, Ad Astra Area Aquatics (Kan.), took first in the 100 back, swimming a 54.59, while Elizabeth Jordana, Dads Club Swim Team (Texas), came in second with a time of 56.94. Carla Gonzales, Fort Worth Area Swim Team (Texas) finished third with a time of 57.03.

In the women's 200-yard individual medley, professional **Katie Meili**, SwimMac (Carolina), swam a personal best to break her pool record of 1:56.47 set last year. Professional **Karlee Bispo**, Palo Alto Stanford Aquatics (Calif.), finished second with a time of 1:56.61, while **Bailee Nunn**, Springfield Aquatics (Mo.), took third overall and the first amateur finish with a time of 2:00.93.

In the featured race of the night, the 50-yard Freestyle Shootout, **Bispo** swam a 22.14 to win the women's title, and professional **Jimmy Feigen** of New York Aquatic Club earned the men's title with a time of 19.15. They outraced seven other athletes who qualified in preliminaries in three rounds of one-on-one racing.

Earning her second win of the night, **Meili** swam a 2:09:71 in the women's 200-yard breaststroke, while **Gwen Worlton**, Schroeder YMCA Swim Team, was the first amateur finisher with a 2:16.65 to take second place. Finishing third was **Ashley Pales**, Lincoln Select Swimming (Neb.), with a time of 2:17.41.

Several races were tight, including the men's 500-yard freestyle where amateur **Grant Shoults**, Mission Viejo Nadadores (Calif.), just out touched professional **Michael Weiss**, Wisconsin Aquatics. Shoultz finished in 4:17.52 and Weiss in 4:17.55. **Nicholas Norman**, Mission Viejo Nadadores, swam a 4:20.64 for the third-place finish.

Also, in the men's 200-yard breaststroke professional **B.J. Johnson**, Palo Alto Stanford Aquatics, took first with a time of 1:54.10, narrowly defeating professional **Sean Mahoney**, Terrapins Swim Club (Calif.), who finished in 1:54.82. Earning the third-place finish was amateur **Julian Fletcher**, Trojan Swim Club (Calif.), with a time of 2:01.57.

Weiss cut almost six seconds to win the men's 200-yard individual medley with a time of 1:43.99. **Adam Mania** of Schroeder YMCA Swim took second overall and the first amateur finish, touching the wall in 1:45.75, while professional **Alexandru Coco** of Phoenix Swim Club (Ariz.) had a third-place finish with a time of 1:46.12.

In the men's 100-yard backstroke, professional **Eugene Godsoe**, Palo Alto Stanford Aquatics, swam a 45.25 to take first, while professional **Zach McGinnis**, New York Aquatics Club, hit the wall in 46.95 to take second. **Mania** swam a 49.17 for third place.

Ending the meet were the men's and women's 400-yard medley relays. In the women's division, **Mission Viejo Nadadores** swam a 3:44.70 to just out touch **Schroeder YMCA Swim Team**, which swam a 3:44.94. **Springfield Aquatics** (Mo.) took third place with a time of 3:49.96.

In the men's division, **Mission Viejo Nadadores** swam a 3:26.98 to take first. **Lobo Aquatic Club** (N.M.) finished in 3:28.48 to take second, while the **Arkansas Dolphins Swim Team** took third with a time of 3:29.20.

Tomorrow, the last day of the meet, features a full schedule with the mile, 200-yard backstroke (women's bounty event), 100-yard freestyle (men's bounty event), 200-yard butterfly, 100-yard individual medley and 200-yard freestyle relay.
